

Annual Undy Sunday Weekends of August 9 and 16

n little more than three weeks Collier County public school students will return to school. The first day of school is Monday, August 17. With this in mind, Catholic Charities of Collier County is once again sponsoring its annual Undy Sunday the weekends of August 9 and August 16.

"August is 'back to school' month and school staff members and nurses continue to remind us of the surprising number of young students who lack decent, or sometimes any, underwear and socks. Therefore, we ask your assistance in bringing new and unused underwear and socks sizes 2 through 12 (small sizes preferred) to your church or synagogue, on (the weekends of) Sunday, August 9 and Sunday, August 16. Your generosity in providing this essential clothing will help the low income children get off to a good start with the new school year," John Fitzgerald, Catholic Charities Undy Sunday co-chair, said.

This is the 19th annual event. Since the initial Undy Sunday in 1997, the number of participating churches has more than doubled.

"Prior to Undy Sunday many of

our local teachers were dipping into their own pockets to buy undergarments for their students who couldn't afford their own," Fitzgerald explained. "The program started out slowly 19 years ago, but it has become a community effort. Now the children and families who receive the undergarments are happy and



the teachers are happy. It is a wonderful effort getting everyone together on this very worthwhile project."

Look for the Undy Sunday boxes in the narthex of the church on the weekends of August 8-9 and August 15-16. Catholic Charities volunteers will pick up from all churches, sort and package the undergarments and see that the items get to the schools for proper distribution — before Labor Day — to needy children of Naples and Immokalee, as well as the Children's Advocacy Center, the Shelter for Abused Women & Children, and Youth Haven, where the most need has been identified. Life Center Purpose: Engage Community and Enliven Faith

We are blessed as a Parish Family to have already achieved the core goal of our Capital Campaign: **Build Our Future, Serve Our Past** - to have pledged enough money to construct our new Life Center and take care of many of the urgent needs we have described over the past few weeks. We should not miss the main purpose of these efforts, however. Some individuals have asked how does this new facility called a Life Center fit into the Mission of St. John and the Catholic Church. Many of you will recognize a theme that Pope Francis and Fr. John have both asked our Catholic Community to focus on: **New Wine in New Wineskins**.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

#ToKnow, #ToKnow, #ToServe – State of the Parish: Financial Year-End Income Report

St. John has had a banner year when it comes to our mission, our support of the community, and our growth of programs. The only way we have been able to successfully execute the new efforts along with our normal whirlwind of functions and activities is due to the entire Parish Family's active involvement, including the continued generosity of all of you. In the interest of complete transparency and collaboration, I wanted to provide you with the details from the past year's financial operations. This week, we will focus on the income of St. John for our Offertory. Next week, we will discuss the next fiscal year budget and costs.



As this growth chart illustrates, this past year (St. John's fiscal year goes from July to June) was the best we have ever had in terms of overall financial growth. Even with the Capital Campaign, our Offertory Income grew 8% from last year, the highest percentage from the past several years of giving to our parish, which showcases the increased growth and vitality of St. John's Parish Family. Thank you all! Your giving allows for our parish to provide the best possible services, from our beautiful music during Mass, to the landscaping of our campus, to the salaries of our priests and staff.

I do want to be frank with you all. I do not expect this trend to continue for the next few years due to our Capital Campaign. It has been proven that when being asked to give for a new effort, the regular giving normally does decrease as families and individuals prioritize their own finances. I have asked the staff to decrease their overall budgeting and spending to ensure we continue to operate in the best possible way for you. We must be stewards of the treasure you impart on our parish.

Another interesting trend that we found while we were evaluating the past years' financials was the change in our weekly Offertory amounts. Years ago, we would see a major drop in the income coming in during the summer months. In Fiscal Year 2015 (this past year) however, the dip has been significantly less pronounced *(see chart to the right)*. This trend showcases several themes that are essential for planning the future of St. John:

1. Individuals and families in Naples are staying longer here or becoming

- 3. Programs and events should be developed that provide activity for the entire year



Leftover Gifts from a Bountiful God

oday's readings speak to us about the great generosity of God. The Prophet Elisha took the twenty barley loaves and managed to feed a hundred people

Prayer

We pray: Lord, may I always recognize your presence in those people who challenge me, especially in those that the world deems to be different or sometimes worthless. May I learn to embrace all people, languages, and ways of life as a sure sign of your generosity working in the world today. Amen. and there was still some left over. A miracle? Some critics may well argue that twenty large barley loaves would manage to feed such a number. In today's gospel, Jesus feeds the five thousand with merely five barley loaves and two fish. A miracle? One may wonder what the critics would have to say about this action performed at the hands of Jesus of Nazareth? No science could explain how a great multitude could be fed with five barley loaves and two fish. Moreover, the disciples filled twelve wicker baskets with the leftover fragments. At times we have to rely on faith to understand God's generosity in our lives and the scriptures that are explained to us. Jesus is teaching us that the Father is willing to give himself completely through the hands of his Son who comes to feed us, nourish us, strengthen us, and gift us. This is the essence of grace.

There was a need present in the multitude that gathered around Jesus. Many of them were reaching out for healing. Others were searching the wisdom that Jesus had to offer. In the midst of the search and the need for healing, the people become physically hungry. Jesus recognizes their human need. In performing the sign of feeding the five thousand, Jesus not only satisfies the hunger of the body, but also the hunger of the soul. The action of Christ that day pointed beyond itself – it pointed to the divine nature of his mission. When the people are fed, there is still more left over and Jesus requests that the gift that he gives should not go to waste. Jesus also tells us to make sure that we do not waste the gifts that have been given into our hands. Does Jesus feed us with the same bread? Yes, but Jesus gives us more than that – His body and blood. Does he gift us with his Word spoken 2000 years to the early disciples? Yes, but now he commissions us to take that Word, share that Word, incarnate that Word by the very nature of our own lives, our own decisions, and our very actions. He is telling us today - "I have given you God's dream in my gospel proclaimed and in my real presence on your very altar – now go and realize that dream for me." The reality is that Jesus is still present to his Church and is constantly feeding us with Word and Sacrament. This is what strengthens us in holiness. In return, he asks that we do not waste the gifts that are freely given to us. We are asked to follow his example of giving and use the gifts that are particular to us.

St. Paul urges today to live out the calling of our baptism with all humility and gentleness, with patience, striving to preserve the unity of the Church. We simply do this in recognizing that each person inside and outside of our churches have a place in God's heart – all have been gifted with His generosity. Jesus warns us to make sure the gift in us and others will never go to waste.

A Note About Sacramental Preparation

The Diocese of Venice requires that students must attend a minimum of two consecutive years of Faith Formation to receive First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation. Students must be at least 7 years old by September 30, 2015, and in the 2nd grade to be eligible to receive the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Students are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the end of 10th grade. They must be at least 15 years old.

Because of the increased number of children preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion beyond 2nd grade, we have added preparation classes on Sunday mornings so that these children can enjoy to the fullest, their Faith Formation classes without being "pulled out" for instruction. We will have a special teacher for them on Sundays from 9:00 -9:30 a.m. It is our hope that this format will allow children preparing for the sacraments to make the most of this special time. This additional class time is for children in YEAR 2 of their preparation only. YEAR 1 students need only attend Faith Formation classes with their grade level. Their catechist will be made aware that they are in Year 1 of their preparation for instruction purposes.
