Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

#ToKnow, #ToLove — 50th World Communication Day: Mercy at the Heart of the Catholic Faith

This weekend is a special moment for the Catholic Church. It is the 50th World Communications Day. We have these special collections each year for this essential component of the Catholic Church, but what does it really mean? Why do we focus every year on the need to communicate our faith in a tangible way? World Communications Day stems from one of the decrees of the Second Vatican Council, *Inter mirifica* ("The Means of Social Communication"). Initially focused on the press and media outlets like movies and TV, it has expanded to mean all types of communication, from verbal to written, electronic or paper, video and pictures. If you think about how meaningful "communication" is for you and your life, you can understand why our Church puts such a special emphasis on communication.

Our Holy Father, in his message for this weekend, clearly lays out the need to communicate to every single person on the planet in a loving and merciful way:

As sons and daughters of God, we are called to communicate with everyone, without exception. In a particular way, the Church's words and actions are all meant to convey mercy, to touch people's hearts and to sustain them on their journey to that fullness of life which Jesus Christ was sent by the Father to bring to all. This means that we ourselves must be willing to accept the warmth of Mother Church and to share that warmth with others, so that Jesus may be known and loved. That warmth is what gives substance to the word of faith; by our preaching and witness, it ignites the "spark" which gives them life.

Communication has the power to build bridges, to enable encounter and inclusion, and thus to enrich society. How beautiful it is when people select their words and actions with care, in the effort to avoid misunderstandings, to heal wounded memories and to build peace and harmony. Words can build bridges between individuals and within families, social groups and peoples. This is possible both in the material world and the digital world. Our words and actions should be such as to help us all escape the vicious circles of condemnation and vengeance which continue to ensnare individuals and nations, encouraging expressions of hatred. The words of Christians ought to be a constant encouragement to communion and, even in those cases where they must firmly condemn evil, they should never try to rupture relationships and communication.

For this reason, I would like to invite all people of good will to rediscover the power of mercy to heal wounded relationships and to restore peace and harmony to families by Jean-Paul Boucher General Manager jp@sjecc.com



and communities. All of us know how many ways ancient wounds and lingering resentments can entrap individuals and stand in the way of communication and reconciliation. The same holds true for relationships between peoples. In every case, mercy is able to create a new kind of speech and dialogue. Shakespeare put it eloquently when he said: "The quality of mercy is not strained. It droppeth as the gentle rain from heaven upon the place beneath. It is twice blessed: it blesseth him that gives and him that takes. (The Merchant of Venice, Act IV, Scene I). – Pope Francis (https://w2.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/messages/ communications/documents/papa-francesco_20160124_ messaggio-comunicazioni-sociali.html)

How does that translate here at St. John? The best way I can think of is a story I wrote a few years ago, about how we treat a butterfly, the moment of encounter that may take place at the front of the church, or at the grocery store, or even in our own homes.

When a butterfly lands on our hand, we have several possible reactions to it, just like when we are called into a moment of encounter with another person. We could be so shocked of the beauty of that butterfly that we freeze, and do not move. We are passive. The butterfly will soon fly away to find more fertile ground. Or, we could be so scared to lose the butterfly that we close our hands around it, possibly hurting it in our attempt to keep it just where we want it to be. If we did not hurt it, the butterfly will find a way out between our fingers and fly away, as frightened as we were to lose it. We will have scared it away by trying to contain it, or put rules around it. Or, we could nurture and respect the butterfly so much, that we simply put our other hand up to protect it from the buffering wind around us, creating a safe place for it to sit. The butterfly will stay with us, calmed and sheltered.

Let us make St. John that safe, loving, joyous place where any butterfly can find peace, love, mercy, and fellowship.



Spotlight on Ministry Many Needy People Benefit from Sewing Group's Labor of Love


The Sewing Group ministry of St. John is a unique group of retired women was organized in 1996-97 by Eileen DiCarlo. In the beginning years the ladies started sewing for our sister parish on the island of Jamaica, St. Pius X. They sewed children's dresses, skirts, pants, shorts and tops and even school uniforms. Additionally, the group donated two sewing machines to help the Jamaican women learn to sew.

