

# Mission Is a Passion for Jesus and ... a Passion for His People

— Pope Francis for World Mission Sunday 2015

"Those who follow Christ cannot fail to be missionaries, for they know that Jesus 'walks with them, speaks to them, breathes with them'. They sense Jesus alive with them in the midst of the missionary

enterprise" (Evangelii Gaudium, 266). Mission is a passion for Jesus and at the same time a passion for his people." These are the words of Pope Francis for World Mission Sunday 2015. Mission is central to the life of the Catholic experience. For the last two thousand years the Church has found itself in a constant state of mission in which others have been brought to encounter with Jesus. Countless men and women have given their lives to allow God to use them in order to bring others life in Jesus Christ.

World Mission Sunday, which is celebrated this weekend on Sunday, October 18, 2015, allows local parishes to support missionaries throughout the world through prayer and charitable offerings. There are over 1,150 mission dioceses in every continent. Missionaries often find themselves in deplorable situations of great suffering. The Mission Church


is a suffering Church in which individuals are forgotten and cast aside. Poverty and hunger, religious persecution and totalitarian regimes oppress and subject people to lives of abject poverty and abuse. We see on our television screens the countless numbers of people fleeing from such unjust realities in order to find a better life. The reality is that missionaries

are on the front lines of such situations offering their support and God's hope. In order for these missionaries to continue their important work and to achieve the task of the gospel, it requires the support of the developed world in which the

> Church has been gifted with resources. Each mission diocese relies on support from those who have been blessed by adequate housing, food, and a just wage. The monies collected on World Mission Sunday support missionary work in the remotest parts of the world. Contributions to the mission collection help create catechetical programs, the establishment of religious communities among the poor, the building of schools, churches and seminaries. Each dollar donated helps missionaries who remain on the front lines of poverty and desperation, giving of themselves completely to those God has asked them to serve. By participating in World Mission Sunday, we enter into solidarity with the missionaries and the poor they serve. Such programs allow missionaries to lead the world's poor to an encounter with Jesus where he speaks to them and breathes life into them.

In the last several years, Pope Francis has constantly emphasized the necessity of universal solidarity with the world's poor. He calls every Catholic to the obligation of the Church's mission. Pope Francis challenges the present culture to not get caught up in a material world in which the poor are constantly cast aside and forgotten.

#### Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

# #ToKnow — Our Parish Family on a Mission: Youth Acolytes

I have been reflecting on the amazing experience of the World Meeting of Families and the moment I watched my wife with my youngest daughter both awestruck as Our Holy Father passed by, gleaming white in his Popemobile, only 30 feet away from them. It still brings tears to my eyes, thinking of the amazing experience of the Papal Mass, when my son asked my wife to read the Homily to him because he could not understand the words, but loved the tone and compassion of Pope Francis. While the past weeks have been

a whirlwind of changes and excitement at St. John, including our largest Faith Formation program ever, it has filled me with joy to be reminded time and again about how much families and the youth contribute to our community, for all ages.

The Parish Family and the church is made up of all of us, and through every contribution, every word of encouragement, and every sacrifice we all make, we are renewing and living out our faith with our actions. Affirming our Mission focus, Pope Francis just this past week said:

I would like to reflect on some aspects of the profound relationship between the Church and the family, with a view to the common good of society. When families journey along the way of the Lord, they offer a fundamental witness to God's love, and they deserve the full commitment and support of the Church. In the family we learn of the bonds which unite us, of fidelity, sincerity,

trust, cooperation and respect, even when difficulties abound. Indeed it is in family life that the most vulnerable of society are cared for. And yet, political and economic life today does not always support the family, and seems to have lost the ability to incorporate the virtues of family life into the common life of society. Here the Church is called to exercise her mission by first examining to what extent she is living as the family of God. Like St. Peter, the Church is called to be a fisher of men, and so too needs a new type of net.

Families are this net. They free us from the sea of loneliness and indifference, so that we can all experience the freedom of being children of God. May the Church go out into the deep, confident that the catch will be great. – Pope Francis 10/7/2015

Such a community has an endless desire to show mercy, the fruit of its own experience of the power of the Father's infinite mercy. Let us try a little harder to take the first step and to become involved."

# Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Year B Isaiah 53:10-11 Psalm 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22 Hebrews 4:14-16 Mark 10:35-45 **Refusing Power** n today's gospel we see an all too familiar scene of a hunger for power, position, and ambition. James and John are traditionally known as the "Sons of Thunder.

n today's gospel we see an all too familiar scene of a hunger for power, position, and ambition. James and John are traditionally known as the "Sons of Thunder." These men act without thinking. Jesus had shown himself to be the master of humility, the Incarnation of service, the violence of love, and the empowered one who did not seek power. These disciples had put their ambition ahead of their commitment to Jesus and his message of service. James and John wanted recognition for the sacrifice they had made to follow Jesus. The two disciples had lost focus – their attention turned from the challenge to make known the way of the Lord to reward and prestige. James and John thought they were ready to drink from the cup that Jesus was to drink and be baptized by the baptism by which Jesus would be baptized. True to form, James and John jump ahead of themselves and commit to something which they did not truly understand. Jesus grounds these men's thoughts by redirecting their energies away from the hunger of power and prestige, to thoughts of servitude and the reality of suffering for the sake of the kingdom.

If we say that we truly believe the gospel that we hear proclaimed, then we must embrace the servitude that Jesus is calling his disciples to in today's gospel. Whenever we engage in Christian acts, we should do so out of love rather than the desire to be recognized by others in doing so. Our Christian acts are rooted in God's will for us and our ability to love as He has loved us. Our motivation in doing good should ultimately be for those who are in need, i.e., to feel God's presence through us. To do the truth in love is to do the right thing for the right reason. Simple acts of charity that are given freely and without any conditions

allow God's generosity to flow through us. The recipient of such kindness is aware of this loving service. It is in such giving that we truly receive God's grace.

The gospel today tells us of how Jesus warned his disciples about not getting wrapped up in worldly power. In the language of today, Jesus would be telling his listeners that power truly corrupts. The authority bestowed upon the Church is an authority that calls us to serve. Jesus himself became a suffering servant who humbly washed the feet of

a sinful and broken people. He gave his life as a ransom for many. Jesus asks us to share in this same selfless giving. As his disciples, we are asked to go out and make a difference in the world. Awakening each day is a gift for everyone living in the world. The only power that God desires for us is the power to love and the power to serve. The authority that he continues to hand onto the Church is an authority to bring others to the Truth. Such authority is clearly seen in the way that we reach out to others in love and confront those situations in life that are devoid of love and dignity. Maybe we will never eliminate the third world debt, or put an end to war and violence. All we can do is to act justly, to love tenderly, and to walk humbly with the God who is present in all peoples (Micah 6:8). In living in this manner the gift returned to us is not in being honored for these acts, but recognizing the blessings of such service.



# Prayer

Lord, may our work offered in service of your gospel be selfless. May we never seek to be noticed in our work for the Church, but remember the very act that you performed on the night before you died when you washed your disciples' feet. Encourage us to serve you without fear or reservation. May we drink from the cup from which you drink and be baptized with your baptism that filled our world with the revolution of love. Amen.




# **Spiritual Adoption Program Continues With Month Seven**


