#### Seeing the Future: Life Center Virtual Walkthrough for Everyone

Our Life Center has become more and more a reality every day as we march towards the ground breaking later this year. As a way to assist all of you in seeing this vision becoming a tangible structure, alive with activities and events for all ages, I wanted to provide you a special sneak peek. One of the Construction Management companies in the area that has asked for the privilege of supporting our development, Deangelis Diamond, along with their partner, 3D Creative Studio, has created the below 3D view of the Life Center. It may look like a flat picture of the building from above, but if you have a mobile device, you can download an app called *Inspir3d*. Please go to your "App Store" (Apple, Google, or whichever device you may have) and search for this application. Once you download it, open the app and point your camera at the picture of the building on this page. The building should spring to life, allowing you to look all the way around and zoom in. You can even remove the roof so you can see inside (there is an option in the menu for the roof).

#### Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

#### Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

# #ToKnow, #ToServe — Supporting All Programs at St. John

A few weeks ago, I had mentioned on the Capital Campaign page of the bulletin that 2016-2017 would be the year of "Flexibility and Patience". There are going to be some significant changes to our facilities and programs that will be starting this coming Fall, and so I want to ensure we are all prepared for this exciting time. Flexibility will be important. People may be used to certain meetings or events that have taken place in the same location for years that will now need to move to another room due to construction noise or programmatic changes. I am also asking for patience as we expand our services to all our Parish Family and the local community while ensuring the current programs are enhanced as well. That can mean some "growing pains", that I am sure all of us will experience at one point or another.

However, in order to deal with these changes, we are making significant changes to our church to make our environment easier to deal with and more engaging. From doubling our Front Desk staff to take on the new responsibilities to changing our supply company for cost-effective, commercial-grade materials like our new hand towel, soap, and toilet paper dispensers, St. John is taking the steps to make sure you are supported in your faithful life journey, no matter where you are on your path.

Here are few other ways we are changing our operations to assist you:

- Event Support: St. John staff will be onsite during events and activities to ensure their success. This requires coordination with all groups that meet here to identify their needs and requests. We request this coordination be accomplished well ahead of any event, so we can plan accordingly with both equipment (table layouts, A/V needs, etc.) as well as access and staffing.
- Emergency Line: We have a St. John Facilities
  Emergency Line that can be reached by calling the
  main phone number of the church and dialing "0".
  This line goes to a cell phone and is for facilities
  emergencies only, like a room setup needed at that
  moment or an overflowing toilet. This is not a line for
  Mass schedule requests or other details. Those types
  of questions will be referred back to our phone line.
- Food Service: Did you know that St. John now has a Food Service Manager? If your event or activity has a need for food and beverages, please contact me and we can determine if the Food Service Manager should become involved in your program. This does include access to our kitchen, which has been locked for safety reasons and is only available to our approved catering organizations.



# he Word &

### Our God...The Author of Life

s we enter once again into Ordinary Time of the Liturgical Calendar, we hear how ordinary people have been touched by an encounter of God through human history. The first reading and the gospel reading both speak about the devastating consequences facing a widow when she loses her son. Elijah was blessed by the hospitality of the poor widow of Zarephath. She offered the little she had to the visiting prophet even though she could hardly provide for herself and her son. She cries out in anguish when her son dies thinking that the presence of God has brought upon her suffering and death. The prophet Elijah calls out to the Lord to breathe life into that experience so that the widow and her son may live. God's initiative is to let it be so. In contrast, the widow of Nain was left to fend for herself because her only son falls prey to death. Jesus recognized the pain in this mother's heart and he is moved with pity. His request of her? "Do not weep!" In touching the coffin, in which lay the widow's son, Jesus touches death. He then commands the young man to arise. And so it happens – the young man arises and Jesus defeats death itself. Both experiences are reminders to us that God's initiative is to bring life into this world.

When we hear these Scriptures proclaimed we have to listen to what is being relayed to us. These are not just simple stories which are told as if one were following a fairy tale. No, on the contrary, these are concrete experiences of God that took place in human history. God's dwelling is indeed with the human race. Whenever, we encounter the Lord in our own individual histories, we are immersed into salvation history. These two experiences of the sons of two widows remind us that God has power over death. God does not want to see the widows suffer and so he raises to life those who will bring protection to their mother and who will provide. God is the author of life. He intends for us to receive the fullness of life. God does not want us to be prisoners of death, but companions of life. People who have lost children may well say, "Why didn't God save my child from death?" This is an honest question that has confounded the greatest minds in history. The question why the young die young will never be answered in this life. Today's first reading and gospel reading are not about these difficult questions. They remind us that God has power over death and that He wants to protect us. For people of faith death is an encounter in which we are changed and enter into a realm with the author of life. When we pass from death into new life, God breathes into us life eternal.

#### **Reflection Questions**

- 1. Why do you think it was important for Jesus to raise the widow's son?
- 2. What did this miracle reveal?
- 3. How have you been impacted by death?
- 4. Where have you found God's consolation in your experiences of death?
- 5. In what ways have you witnessed spiritual death in your own life?
- 6. How does the "culture of death" challenge you as a Christian?
- 7. How does Jesus have power over your life?
- 8. What attitudes do you need to die to in order to live the life God intended you to live?
- 9. What is promised to you at the end of your life?
- 10. How does this promise affect your choices today?

In our second reading from St. Paul to the Galatians, we are reminded that the gospel is not of human origin, but it is revealed to us through Jesus Christ. In the life of every Christian is a reminder that we are born spiritual, to be spiritual and to journey toward the life in the Spirit. When we take both the first reading and the gospel in a spiritual context we are reminded just as God breathes life into the widow's son, he also wants to breathe life into us here and now. All of us die to sin. We experience spiritual death every time we sin and fail to do what God is calling us to do. Spiritual death is the fruit of walls erected in our relationships when we fail to love and fail to forgive. We witness spiritual death when individuals listen to voices contrary to the voice of God. We allow spiritual death and its decay to take hold of society when we stand idly by and watch unjust laws and systems take away the dignity of life. Whenever we remain unchanged when we listen to the plight of the immigrant, the working poor, and those who are unjustly treated, we become spiritually dead. However, if we have the courage to lead the authentic Christian life and listen to the wisdom of Christ, it is then that the author of life breathes anew into our lives once again. Let us pray that we will have the grace and courage to live this life abundantly.



#### Prayer

Heavenly Father, you are the author of life. Breathe into us that which enables us to become fully alive in you. Whenever we lose those we love, let us be comforted by our faith which reminds us that death is not the end. Be attentive to our voice when life becomes difficult, whenever tempers are flared or relationships are flawed. Breathe new purpose into our lives so that our lives may radiate your life, your beauty, and your love. Amen.






#### Seven Young Adults from Saint John the Evangelist Receive Recognition at St. John Neumann Academic Awards Night

Student Recipient: John Zizzo




Criteria: Awarded to students who demonstrate excellent academic and personal accomplishments.


