

One of the most beautiful ceremonies at St. John is the crowning of our statues of the Baby Jesus and Mary, at the start of May, the month of Mary. Twenty-nine children, who had made their First Holy Communion just the day before, were proud to share their sacramental participation Sunday, May 3, with the rest of our Parish Family. Looking like angels in their blue sashes, the children assisted Fr. John and Deacon Wallace in crowning our statues and blessing them with incense, with Julia Boucher given the honor of crowning Mary, and Carter Beebe crowning the Baby Jesus. A beautiful ending to their first weekend participating in the community of St. John, the entire congregation celebrated their achievement with cupcakes after Mass.



SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

Getting#ToKnow the Parish Staff – Director of Religious Education Natalie Campbell

It seems like only yesterday that I was using this forum to introduce (and re-introduce) Natalie Campbell to the Parish Family. Natalie had the role as Fr. John’s Secretary for several years. However, when Margie Lynch needed to retire in the middle of the Faith Formation year, we called on Natalie to assist us in getting through the year. She not only was able to support the scheduling and communication of the Faith Formation program for our over 300 students, she was able to restructure the program to include engaging events like the post-Communion Family Dinner. It became clear that Natalie was what I call a “Type A” individual for the church. She is warm and caring, able to plan and direct, but flexible and pastoral in all aspects of her efforts.



Did you know that St. John is one of only a few Faith Formation programs (used to be called CCD, or catechism classes) in the area that still provides a weekly education in our faith? Many other churches have moved towards monthly instruction. We believe the #ToKnow part of our faith is crucial to understanding and living as Catholics in the world, with service to and active participation in our church and our community. That requires a consistent learning environment. Natalie is already hitting the ground running and taking steps to enhance our educational programs for children and adults alike. Please join me in congratulating Natalie in her new role and thanking her for taking on such a huge responsibility for the future of our Parish Family.

#ToKnow – New Security System for the Future of St. John

One question we received frequently when educating our Parish Family about the Capital Campaign was “how will you secure this new building?” We had been researching and planning for how to make a building secure but open, accessible, but controlled. The answer came from some of my work with new facilities in Washington, DC. Instead of carrying around a pocket-full of keychains to open every single door, each of which may require a


different set of access, we used electronic door access systems. You may have something similar at your condo, or your gym. These fobs are about the size of a small key. They allow us to secure each and every door with specific access to a group, or an individual, at any time, and every day of the week, ensuring the right people have access to the right places when they need it.

Luckily, we built the price of this new system into our Capital Campaign, and not just for the new building. As part of our goals to renovate the other facilities, we will install this security system as well. In fact, if you come to the Parish Offices, you will see the first test case for the access to the priest’s conference room and offices (we call it the Enclave). This will let our Front Desk Volunteers get coffee any time they are working, but only staff members will be able to gain access after the office closes.

In the future, every member of our Parish Family (if they want) can pick up their very own fob. Parishioners will be able to access the Life Center, the Adoration Chapel, and all the rest of the facilities without having to fumble with keys or try to remember a pass code. We may not be at the Star Trek “whoosh” doors quite yet, but we are getting closer.

We have never had such a positive and immediate response for both the children who will be attending our summer camp on June 8 – 12 as well as our volunteer community. A Broken Promise or A Dream Fulfilled?

The event of the Ascension of the Lord must have been filled with tremendous emotions. The early disciples had witnessed the risen Lord Jesus with their very eyes. Even though many had failed to stand by him at the cross, his risen presence among them restored what had been broken. These disciples must have

been overwhelmed with joy at seeing Jesus in his risen state. It becomes very close from the post resurrection experiences that Jesus is fulfilling the prophecy of the scriptures. After his public ministry is transformed through his death and resurrection, Jesus commissions his followers to carry on the redemptive and salvific work that had begun. In today's gospel the disciples are told to go into the whole world, proclaim the gospel, and to bring others to salvation through baptism.

