



Serving the Community with direct access and support for our programs, no matter the financial situation, and outreach to those in need of our assistance.



SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

#ToKnow – Change Is the Holy Spirit Working in the Church

Change can be very hard. I have seen it first-hand with many of the changes we are working on here at St. John, as well as in every facet of our lives. Sometimes change can be threatening. Sometimes it is scary. Sometimes it is just plain strange. However, it is not something to fear or push away. We are making changes here at St. John, large ones like our Capital Campaign, filled with new programs and efforts to engage the faithful and the larger community, and small ones, like new processes for Baptism, making it easier and more accepting for people to become part of our church. We are following our Holy Father’s advice to not behave like “Christians who think like doctors of the law destroy what the Holy Spirit does in people’s hearts”.

Pope Francis reminds us that the Holy Spirit brings about change, even in our Church:

Ask the Lord for “the grace to not be afraid when the Spirit, with confidence, tells me to take a step forward”. Also ask for the “apostolic courage to live life and not to make a museum of memories of our Christian life”...

In this regard the Pope also suggested how we can be certain that the voice we hear is Jesus’ voice, and that whatever we feel we have to do is the work of the Holy Spirit. It is necessary, he said, “to pray. Without prayer, there is no room for the Holy Spirit”. We must “ask God to send us this gift: ‘Lord, give us the Holy Spirit, that we may discern in every moment what we have to do’”. However, this “doesn’t mean always repeating the same thing. The message is the same: but the Church goes forth, the Church goes forth with these surprises, with this newness of the Holy Spirit”.


Thus “it must be discerned, and to discern it one must pray, ask for this grace” — just like Barnabas, who “was full of the Holy Spirit and who understood straight away”. Also like Peter, who “saw and said: ‘who am I to deny baptism here?’”. Indeed, the Holy Spirit “doesn’t let us make mistakes”.

In this case too, the Pope said he was well aware of the objections that could be raised against his reasoning: “Father, why do you create so many problems?. Let’s do things as we have always done them, that way we are more certain”. He responded that this hypothesis might be “an alternative”, but it would be “a sterile alternative; a ‘dead’ alternative”. What is much better, he concluded, is “with prayer, with humility, to take the risk of accepting what the Spirit asks us to change according to the time in which we live: this is the way”. – Pope Francis 4/28/15 (<http://www.news.va/en/news/mass-at-santa-marta-open-to-surprises>)

Pre-school Catechism Children Grow Closer to God

Pre-school Catechism continues from page 1

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd's (CGS) formation of the child is rooted in the Bible and Liturgy and is founded on the educational principles of Maria Montessori. The children gather in the "atrium", which is a room prepared for them containing simple yet beautiful materials that they use to help them absorb the most essential proclamations of our Catholic faith.

One of the key principles of CGS is to "Help me (child) to grow closer to God by myself." This is done by incorporating the "work" of the child in the presentations to the child. In this approach, it helps the child to fulfill their desire to "work". Practical life activities such as pouring, hand washing, flower arranging etc... are also incorporated into the program. These activities involve concentration. Concentration in turn aids in contemplation. The goal of the catechism presentations is to foster contemplation.

The catechesis is administered through a series of presentations that have proven to be the most essential to an age group. Some of the themes include: Liturgical colors, the Altar and its articles, Advent and Christmas (Infancy narratives), the Holy Bible, The Kingdom of God Parables (the mustard seed, the merchant and pearl, the leaven) the Parable of the Good Shepherd, the Cenacle and Last Supper, Baptism, the Liturgy of Light, Easter and Pentecost. Once a child is given a presentation, the child is free to work independently and choose what he/she would like to work with.

One unique aspect of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is that adults are drawn to and nourished by many of the presentations that are given to the children, just as the children are.





The Word & Life

Growing In Christ

Many of the images that Jesus uses in the Sacred Scriptures can be lost for the listeners of modern day. Many cannot relate the rural background that provides the setting for Jesus' teachings. The image of Jesus as the true vine is indeed a powerful one. A vine takes a lot of care and attention in order to reach its fullest potential. If a vine owner does not take care of the vine it will do one of two things, i.e. it will die or grow out of control, bearing no fruit at all. A good vine needs much attention. The vine grower has to be committed to enabling the vine to bear fruit. It is vital that parts of the vine be taken away so that it can reach its full potential of bearing fruit. A successful vine can be determined by the care and pruning that takes place each year.

Jesus tells us that he is the true vine. If we remain in his love and keep his commandments, we will produce the fruits of his love. We are part of the story that leads others to God. Jesus invites us to be part of his message by being part of his Church here on earth. Sometimes it is necessary to prune away the things that prevent us from reaching our full potential in our faith life. Once we commit ourselves to remaining close to Christ and his message, it is then we become his disciples and bear fruit. In order to become a disciple we must take as a model the person of Christ and fashion our lives around his message. The example of the gospel is the ultimate guide for the discerning Christian. Our sentiments can only be

good if we consult the wisdom of Christ in our everyday concerns. Such wisdom helps us to peel around the layers of contradiction that obscures God's vision for us and the world. We do this by simply turning away from and constantly being open to conversion every day. If we place Christ as the source of our lives, we will grow in his wisdom and truth and reflect that to those around us.

Our Church, in her wisdom, fashions herself after Jesus Christ. Every time we gather to worship, we gather in the name of Christ himself and listen to his Word as if for the first time. The will of the Father and the healing of Christ can be discovered through the proclamation of the Word. As we gather around the altar, the priest reflects the action of the High Priest, that is, Christ himself, as he relives the last supper, Calvary, and the resurrection.

Reflection Questions

1. How is Jesus a source of life for you?
2. In what ways do you consult with the wisdom of Christ when faced with dilemmas in your life?
3. What needs to be pruned out of your life in order that you reach your full potential?
4. What does it mean to 'remain in Jesus' love'?
5. How do you bear the fruit of the gospel in your life?
6. What do you think the important characteristics are of discipleship?
7. What ultimately will bring you joy?


It is here that the Christ nourishes us with his body and blood. The cup that we take comes forth from the vine itself that is ready to give us life, for the vine is Christ.
