2016-2017: The Year of Flexibility and Patience

There is already so much excitement brewing with our Parish Family and in the larger Naples area about the activities and events we are planning at St. John. With over 700 individual responses to our survey (http://tinyurl.com/hbmlx9j), we are clearly seeing the need for persistent programs to engage our fellowship and our faith. The challenge we now face is to begin these efforts within the confines of our existing campus, ensuring that past, present, and future come together.

Did you know we already have over 100 youth pre-registered for Faith Formation for next year? This is an unheard of number for St. John at this point in the year. If that is any indication of the growth of our Parish Family, we will have a significant increase in the activity on our campus every single day. As we increase the overall usage of the buildings we have now, and develop systems to handle all the various activities, I would ask that everyone understand that this coming year will be one of flexibility and patience. Meetings you may have had in a certain room for five or 10 years will need to move to another location on campus. Events that have not been supportive of the Parish Family may be modified or replaced for renewed activities. Priorities that have been illustrated by the survey will begin. We have over 4,800 activities to accomplish along with these new programs. We are such a vibrant community, so this is a good problem to have, but it can be difficult for some individuals to accept change. That is why patience will be needed from everyone for the next year.

Additionally, with the construction of the new Life Center beginning in the fall and winter, we will have further physical constraints on the campus. The back lot and field will become the staging ground for the increased space and capability of Saint John the Evangelist. From parking restraints to limitations on where we can hold activities, we must all work together to Build Our Future, Serve Our Past. Flexibility and patience (and prayer) are the keys to getting us through these challenging moments together and to a point of achieving Fr. John's mission to build a constantly engaging St. John for our Parish Family and the community.

While the money has been pledged in our Build Our Future, Serve Our Past capital campaign to accomplish the facility and some of our other urgent needs, we still need our entire Parish Family to give in order to reach our additional goals, including the detailed execution of the above programs. SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.



One of the saddest moments I have had in my current position here at St. John was the announcement that Ellie Roberts, our Cantor and Choir Director, was planning on a transition to North Carolina, ending her over decade-long support to our Parish Family. Most of you have experienced her beautiful voice during Mass, uplifting our spirits during these moments of encounter. The choir was heartbroken as well. The Holy Spirit has been working through all of us, however. I am so pleased to announce that Ellie has instead decided to make her permanent home here in Naples. She was inspired by our decision to develop a persistent music program at St. John, with lessons and concerts, and determined that creating this new artistic environment is exactly the challenge she has been looking for all her life.

Ellie has a been a part of the Saint John the Evangelist Music team for 15 years. She has a professional music career in Opera and Classical performance. She performed for the Pamiro Opera company in Green Bay, WI, the Island Opera Theater in Key West and Opera Naples in Naples, FL. Ellie was a feature soloist and chorister with the Bach Ensemble in Naples and



Ellie has also been an administrator in the nonprofit field in Naples for the past 10 years, working in Child Welfare, Mentorship and Programs for adults with Developmental Disabilities.

Ellie's expanded role as Artistic Director adds several responsibilities beyond her current Choir Director position. Ellie will oversee the development of our new Music Department, incorporating both the instructional (choirs,

individual and group lessons) and the appreciation (concert series, musical and theatrical events, open mic nights, etc.) for our Parish Family and the local community. Additionally, she will be responsible for all our fine arts programs, ranging from painting classes to theatrical programs. There are so many opportunities to assist people who have thought about learning an instrument or singing but think they are "too old" or don't have the money to do so. She will help make St. John a focal point of arts and music for Southwest Florida, where we can assist in making music approachable and economical for all ages and all walks of life.

I am joyous and grateful to be able to bring my expertise in Music, Program Development and administration to this endeavor. This is fulfillment of a long time dream to begin a school for the arts to students of all ages while enhancing our parish family and bringing many beautiful and uplifting events to our church in the future. — Ellie



Jamaica Outreach Program

Making a Difference in Many Lives

Editor's Note: This article was written by Michele LaBasi, Registered Dental Hygienist, Practice Administrator, Expanded Functions Dental Auxiliary, who is a volunteer missionary who serves the JOP dental clinic in Jamaica. The article has appeared on Linkedin.