When Jesus commissions the disciples with this ongoing mission, he is taken up into heaven. One could wonder how the disciples must have felt. They had seen with their very eyes the promise of God had been realized. However, did this mean that this promise disappeared when Jesus was taken away once again? Their grief must have been significant. As we continue on the story we realize that the dream of God to bring humanity to salvation continues through the work of the early disciples. The preaching of the gospel continued, accompanied by signs and miracles. Even though Jesus was taken away bodily, he remained with the disciples spiritually to continue the work he had begun.

Reflection Questions

1. How does the Ascension of Jesus offer you hope?
2. What did Jesus commission his disciples to do?
3. Do you accept the commission to take the gospel into the world?
4. What are some of the challenges you encounter in trying to proclaim the gospel message?
5. How does the gospel message enlighten your mind?
6. In what ways do you allow the message of Jesus to shape your consciousness politically and socially?
7. How does the wisdom of Jesus Christ transform your relationships?
8. Where do you encounter Christ in your life?
9. Do you spend enough time in prayer discerning God's will for you?

The Ascension of the Lord is very significant for the Church today. The coming of Christ did not mark an end to the world but a beginning of goodness. Jesus continues to commission us to preach the gospel and make evident his presence in the world today. Jesus is now seated at the right hand of the Father waiting for us when we reach our journey's end. Do we live in this expectation? To believe in Jesus Christ and the good news he proclaimed is not just a cognitive process, it is a way of life. The ministry of Jesus taught the world to embrace the reality of unconditional love. Jesus' teaching and example shows how we can redeem our lives by living in right relationship with ourselves, others, and God. It is the choices that we make today that bring us to the promise of tomorrow. Christ shows us how God's dream for humanity is to live holy and sinless lives. Holiness brings us to the threshold of eternal life and to where Christ is seated. The holiness to which we are called is not to be confused with pious or religious practices. Such practices should be symptomatic of the lives that we lead. Holiness comes from loving the Lord our God with our minds, hearts, soul, and strength, and loving our neighbors with the selfless love that Christ engaged himself in. It is such love and commitment that inherits for us eternal life. Jesus continues to be with us on our journey of faith and in our experience of Church. Jesus' presence is made known in our tangible acts of kindness and charity. Jesus is present when we gather in his name and act of our love. Jesus is our spiritual companion on life's journey!

Wisdom of the Fathers

“Today our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven; let our hearts ascend with him... For just as he remained with us even after his ascension, so we too are already in heaven with him, even though what is promised us has not yet been fulfilled in our bodies...”

Why do we on earth not strive to find rest with him in heaven even now, through the faith, hope and love that unite us to him? While in heaven he is also with us; and we while on earth are with him. He is here with us by his divinity, his power and his love. We cannot be in heaven, as he is on earth, by divinity, but in him, we can be there by love.

He did not leave heaven when he came down to us; nor did he withdraw from us when he went up again into

heaven. The fact that he was in heaven, even while he was on earth, is borne out by his own statement: *No one has ever ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man, who is in heaven.*



Out of compassion for us he descended from heaven, and although he ascended alone, we also ascend, because we are in him by grace. Thus, no one but Christ descended and no one but Christ ascended; not because there is no distinction between the head and the body, but because the body as a unity cannot be separated from the head.”

A Note About Sacramental Preparation

The Diocese of Venice requires that students must attend a minimum of two consecutive years of Faith Formation to receive First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation. Students must be at least 7 years old by September 30, 2015, and in the 2nd grade to be eligible to receive the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Students are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the end of 10th grade. They must be at least 15 years old.

Because of the increased number of children preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion beyond 2nd grade, we have added preparation classes on Sunday mornings so that these children can enjoy to the fullest, their Faith Formation classes without being "pulled out" for instruction. We will have a special teacher for them on Sundays from 9:00 - 9:30 a.m. It is our hope that this format will allow children preparing for the sacraments to make the most of this special time. This additional class time is for children in YEAR 2 of their preparation only. YEAR 1 students need only attend Faith Formation classes with their grade level. Their catechist will be made aware that they are in Year 1 of their preparation for instruction purposes.