Nancy Cote relieved Eileen as chair in 2006. Some years later, the group divided the sewing between Jamaica and Immokalee, recognizing the needs in our own backyard. Then, since Immokalee received benefits from other local sources, the Sewing Group repositioned its efforts to a more needy clientele: the children of abused women, abused children, a group called "Baby Things" for babies of unwed mothers and a Mom and Tots program through Catholic Charities, all located in Naples and Bonita Springs. For the past four to five years the everbusy ladies have made over 400 types of children's clothes and most recently pajamas and blankets for children in the school next door, Naples Park Elementary School. Additionally, one member knitted 16 sweaters for the pre-schoolers, distributed at a Christmas Party at the school. The Sewing Group also sew for Grace Center Orphanage in Ethiopia, which was started by parishioner Marcie Erickson.

What are the needs of the Sewing Group? More hands. The Sewing Group welcome new members for whatever time they can offer. Usable fabrics and notions and, of course, monetary donations are always welcome. The group sews on Wednesdays from November to April from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. in Room 101 of the PLC Center.

As of March 2016, Phyllis Crivelli and Barbara Arthur have volunteered to serve as the new co-chairs.





destiny and salvation. Once Jesus had accomplished his ministry and won victory over death, then he returns to heaven to take his place with the Father. Such a sight must have been so life-changing. Although the first disciples saw Jesus vanish from their sight, they also saw the glory and divinity that truly belonged to him. Jesus was not simply a holy man with a divine message. Jesus was also divine with a human message that continues to transform the world.

Before Jesus ascends to heaven the disciples asked, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom of Israel?" Jesus tells the group of believers that it is not for them to know the time or season but to discern how restoration will take place through the gift of the Holy Spirit. To put it in a very human way, the disciples are asked with God's help of the Spirit to figure it out for themselves.

Years later, even though we have not experienced Jesus in his public ministry, we have a mystical experience of Jesus Christ. The Church constantly challenges us to recognize Jesus in the guise of the poor, the broken and the disadvantaged. Every time we gather for the Holy Eucharist we are reminded that Jesus is present in the people gathered in prayer, in the Sacred Word and in the real presence of the breaking of the bread. The priest is called to act in persona Christi – his transparency should ultimately allow Christ to speak and act through him. At the end of the mass were are called to take Christ to the world and to proclaim the same Jesus who vanished from the disciples' sight on the day of the ascension. We are invited to figure out what it means to experience the kingdom already, but not yet. The fullness of God will be revealed to us at the end of time. However, we have to discern the will of God in our everyday activities. We only have to look at the way we relate to ourselves, others, and God to see how we integrate such wisdom. God continually calls people of every time, language, and way of life to share in the reality of his love.

It may well seem that we are the unfortunate ones who believe without seeing the events that gave us our salvation in Christ. However, we are reminded that we are blessed for having not seen but yet believing in his message. To trust and believe in God requires a huge leap of faith – it sometimes means that we step out into the unknown in order for Christ to make himself known to us. If we trust the Word to be the Truth, then we rise with Christ in the resurrection, our hope ascends as He ascended, and our joy will be complete!

Amoris Laetitia cries for discussion in...parishes! ...and here at Saint John the Evangelist we are beginning this week.

Each week, after reading one of the chapters, you are invited to meet in dialogue groups to discuss what the Pope said, and how it relates to our daily commitments and challenges today.

Following the advice of Thomas Reese, SJ, whose Study Guide we will be using, we will start with Chapter 4, Love in Marriage.

"Chapter 4 is a masterpiece. It should be read by every couple planning to marry and every couple who has been married for no matter how many years."

Beginning with a meditation on St. Paul's lyrical passage on love in First Corinthians (13:4-7), the tone is pastoral and inspirational. "One can only conclude that as a priest and bishop he spent countless hours listening and dialoguing with couples about their lived experiences."

N.B. (note well) that men are specifically encouraged to attend since this focuses on couples, and that means both parties. With the option of multiple days and times even couples with different schedules can participate in the discussion individually and then continue it at home with their spouse.

Looking ahead, the next week we will jump to Chapter 8, Accompanying, Discerning and Integrating Weakness. Although it is of particular interest to divorced Catholics, "it is worth reading for everyone. It is probably the best discussion of conscience and sin that I have ever seen come out of the Vatican."

In weeks 3 and 4 we will read and discuss Chapter 5 which deals with children and Chapter 7 dealing with the education of children, including topics such as "technological disconnect."

To get started, here is what to do.

First: Get a copy of Amoris Laetitia.

Next: Read Chapter Four. Take your time, remember Pope Francis "does not recommend a rushed reading of the text. The greatest benefit...will come if each part is read patiently and carefully."

Then: Let us know which session you will attend this week. Each will be held in the Seminar Room of the Claussen Family Center and last no more than 75 minutes, although some may choose to remain and continue discussion.


