### Jamaica Outreach Program

### Bishop Burchell McPherson, of Montego Bay, Will Visit Our Parish Next Weekend

As the JOP enters its 19th year we find ourselves spreading our wings and sponsoring clinics and good works beyond our outreach in Kingston. For over a year now, at the invitation of Bishop Burchell McPherson, the bishop of Montego Bay, JOP board members and missionaries have visited the Montego Bay diocese to assess the needs there and determine how best we can meet them. Bishop Burchell has introduced us to a community in his diocese that needs what we can offer: medical, dental, and optical services for its citizens. Bishop Burchell will speak at Masses at St. John next weekend to ask for our help and support.

Seaford Town is nestled on a hilltop in the Westmorland section of Jamaica and just about an hour outside scenic Montego Bay. The

contrasts between the two populations are striking. Poverty is rampant in Seaford and brings with it all the maladies found in populations that lack public health resources. The lack of good roads and a means of transportation to the city keep most of its citizens unemployed and locked into a kind of poverty that knows no cure

On the bright side there is a wonderful little church serving as a beacon to the people of Seaford Town and its surrounding villages. Sacred Heart parish is staffed by Fr. Lukasz Sweda, a missionary priest from Poland. He has been at this mission church for five years. Along with Father are two nuns from the Philippines, Sr. Jhorna, a CNA cook and valuable assistant at Sacred Heart, and Sr. Athanasic, a nurse. These three are a dynamic team and very much entrenched in the life of the community.

Under Fr. Luke's leadership, a clinic, kindergarten, and primary school

have taken root in the parish. It is Father's energy and compassion for the poor that inspired Bishop Burchell to ask us for our help in sending dental, optical, and medical teams to the Sacred Heart Clinic. Sr. Athanasic needs the support of physicians to diagnose and prescribe medications, and we have the proven ability to attract medical professionals to Jamaica. It is a good match. This past October we staged a four-day dental and medical mission in Seaford. Over 200 patients were served and treated by dental and medical professionals. Making a difference is always our goal. We have done that in Kingston and we believe we can do it in Seaford. That goal is what drives our work in Jamaica and renews our resolve to support corporal works of mercy there whenever the opportunity arises.

Next weekend the second collection will be dedicated to the ongoing services we provide in Jamaica. JOP is an integral ministry of Saint John the Evangelist, and our parishioners continue to be our source of inspiration and celebration. Our gratitude knows no bounds.



### Parish Mission & Life

### #ToKnow - Saint John the Evangelist, **Incorporated Non-Profit Organization**

It may come as a surprise to some of you, but the structure of our parish entity of Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church has not changed since it was originally formed over 27 years ago. For financial and functional capabilities, it was an organization-type called a sole proprietorship. That is a legal entity that is owned and operated by one single person. There is no distinction in a sole proprietorship between that person and the organization. That owner is in direct control of all legal and financial liabilities of the organization, to include debts, loans, income, lawsuits, etc. In fact, every single parish in the Diocese of Venice was created as a sole proprietorship. The owner of all these organizations is Bishop Frank Dewane. There were many reasons that the Diocese structured the parishes in this format, but since that was way before my tenure here, I am not privy to that history. Needless to say, it did make for some concerns when I arrived, about how that structure functions, both operationally as well as canonically. For example, if someone slipped and fell at St. Ann, and sued that parish, the suit would actually be brought against St. Ann, Bishop Dewane, and every other parish in the Diocese. We could have been responsible for damages for issues at churches in Sarasota.

Luckily, as I began that research, I was provided a wonderful path forward. The Diocese of Venice had already identified the issues with the sole proprietorship and was moving forward with a strategy to incorporate all the parishes as separate







entities. This is great news for everyone involved. No longer are all parishes and the Diocese tied together for liabilities. As a non-profit, incorporated entity developed exclusively for religious purposes, St. John is able to be responsive to the needs of our Parish Family, and still report to the Bishop as the "sole member". Fr. John, as the Pastor, is given the full and complete authority vested in him as Pastor, as part of the Board of Trustees and through our new By-Laws, that fit the canonical responsibilities for his position. This incorporation occurred a few months ago, and we have just received the official letter from the IRS, indicating that our ID number has been transitioned to our new non-profit corporation, "St. John the Evangelist Parish in Naples, Inc." We are also officially known as "Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church".

So, while we are not making any major changes to our church mission, structure, or function, we are now protected from liabilities and debts that are not our own. It is a very positive transition for our Parish Family.

### #ToLove - Safety Concerns with Parking

As we see more and more members of our Parish Family coming back to our campus these past few weeks, we have also noticed that some people are creating safety concerns in where and how they are parking their vehicles. In the past, I have requested that we all take into account the safety of

our community when we park on our campus, especially during Mass and major programs like Faith Formation. It is completely understandable that people want to park as close as possible to the church. Some of our Parish Family have challenges with mobility, and we want to prioritize their ability to celebrate the Sacraments with close parking. Additionally, we have placed signs in key locations, designating those locations for expectant mothers and veterans. Other signs have been posted to clearly show spots where we cannot have parking. Those throughways are essential for the safety of our entire Parish Family. We need to have clear access for fire trucks and ambulances, in case of a medical incident.

