After Father blessed baskets of chalk, everyone was given the opportunity to do a craft to bless their homes and all those who enter, with a special inscription, 20 + C + M + B + 15, using the initials of the Three Kings. After a breakfast treat sponsored and served by the Knights of Columbus, the Families learned more about our new Life Center and the programs, including the rejuvenated Catholic Youth Organization, the first of its kind here in Florida. #### Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

# #ToKnow – Pope Francis' Message to the World: Peace is Worth Fighting For

This past week, I was immediately drawn back to September 11, 2001, remembering the fear I heard in my wife's voice when we finally connected while I was working in DC and the subway (Metro) that I had just taken to work that was now underneath the attacked Pentagon. The terror attacks in France are a continuation of the fear mongering that has pervaded our social consciousness since that fateful day. We cannot give into that fear, we cannot allow extremists (who are not following Islam, but their own twisted version of insanity) to change our faith's essential focus. We love and respect all life, in every way.

Peace is the only option for humanity. We have direct impact with our words and our actions. Our Holy Father this week took an opportunity to showcase how the world needs peace now, and that we have to fight for it with love, not weapons:

Today I wish to repeat a word quite dear to us: peace! It comes to us from the angelic hosts who proclaimed it on Christmas night (cf. Lk 2:14) as a precious gift of God, while at the same time as a personal and social responsibility which calls for our commitment and concern.

Every conflict and war is emblematic of the throwaway culture, since people's lives are deliberately crushed by those in power. Yet that culture is also fuelled by more subtle and insidious forms of rejection. ... Today I wish publicly to praise and thank those healthcare workers who, alongside

With these sentiments, I once more offer to each of you, to your families and your peoples, my prayerful good wishes that this new year of 2015 will be one of hope and peace. — Pope Francis 1/12/2015 (http://www.news.va/en/news/full-text-of-pope-francis-address-to-the-diplomati)

#### #ToKnow – Flu Protection for the Parish: Precious Blood Suspension and Appropriate Gestures for Sign of Peace

As part of our efforts to ensure a safe environment here at St. John (more on our fully active fingerprint station to enable collaboration between all the members of our Parish Family), we will be instituting several health safety measures as we enter the heart of Flu Season:

- The Precious Blood distribution will be suspended during Mass (Daily and Weekend Masses) until further notice. This will ensure no accidental transmission will occur due to the Sacrament.
- 2. The Sign of Peace will continue during our Masses and Services, but we would ask all parishioners to determine their own appropriate gestures for the Sign of Peace. Please respect the members of our Parish Family (and guests) with those gestures.

# A Divine Invitation

s we journey into Ordinary Time, we focus on the call of the first disciples. In today's gospel, John the Baptist points to Jesus as the Lamb of God. This revelation must have been intriguing to his disciples. Jesus asks these inquisitive men, "What are you looking for?" He knew they were searching for something in life — he sensed their intrigue and hunger. The disciples of the Baptist ask Jesus, "Where do you live?" In response Jesus invites them to "Come and see". Little did these men know how this invitation would change their lives. Filled with excitement, the disciples lead Jesus to Simon. Jesus recognizes Simon's strength and tells him that he will be called Peter — the rock! From this moment on


- 1. What are you looking for in life?

- 7. Would you consider yourself an active or passive disciple?
- 8. How could you make your discipleship more intentional?

Jesus leads the disciples deeper into the heart of God's plan. It is interesting to note in the Gospel of John that the first thing Jesus says to his disciples is, "What are you looking for?" That is God's question to us today. The first disciples response is, "Where do you live?" That is is the ultimate question a discerning Christian must ask to discover God's presence in the midst of the world.

The other readings in today's liturgy also speak of the calling given to people through time. We hear of Samuel's call in the first reading and are reminded in Paul's letter to the Corinthians that we are called to be members of the body of Christ. God continues to issue the call to all of us. He calls us to know Him and respond to His call of love. If we are honest with ourselves, each of us hunger for God in our lives. This hunger leads us to look beyond the surface and search for meaning. The important questions to ask ourselves are, "What does God want from me? Where is God leading me?" The leaders of our Church constantly remind their people that faith is not an entirely personal thing. Our Catholic beliefs call for partnership in faith. We exist as a community and are asked to discern God's will together and help build the kingdom of God. The mission of the Church is evangelization. Every member of the Church is challenged to make Jesus known in their own

reality. Our baptism calls us to share in the priestly, prophetic, and kingly nature of Christ.

In concrete, answering Christ's call means that we engage ourselves in priestly charity. We are asked to sacrifice our time and treasure in response to the needs around us. In order to be prophetic in modern times, we have to discern God's will and see where He is present. We are reminded that we are the People of God and that our destiny is the kingdom of God. Our call therefore, can be found in a world of hunger — where people suffer every day for lack of food and shelter. It is found in the midst of conflict and division. We discover God's call in our relationships and within the burning questions of faith. God is to be found in all people and in every situation. We are challenged to be Jesus' disciples in the way that we respond to the invitation to "Come and See."



#### Prayer

Lord, may we dare to ask you where You are to be found in our lives. Give us the courage to answer Your call with confidence. As we discern your presence, may we find you in all people and all things. When faced with challenges, help us to recognize these challenges as opportunities for grace and let us listen to your language of love and transformation. May we always hunger for your call and bring the message of the gospel to the waiting world. Amen.






