We have reached this first step with the overwhelming support from a section of our parish, and with all the rest of your help, we can invigorate both our campus and the community around us. Let's focus next on our Capital Endowment for the future of St. John, part of our Pinnacle Goal.

A Capital Endowment is not as tangible as what we have been describing recently here. It is easy to see the need to replace the church roof and the carpet in the Ballroom. However, one of the most important functions of our campaign is to set up our Parish Family for financial success for many years. Our Capital Endowment will ensure we have the funding to support our facilities and grounds into the future. Just as you may be used to for hospitals and universities, a Capital Endowment is a non-accessible, tax deductible investment fund that churches and other non-profit organizations use to support their operational needs: from fixing unforeseen plumbing problems to developing our Catholic Adult Organization events. By using the interest and investment income from this fund, we can ensure we have a solid and stable financial position. And just as important, the last thing we would want to do as stewards of our church is to complete our campaign and then need to ask again for more money for repairs that we did not anticipate years ago.

### Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

### Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

#ToKnow - Fiscal Year Begins New Processes and **Transparency Programs** for St. John Finances

Over the past several years, the financial team of St. John has worked hard on improving both our fiscal management

and our transparency. With a budgetary process that is only going into its third year, we have made tremendous progress in planning and executing appropriate and efficient stewardship for our Parish, balancing the mission of the church with our needs and operations. Last year, for the first time, St. John convened a Capital Planning sub-committee, made up of representatives from our Stewardship, Finance, and Building & Grounds Councils. A report will be provided to the Parish Family on our Capital Improvement Projects approved for this coming year, which will now be tracked separately from our operational budget.

Additionally, we have transformed our bookkeeping to be in line with the structure of St. John, with Pastoral, Liturgical, Operations, Religious Education, and Family Mission areas. Each area will be responsible for their budget and spending, ensuring focus and efficiency with the money you have entrusted us with. he Sacred Scriptures of today's mass are threaded together by the theme of God's election. Amos speaks of God's choosing him to prophesy to the people of Israel. St. Paul presents his theological treatise on our spiritual adoption as God's children. Jesus summons the twelve and instructs them on how they are to conduct themselves on their journey into God. Jesus imparts authority upon his apostles to preach repentance, drive out demons, to anoint and cure the sick. Their ministry takes them on a journey into the heart and mind of God. The first reading and gospel also remind us that there is a cost to discipleship. The message of the one who is set apart to proclaim the kingdom will not always be accepted. The prophets were killed for their message, so too were the disciples. They gave their very lives for the importance of the message of salvation. Jesus tells the twelve to take nothing for the journey and invites them to lead a life of simplicity.

Many have been and continue to be invited on this journey into God. Throughout human history countless men and women have answered God's call to follow in the footsteps of Christ and his apostles. Priests, religious, and lay people have generously given their lives in promoting the gospel in the developed and the developing world. Many have been imprisoned, tortured and even killed to bring the gospel alive in the midst of poverty and oppression. These people took nothing with them for the journey – just the grace of answering God's call to give selflessly and offer hope.

The Church is still in need of her prophets, healers, teachers, sanctifiers and preachers. All of us need to promote the vocation to the priesthood and religious life. We must teach our youth that there

is not only value to the material world but value to the spiritual world as well. The People of God must encourage its young to discern God's will and answer His call to shape the Church of tomorrow. There are great challenges associated with discipleship. We have to acknowledge that there are great blessings as well. When individuals answer the call to proclaim the good news to the poor, liberty to captives, freedom to the oppressed and sight to the blind, their lives become expressions of God's unending grace.

It is important to realize that all of us are also chosen as God's elect through the grace of our baptism. Each member of the Church is called to follow Christ in activities of everyday life. We are summoned to discern God's will and respond to his call to love all people unconditionally. We are invited to build the bridge to unending peace and to eliminate poverty through our legislation and sharing our wealth. As Christians, we are called to take nothing for the journey into faith – we are simply asked to rely on the wisdom of God and the gifts that He has given us.



### **Prayer**

We pray: Heavenly Father, we know that you have invited us to participate in your divine mission here on earth. Fear can often hinder us in responding to your call. Give us the courage to cast away our fears and fill us with the fire of your love. As we journey into faith, may all of us be aware of your constant presence. Let Your wisdom be the guide to everything we do and say. Amen.

### Wisdom of the Fathers

"There is no doubt that the effort to proclaim the Gospel to the people of today, who are buoyed up by hope but at the same time often oppressed by fear and distress, is a service rendered to the Christian community and also to the whole of humanity.

For this reason the duty of confirming the brethren – a duty which with the office of being the Successor of Peter we have received from the Lord, and which is for us a "daily preoccupation," a program of life and action, and a fundamental commitment of our Pontificate – seems to us all the more noble and necessary when it is a matter of encouraging our brethren in their mission as evangelizers, in order that, in this time of uncertainty and confusion, they may accomplish this task with ever increasing love, zeal and joy....(Paragraph 1)


...The Church is an evangelizer, but she begins by being evangelized herself. She is the community of believers, the

### A Note About Sacramental Preparation

The Diocese of Venice requires that students must attend a minimum of two consecutive years of Faith Formation to receive First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation. Students must be at least 7 years old by September 30, 2015, and in the 2nd grade to be eligible to receive the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Students are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the end of 10th grade. They must be at least 15 years old.

Because of the increased number of children preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion beyond 2nd grade, we have added preparation classes on Sunday mornings so that these children can enjoy to the fullest, their Faith Formation classes without being "pulled out" for instruction. We will have a special teacher for them on Sundays from 9:00 - 9:30 a.m. It is our hope that this format will allow children preparing for the sacraments to make the most of this special time. This additional class time is for children in YEAR 2 of their preparation only. YEAR 1 students need only attend Faith Formation classes with their grade level. Their catechist will be made aware that they are in Year 1 of their preparation for instruction purposes.

It is NOT necessary for you to serve every Sunday. Each individual who is part of our Parish Family has the opportunity to grow in their faith, in a spectrum of ways. All the more reason to collaborate as a unified ministry of many EMEs. YOU serve when and at a Mass convenient for you based on an advanced schedule; perhaps when your child serves as an Altar Server or Lector.

### • I feel uncomfortable standing in front of people.

The Holy Spirit works in mysterious ways. Without giving it a second thought, processing onto the Sanctuary is a very spiritual experience. "We have lifted our hearts to the Lord."

### • I feel unworthy to serve the Holy Eucharist.