While almost everyone has been respectful of these attempts to create the safe and protected environment here at St. John, there are still some individuals who continue to park inappropriately. Please take into consideration our entire Parish Family when you park on our campus. Thank you!







### The Season of Hope, Expectation and Promise



Even before Thanksgiving Day arrived, our stores were filled with Christmas bargains and songs. Whatever happened to a sense of reflection and sacred preparation for the Incarnate Feast of the Church? We are called to take a step back as Catholics and to reflect on the events surrounding Christmas as we now begin our journey through the Advent Season. It is a season of hope, expectation and promise. It is a time to appreciate the great gift that God bestowed upon our world when He sent his only Son to be our Savior.

The people of the ancient world, who lived under God's law, longed to see the day when the messiah would come to bring justice. The prophet Isaiah refers to this as the time of fulfillment and promise. The world was in need of God. The covenant made at Mount Sinai was broken because of sin. The people of God were in need of a new covenant, one that would once and for all unite heaven and earth. It is no surprise then that redemption is truly the sole purpose of the Christ event. In Jesus' teaching everything is restored and made whole — the world is reconciled with God. In contrast, the people of the early Christian Church then longed for the second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ. Humanity always seems to hunger for more — there is a constant longing





So what does this mean for us? It means that we simply live in a right relationship with God, others, and ourselves. In the event of the Incarnation, we are caught up in the love of the God we cannot see. We who live two thousand years after the Christ event have been gifted with the Word of God through the passage of time. Even though we might not see God face to face right now, we know by the promises given us in baptism and in the Word, that we will eventually see the Lord. If we live on in Christ's love and are open to his presence in our lives, we will truly stand justified before the Son of Man. In this way we will be prepared to meet the Lord when He comes.

Let us take the time during the Advent Season to pray and

reflect on the coming of Christ. As we move through the four weeks of this Season, let us be renewed in faith and experience the longing for the God of peace in our own lives. If there are troubling situations in our lives or in our families that continue to be unresolved, let us be the instruments of Christ's love and compassion.



### **Reflection Questions**

- 1. What did the coming of Christ mean to ancient Israel?
- 2. What does the Christ event mean to you?
- 3. What does Jesus mean by the coming of the Son of Man?
- 4. How will you observe the Season of Advent in your home?
- 5. Why is it important for Christians to celebrate Christmas each year and spend time in prayerful preparation for the sacred feast?
- 6. Would you be prepared to meet Christ face to face if your life was taken from you today? Why or why not?
- 7. Is Christ the center and focus of your life? Why or why not?

### Prayer

O come, O come, Immanuel. Captivate our imaginations and our hearts as we seek your ways. May we be redeemed as we contemplate the events that gave us salvation in Christ. Let our prayer be sincere as we place all our hope in You. Amen.

### Wisdom of the Fathers

"With today's first Sunday of Advent, a new liturgical year begins. The Church takes up her journey again, and invites us to reflect more intensely on the mystery of Christ, a mystery that is always new and that time cannot exhaust. Christ is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. Thanks to him, the history of humanity proceeds as a pilgrimage toward the fulfilment of the Kingdom which he inaugurated with his Incarnation and victory over sin and death.

For this reason, Advent is synonymous with hope: not the vain waiting for a faceless god, but concrete and certain trust in the return of him who has already visited us, of the "Spouse" who with his blood has sealed with humanity a pact that is an eternal covenant. It is a hope that stimulates vigilance, the characteristic virtue of this special liturgical season. Vigilance in *prayer*, fostered by a loving expectation; vigilance in the dynamics of *concrete charity*, aware that the Kingdom of God comes close whenever men learn to live as brothers.

The Christian community begins Advent with these

resolutions, keeping the spirit vigilant, the better to receive the message of the Word of God. In today's liturgy we hear the famous and wonderful *oracle of the Prophet Isaiah*, spoken at a time of crisis in the history of Israel. "In the days to come, the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills. All nations shall stream toward it;... they shall beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again" (cf. Isaiah 2,1-5).

These words contain a promise of peace that is more urgent than ever for humanity and, in particular, for the Holy Land, from where even today, unfortunately, sad and worrying news reaches us. May the words of the Prophet Isaiah inspire the minds and hearts of believers and of all men and women of good will, so that ..... will help to create a more serene and solitary climate in the world."

— Saint John Paul II, The Angelus Address, Sunday, 2 December, 2001



Most Rev. Frank J. Dewane, Bishop of the Diocese of Venice in Florida, will confer the Sacrament of Confirmation at Saint John the Evangelist parish in late April or May on both adult baptized Catholics who have not yet been confirmed, as well as our young adults who have completed two years of preparation.

Like Baptism, which it

completes, Confirmation is given only once, for it too imprints on the soul an indelible spiritual mark. "Confirmation is an assertive counterpart to passive baptism, an ecclesial symbol that those who are empowered by the Holy Spirit can transcend their own limitations and can be instruments of grace in the world." (Karl Rahner)

Through the laying on of hands, anointing with chrism, and prayer, those already baptized are strengthened by the Holy Spirit so that they may s spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ.

It is never too late to receive Confirmation; last year our adult confirmani ranged in age from 18 to 80 and spanned three generations.


