
## Survey Results: Youth Programs

### #ToServe – Pope Francis Asks All Catholics to “Go! Do Good Works!”

Our Holy Father wants to make sure we all take a vacation, and I know in the next few weeks, many of us will attempt to (some with more success than others, as I sit in Virginia, writing this message to you). However, vacations are not just to take a break, they are also to recharge our batteries to ensure we can be refreshed to engage even more deeply in our faithful mission. In fact, Pope Francis just this past weekend gave us some great marching orders before he himself went on vacation. He was speaking of the Good Samaritan, and Jesus’ reaction to the question posed about his parable:

*I must not categorize others to decide who is my neighbor and who is not. Depend on me or not to be next - the decision is mine - it depends on me to be or not to be the next person I meet and who needs help, even if alien or even hostile. And Jesus concludes: “Go ‘and you too do’ good’. Good lesson! And he says to each of us: “Go ‘and you too do’ good’ .... “Go and you too do so. Do good works, not just say words that go to the wind. I can think of that song: “Words, words, words.” No. Please, do. And by the good works that we do with love and joy to others, our faith germinates and bears fruit. Let us ask ourselves - each of us responds in his heart - let us ask ourselves: is our faith fruitful? Does our faith produce good works? Or it is rather sterile, and therefore more dead than alive? Do I do or simply step? Do I select people according to my own pleasure? These questions are good for us to discern and discern often, because in the end we will be judged on the works of mercy. The Lord will say to us: But you, you remember that time on the road from Jerusalem to Jericho? That man was half dead. Do you remember? That hungry child was me. Do you remember? The migrant who many wanted to drive out, it was me. Those grandparents alone, abandoned in nursing homes, it was me. Those sick in the hospital, that*

## Safe Environment Training Will Resume Next Month



Training sessions will resume in August and the schedule will be posted at that time.





# The Word & Life

## Mary's Guest Is Also Our Guest

The story of Martha and Mary is a well known dinner story of the gospels. Martha is so caught up in the details of hospitality that she forgets why she is having a dinner at all — that is to honor Jesus by offering a meal and hospitality. Mary's response to Jesus, on the other hand, is a different story. She chooses to leave Martha to attend to the details of food preparation in the kitchen while she sits and listens to what Jesus has to say. Mary's sitting at the feet of the master is indicative of the posture used by a disciple who sits at the master's feet to learn from him.

### Reflection Questions

1. Why does Martha get annoyed during this encounter?
2. What motivated Mary to sit at the feet of the master?
3. What is the main teaching of Jesus in the gospel today?
4. What do you think it means to be a disciple of Jesus?
5. List the main teachings of Christ that are evident in your life.
6. Do you respond to the Lord as a faithful student?
7. Name the times that you have been attentive to Christ's presence in your life?
8. Have there been times when you have not attended to the presence of Christ in your life? Why did you not respond?

Martha's motivation is rooted in goodness. Martha was so busy with the details of hospitality because Jesus was her special guest. Jesus' comment to Martha is intriguing, "Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." Jesus was simply saying that Mary chose to listen to his appealing discourse. After all, how many had the opportunity to sit at a meal and listen to God? Jesus was trying to draw Martha into his company so that she could be blessed by his presence as well.

Like Martha and Mary, all of us are blessed to have Jesus as the honored guest. Every time we celebrate the Mass we believe that the Lord sits with us for a sacred meal to nourish us and strengthen us. The appealing discourse from the master's mouth comes to us through the proclamation of the Word and the gift of the gospels. Jesus honored Martha and Mary 2000 years ago with his presence. Today, Jesus continues to honor us with his presence when we gather in his name and in the breaking of the bread. Like Mary, he asks us to be attentive as his Word is proclaimed to us. The Christ of faith expects us to be changed by our encounter with him. In order for this transformation to take place, we must first acknowledge his presence and then discern his will.

As Christians, our living space should also reflect the centrality of Jesus Christ. When we look around our homes we should find images of Christ giving witness to our belief in his presence. Many of us grew up with the image of the Sacred Heart or the crucifix in the living room or dining room. These portraits served to remind us of the love that Christ continues to have for us. Just as we proudly exhibit photographs of our loved ones and favorite

art, we should be ready to give evidence of what lies deep in our souls. More importantly, each one of us must bear the image of Christ through our love and example. As Mary was attentive to the presence of Christ in her life, we too must be attentive to the Christ who can be found in members of our families, society, and through the needs of the world.

# Adult Faith Formation & RCIA

**Have you thought about inviting a friend or family member  
...to consider becoming Catholic?  
...to receive a Sacrament they may have missed?**

Throughout the last year I have had the privilege of working with a number of adults at various points in their journey to a deeper and fuller relationship with Jesus and “full communion” with the Catholic Church.

Some were new to Christianity and had never been baptized. Others had been Catholic for years, but for some reason or another had never been Confirmed. Many had been baptized and raised in another Christian tradition but were now interested in becoming Catholic.

All received an invitation to explore becoming Catholic or being a better Catholic. Although some felt a call directly from God, most were invited by family members or friends.

Assisting women and men in a broad range of particular circumstances has been one of the most interesting and fulfilling aspects of my role as Adult Faith Formation coordinator. But even more important is your role to extend an invitation to your family members, friends, co-workers, or others to inquire about what it means to be Catholic.

The first step might be to take them to Mass. That is where we all hear the word of God and consider what it means in our daily life. But before you go, stop by the Parish Office and pick up the booklet, *A Guide to the Mass*. In it you will find the Mass responses and prayers, and also commentary about what is happening and why.

When you turn the booklet over there is an introduction to Catholicism which will guide you in answering some common questions.



Summer is a great time to begin a conversation; I’m

available to meet with you and/or your friend or family member who would like to discuss what might be involved. I can also facilitate a meeting with a member of the clergy if preferred.

The process to further explore Catholicism will begin in the fall with a series of meetings to consider various aspects of our faith. This is an informal opportunity for interested individuals to begin the journey that may or may not result taking the next step toward full membership in the Church.

For those who choose, the next step is to enter the more formal process which begins in early December and culminates with the appropriate Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) that are celebrated at the Easter Vigil in April.

Extend an invitation, pick up a booklet, or simply pick up the phone or send an email; the next step is yours.

The ushers and parish of Saint John the Evangelist honor and are very grateful for all the good work of John Smith. John is beginning to take it a little easier with his church activities. John was born in Brooklyn and soon after his family moved to Newburgh, NY. There he attended St. Patrick's Elementary and High School and took college courses at Marist College. Even while in school John began his support of the Church — first serving as altar boy and being appointed sacristan.

John married in 1951, also at St Patrick, and the Smiths adopted two children. He helped to start and taught for five years in the CCD program at St. Mary's in Newburgh. John joined IBM in 1952 and worked there for 38 years. He served as field engineer from 1962 to 1990 for big mainframes.

The Smiths came to Saint John the Evangelist in 1994. He joined the Knights of Columbus and became a Third Degree Knight. He successfully ran the Tootsie Roll drive. In 1999, John helped start the Men's Club at St. John and served as its fourth president. He spent five years working to support retired priests before turning the task over to the Bishop's Council. John became the head usher in 2011 — a post he is now letting others handle. He says one day he was late for the usher's meeting and when he showed up he was told that he was Head Usher. John has received a lot of comfort from the Church.
