

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

#ToServe – A Simple Gesture: Constant Support to the Local Food Pantries from St. John

When a parishioner who is much smarter than me asked me what we do for the food pantries in the area to ensure food is available to those who need it, I quickly answered that there were many opportunities to support those causes. He pressed me and said, “What if we could help them all the time, rather than annually, or whenever there was enough food dropped off?” He then handed me a story of a church in California performing “A Simple Gesture”, a persistent food gathering and distribution function. It could not be more simple or effective. Parishioners would take the responsibility for filling a grocery bag every other month with essential items food pantries require. Children can help their parents by dropping a can of beans into the bag, learning how even a small effort can help those in need. Those on fixed income can still support the effort with a box of rice or cereal. It is visceral and direct to shop for items and brings you closer to those you are helping. Then, a reminder will be sent out a week before pickup and everyone would bring their bag (as full or not so full as they could in that timeframe) to the church, and we would provide them with their next bag, using the filled bags to bring the food to Guadalupe Social Services, St. Vincent DePaul, and St. Matthew’s House. There, the bags will be unloaded and the food given away, and the cycle can repeat over and over again. It is what we are called to do and what is core to the St. John Mission: To Serve.

The Ladies of Charity have taken this idea and will be assisting with the full roll-out in the Fall, but in order to make sure we can support the Food Pantries when they are in desperate need in the Summer, I would like to give the full-timers a chance to get their bags early and start the program for a June food delivery. 





The Word & *Life*

One Body, One Spirit in Christ

As we celebrate the Birthday of the Church at Pentecost, we acknowledge unity in the midst of great diversity. When we examine the long-standing history of the Church we acknowledge a religious experience that has seen many deaths and resurrections. Our ancestors created the ongoing saga of salvation history as they strived to pass on the faith in their own particular way. The Christian story encompasses the diversity of the past and the present, celebrating unity in the Spirit. This same Spirit, bestowed upon the apostles at Pentecost,

continues to move and breathe in the Church as she journeys through time.

We are reminded in our readings today that even though we are many members, we are baptized into one body. In Eucharistic Prayer III, we pray that we become "... one Body, one Spirit in Christ." Every individual in the Church has a particular role to play. There is vast experience present in the diversity of any congregation. As baptized Catholic Christians we share in the priestly and prophetic ministry of Jesus Christ. Each one of us is called to give witness to Christ in our own circumstance. The Spirit continues to inspire the Church *to be* the compassion of Christ in the world today. It is our duty to uphold the dignity and sanctity of life. We are obliged to respond to the world's need by sharing the little we have with those who have none. In the gospel of John, Jesus is seen offering a peace that the world cannot give and imparts the gift of the Spirit to the disciples, giving them authority to continue his redemptive work. Likewise, this same Spirit is bestowed upon us to continue this journey into transformation.

On the day of Pentecost the disciples had locked themselves away in fear. The

Reflection Questions

Reflecting on the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit, contemplate the following questions:

1. How do I use the wisdom of God when making choices?
2. Am I in touch with the voice of the Holy Spirit with me in order to understand God's will and my purpose?
3. Whose counsel do I consider: God's or the world's?
4. Do I accept the gift of fortitude in order to be courageous in giving witness to my faith's values?
5. How do I accept the knowledge gifted by the Holy Spirit to enable me to discover what God wants from me?
6. Do I cherish the gift of piety in which I show God love and reverence?
7. Have I an adequate fear of hurting the Lord by offending him through my actions?

Spirit filled their hearts and enabled them to speak in ways that they never had before. Their fears were cast aside. The disciples began to form a new community of faith – using boldness in a way they had never used it before. Jesus had filled them with the Father. The imparting of the Holy Spirit solidified Jesus’ wisdom in their hearts. These followers began to understand, depending on the counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and the fear of the Lord that the Holy Spirit had given them on that first Pentecost. They went out in unity, making Jesus’ message known. Through their witness, they began to reshape the world around them creating a new civilization in which Christ would be the center.

The Holy Spirit freely offers this fruit of courage to boldly give witness to our faith. Even though we approach the work of the Church in various ways, we are called to unity in the message of the gospel of love. Some may be conservative in their expression of faith, others liberal, while still others are moderate in their religious experience. It is important to remember that no matter where we find ourselves on the scale of discernment, we are called to unity in Christ. Each one of us is asked to be faithful to the teachings that enable us to be called Catholic Christians.

All members of the Body of Christ are equal but have a particular role and service to offer. Everyone in the Church contributes to building the kingdom of God. We are asked to seek together, the gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. As we search for these gifts, the presence of God will be evident in what we do and say. It is then that we begin to reshape the world around us that often stands in opposition to the will of God and create, in the words of Paul VI, “a civilization of love and peace”.



Wisdom of the Fathers

“Although to some it may seem strange Pentecost is an event that also involves the secular world.

For it gave rise to a new sociology — one which penetrates the values of the spirit, which forms our hierarchy of values, and which confronts us with the truth, and with the ultimate destiny of humanity.

It is this which has given us our belief in the dignity of the human person, and our civil customs, and which above all leads us to resolutely rise above all divisions and conflicts between humans, and to form humanity into a single family of the children of God, free and fraternal.

We recall the symbolism at the beginning of this amazing story, of the miracle of many different languages being made comprehensible to everyone by the Spirit.

It is the **civilization of love** and of peace which Pentecost has inaugurated — and we are all aware how much today the world still needs love and peace!”

A Note About Sacramental Preparation

The Diocese of Venice requires that students must attend a minimum of two consecutive years of Faith Formation to receive First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation. Students must be at least 7 years old by September 30, 2015, and in the 2nd grade to be eligible to receive the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Students are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the end of 10th grade. They must be at least 15 years old.

Because of the increased number of children preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion beyond 2nd grade, we have added preparation classes on Sunday mornings so that these children can enjoy to the fullest, their Faith Formation classes without being "pulled out" for instruction. We will have a special teacher for them on Sundays from 9:00 - 9:30 a.m. It is our hope that this format will allow children preparing for the sacraments to make the most of this special time. This additional class time is for children in YEAR 2 of their preparation only. YEAR 1 students need only attend Faith Formation classes with their grade level. Their catechist will be made aware that they are in Year 1 of their preparation for instruction purposes.




