Weekday Mass times will revert to the winter schedule Monday, November 2. We will return to the 8:00 and 9:00 a.m. morning Mass times Monday through Friday, with the addition of an evening Mass at 6:30 p.m. on Thursdays.

Saturday Mass times will remain at 8:00 a.m. with confessions immediately after. We will follow the winter Mass schedule until May, 2016.

#### Renovations and Renewal Begin For Saint John the Evangelist

While the Diocese of Venice requires any capital program to have a specific amount of funds deposited in the bank in order to break ground on new construction, St. John is not sitting still during the **Build Our Future**, **Serve Our Past** campaign. In fact, we have major renovations and planning going on right now to ensure we are repairing some of the issues of the past and ensuring the future of our church and other facilities. Here are just a few of the recent "upgrades":

- Church and Adoration Chapel: A new air conditioning system has been installed for the Adoration Chapel, Sacristy, and Cry Room. This multi-area system will ensure comfort for our Parish Family, visitors, clergy, and ministers. Previously, a single system operated those three distinct areas as a single location, which would mean some people would be extremely hot, while others would be freezing.
- Church Doors: New hardware has been placed on the front doors to our church. The donation of the doors by an amazing couple from our parish several years ago requires appropriate hardware that will stand up to the constant usage of our active church. This new hardware should no longer chip, and the new hardware will make it easier to enter the church and be part of our Parish Family.
- Parish Life Center: A new roof has been approved for the PLC building, where leaks this past summer have caused various issues. In addition to this new roof, for the first time, St. John now has a preventative maintenance contract for all our roofing needs, which will extend the life of all our roofs and make sure we know what issues we may have before an emergency pops up.

These are just a few of the changes that you may notice. There are so many other improvements we are making, from the donation of the repainting of our parking lines to the LED lighting replacements for our exterior and interior lighting. We are excited for this next chapter of Saint John the Evangelist, so we are getting started now!

As we develop and start the programs associated with our Build Our Future, Serve Our Past campaign for all members of our Parish Family, like the Catholic Adult Organization and CYO, we need our entire Parish Family to give in order to reach our additional goals. The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

# Getting #ToKnow Our Staff — New Coordinator of the High School Youth Group, Mary Beatty

One area of challenge for St. John over the past decade has been the effective engagement of the high school youth of the area. Did you know that we have over 300 active members of our Parish Family between the ages of 14 and 19? Yet, only a fraction of those youth attend our High School Youth Group, our Faith Formation program, or any of the spectrum of our current youth-friendly programs and events. In the Diocese of Venice, Confirmation now occurs during the sophomore year of high school, but for many years, Confirmation was granted in second grade, at the same time as Reconciliation and First Communion. The wonderful youth we have at St. John that went through this consolidated sacramental process are now in high school. There is an urgent need to renew our high school youth programs for both the planned influx of sacramental students coming (we have over 40 just this year, when last year we had 8), as well as for all the rest of the youth of our Parish Family.

I want to first and foremost thank Ben Weber (and his amazing wife, Theresa), who has been volunteering as the Coordinator of our High School Youth Group for the past year. Through his Herculean efforts, he has invigorated our Youth Group with social, spiritual, and serviceoriented activities, from traveling to Night of Joy, a Christian musical event at Disney World, to supporting the Casa Maria Soup Kitchen in Immokalee over the summer when their normal volunteer corps dwindles. However, his full-time job as a teacher and athletic director for Immokalee High School is his first priority, and the youth that he assists there on a daily basis need

him desperately. Ben and Theresa will continue to be an integral part of the Youth Group team, but we all need some focus on the leadership of this effort. The Holy Spirit has obviously been at work, since several meetings I was planning on having about youth programs were held up for various reasons until I was finally able to have coffee with Mary Beatty, long time St. John

parishioner, previous Youth Group supporter, and spectacular individual. Mary has agreed to take on the responsibility of Youth Group Coordinator, with a strong team, and tremendous experience coming with her.

As the Youth Group Coordinator, Mary will be responsible for the logistics and management of the activities of our Youth Group. During a recent meeting open to the entire parish, the priorities and plans for the Youth Group were presented. The goal is an integration of Catholic Youth Organization, the first active CYO in Florida. Additionally, the youth of the parish were given an opportunity to brainstorm what they are looking

> for from St. John in the short term until CYO is implemented. The results of this brainstorm can be found on our Youth Group webpage. Mary will bring her infectious optimism, deep Catholic faith and knowledge, and caring to the team. She will be joining Gina Manfredi, Zach Gibbons, Ben, Theresa, and others who we owe our gratitude for their continued efforts on behalf of our youth. We have several new members of this team coming as well, including Cory and Morgan. Cory grew up at St. John and is so excited to be back, along with his fiancé,





Before visiting St. John (or another diocesan screening location) for fingerprinting, applicants must complete the registration form online.

Registrants will need a photo identification (such as a driver's license), a major credit card and social security number. After registration is complete, print the receipt with the 6-digit ID number. Bring that to the fingerprinting site in order to be fingerprinted. Please do not make an appointment at St. John until you have the printed receipt with the 6-digit number.

When registering online, choose Saint John the Evangelist Parish as the place to get fingerprinted, if that is your choice.





## Faith Gives Birth to Sight

he str be sir this r a beg

he story of Bartimaeus is well known to all of us. On the surface it appears to be simply another account of healing. As with all the other stories of healing, this miracle witnesses to a deeper reality. Bartimaeus was blind and had become a beggar because of his disability. In the eyes of those around him he was of no use to society ~ he was a man without hope. The people of his day thought

that he was unworthy of Jesus' attention and they rebuke him as he calls out to Jesus to come to his aid. However, Jesus looks beyond Batimaeus' blindness and hopelessness and recognizes him as a man of great faith. In Jesus' eyes he was a man worthy of God's attention and God's love. Once the people see Jesus' interest and genuine concern for this poor man, their rebukes turn into chants of encouragement: "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." In this very act, their narrow attitude toward illness and poverty moves toward the initiative of concern and unconditional love. Therefore today's gospel is an encounter of physical and spiritual healing.

It is hard to imagine what Bartimaeus must have felt like as the vivid colors of life came back to his eyes. His blindness is taken away and his position in society is once again restored. Bartimaeus would no longer have to beg or live in the dark again. The faith of this man restores him to the light and a position of

belonging. Faith gives birth to sight for this man who was willing to trust and to take the risk.

Today, we are issued a call from Jesus to reach out to those who lack hope and courage. Our response to the gospel should be to give those who think that they are unimportant or unworthy of God's attention the courage to know Jesus loves them through the gift of our unconditional love. We must always seek to remove the blindness of prejudice, discrimination, and sinful attitudes that lead others to a

sense of isolation. Whenever we succumb to the temptation of feeling more

righteousness than others, we block the vision that God had intended us to embrace. If we deem someone unworthy of our support and acceptance as Church, then we place them outside of God's love. Our call is to offer them, not criticism or rejection, but the hope of God that is truly theirs. Once we take this story of healing to heart, we must realize that we are called like the bystanders in today's gospel to call others to take courage for Jesus is calling them to a life of transformation.

#### Prayer

Lord, open my eyes – Lord, that I may see. Lord, open my eyes and heal the blindness in me. Once that I can see empower me to follow you along your way, offering that same healing to others.