My first international humanitarian outreach was October 2014. Since then, I traveled three more times to care for those who live in the slums of Kingston, Jamaica and provided oral health services and education. I connected with an organization called Jamaica Outreach Program (*jamaicaoutreach.org*), founded in 1997 and based out of Naples, FL. The program runs medical, dental and optical clinics as well as a food bank utilizing volunteers to provide care for the poor and underserved in the community.

During the first trip, I worked exclusively in the dental clinic by helping to triage children and adults as they arrived, giving local anesthesia to those who needed restorations or extractions, performing first time prophylaxes or debridements, and educating at every opportunity, mostly one on one.

There was a greater need — on a larger scale, to efficiently reach more people for education and prevention of the oral diseases we observed. I created an oral health education presentation and a fluoride varnish program that could be used with the children in the nearby school. In January 2015, I returned to Jamaica. Along with other members of the dental team, we screened for decay, applied fluoride varnish and educated approximately 475 elementary school children. Those who were in pain or had visual asymptomatic abscesses were immediately sent to the clinic for treatment.

There were still hundreds of students that needed to go through the program. I returned again in May 2015 to serve in the dental clinic and see more students in the school. This trip also

included the addition of seeing abandoned and disabled children in a nearby facility called, The Mustard Seed (*mustardseed. com*). I screened and applied fluoride varnish to 20 children there. Two of them needed immediate care in the dental clinic.

My most recent outreach was in February 2016 when I served as the team leader overseeing the operations of the dental clinic and guiding the clinicians which included one oral surgeon, two general dentists, one dental hygienist, four dental assistants, and two Jamaican nationals all in coordination with local support personnel. We even had a Jamaican RDH, Merlene Sullivan join us.

Not everyone is able to go to another country to serve the impoverished — on these occasions, I was. In total, I gave over 130 hours of service to a group of warm and grateful people. Other teams have also gone to reapply fluoride varnish and rescreen the children. The program isn't perfect and some children don't get screened — we do what we can. There is still more to be done. The days are long and exhausting, and I know I am making a difference in many lives.

A portion of the cost of the trip is covered by donations within Jamaica Outreach Program (JOP), and I pay out of my own pocket for the balance. The time away from family and employment is minimal which makes it easier to leave. Area



dentists have generously donated unused equipment or dental supplies, and I purchased more to take with me. JOP has at least six dental mission trips a year and is always looking for

dentists, RDHs, assistants and lay people to serve on a team. We meet as strangers and leave as friends. There have also been entire offices that go and serve as a team.





The Most Holy Trinity – Model of Self-Giving Love

s we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity today, we contemplate a mystery that leads us so far out of our depth but at the same time so within our reach. It is out of our depth in the way that we will never understand the enormity of God's identity. But the mystery of the Trinity is also within our reach. The story of faith in the world is known as "salvation history", From the moment of creation until now, God has continually made himself known both in people and in the events of time. The Most Holy Trinity is the greatest expression of God's giving





Looking ahead, the next week we will read and discuss Chapter Seven that deals with the education of children. The Pope addresses the ethical and religious formation of children, and also raises new issues like the need for technological disconnect.

What Is Meditation?

Meditation is a mind and body practice that has a long history of use for increasing calmness and physical relaxation, improving psychological balance, coping with illness, and enhancing overall health and well-being. Mind and body practices focus on the interactions among the brain, mind, body, and behavior.

There are many types of meditation, but most have four elements in common: a quiet location with as few distractions as possible; a specific, comfortable posture; a focus of attention; and an open attitude (letting distractions come and go naturally without judging them). (www.nccih.nih.gov)

What is Christian Meditation?

Christian Mediation is a form of prayer that is very healthy for your personal consciousness. It can quiet anxieties and reduce needless worry. By consistently practicing meditation you can be more peaceful deep inside where it counts.

It has become very acceptable in the Catholic community as Centering Prayer. But this form can be difficult, especially for left brain people. Every other Wednesday in June an alternative form will be introduced and practiced. Each session will discuss consciousness because the more you understand consciousness, the more you will understand how meditation works to heal.

Join us on June 1, 15, and 29 in the Seminar Room of the Claussen Family Center. There will be two sessions each day, one at 11:00 a.m. and another identical session at 7:00 p.m. The series of sessions is progressive. But, if you must miss

one session, you are still invited to come to the next one.
