#ToKnow, #ToLove, #ToServe – 2017 Starts with Protection of the Vulnerable as our Task

Some people still question Fr. John and me about our Safe Environment Training Initiative. If you are not aware, Saint John the Evangelist has placed a specific and direct priority on the safety of those who are vulnerable in our church. To be honest, we are all a step away from becoming vulnerable, from a fall that breaks a bone, to a loss of a loved one that breaks a heart. We want to ensure that every single person, no matter if they are a 4-year old, a 40-year old with Autism Spectrum Disorder, or a 104 year old with a cane, feels the love, safety, and protection of the Catholic Church when they enter our campus. The world is fraught with dangers and St. John should be a sanctuary where children and adults alike can enjoy their lives and their faith together. Without our strong Safe Environment policies and procedures, and our constant vigilance to ensure they are followed, we cannot assure that protection.

Our Holy Father echoes this sentiment in his recent letter to all the Bishops of the World for the Feast Day of the Innocents, requiring them to build a church with "zero tolerance" for allowing the joy of life to be robbed:

The same thing is asked of us pastors today: to be men attentive, and not deaf, to the voice of God, and hence more sensitive to what is happening all around us. Today, with Saint Joseph as our model, we are asked not to let ourselves be robbed of joy. We are asked to protect this joy from the Herods of our own time. Like Joseph, we need the courage to respond to this reality, to arise and take it firmly in hand (cf. Mt 2:20). The courage to guard this joy from the new Herods of our time, who devour the innocence of our children. An innocence robbed from them by the oppression of illegal slave labour, prostitution and exploitation. An innocence shattered by wars and forced immigration, with the great loss that this entails. Thousands of our children have fallen into the hands of gangs, criminal organizations and merchants of death, who only devour and exploit their neediness.

To illustrate this point, there are at present 75 million children who, due to prolonged situations of emergency and crisis, have had to interrupt their education. In 2015, 68% of all persons who were victims of sexual exploitation were children. At the same time, a third of all children who have to live outside their homelands do so because forcibly displaced. We live in a world where almost half of the children who die under the age of five do so because of malnutrition. It is estimated that in 2016 there were 150 million child labourers, many of whom live in conditions of slavery. According to the most recent report presented by UNICEF, unless the world situation changes, in 2030 there will be 167 million children living in extreme poverty, 69 million children under the age of five will die between 2016 and 2030, and 16 million children will not receive basic schooling.

We hear these children and their cries of pain; we also hear the cry of the Church our Mother, who weeps not only for the pain caused to her youngest sons and daughters, but also because she recognizes the sins of some of her members: the sufferings, the experiences and the pain of minors who were abused sexually by priests. It is a sin that shames us. Persons responsible for the protection of those children destroyed their dignity. We regret this deeply and we beg forgiveness. We join in the pain of the victims and weep for this sin. The sin of what happened, the sin of failing to help, the sin of covering up and denial, the sin of the abuse of power. The Church also weeps bitterly over this sin of her sons and she asks forgiveness. Today, as we commemorate the feast of the Holy Innocents, I would like us to renew our complete commitment to ensuring that these atrocities will no longer take place in our midst. Let us find the courage needed to take all necessary measures and to protect in every way the lives of our children, so that such crimes may never be repeated. In this area, let us adhere, clearly and faithfully, to "zero tolerance".

Christian joy does not arise on the fringes of reality, by ignoring it or acting as if it did not exist. Christian joy is born from a call – the same call that Saint Joseph received – to embrace and protect human life, especially that of the holy innocents of our own day. Christmas is a time that challenges us to protect life, to help it be born and grow. It is a time that challenges us as bishops to find new courage. The courage that generates processes capable of acknowledging the reality that many of our children are experiencing today, and working to ensure them the bare minimum needed so that their dignity as God's children will not only be respected but, above all, defended.

Let us not allow them to be robbed of joy. Let us not allow ourselves to be robbed of joy, but guard it and nourish its growth. — Pope Francis 12/28/2016 (http://w2.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/letters/2016/documents/papa-francesco_20161228_santi-innocenti.html)

This is why the next two Movie Nights for Adults will focus on the essential themes of child abuse. Never again will we allow our church to be complacent or quiet about this risk, which will always be there, waiting for a loophole or some other way into our sanctuary. Please join us, especially for **Spotlight**, on February 19, where all three of our priests will attend and provide opportunities for discussion afterward.



Of course, we are not done with the CFA, as we will be receiving our 2017 CFA Goal number from the Diocese shortly, and kicking into gear with a new focus for the CFA here at St. John that will ensure we are properly engaged with the Diocese for the proper amount our Parish Family should provide for these needed services.


population in Jamaica.

oday we remember the visit of the magi to the newborn king of the Jews – the very Jesus whom we encounter in the breaking of the bread. But who were these magi? There is much speculation about these people. Some tradition points to the magi being astrologers, others, wise men (or philosophers), still others, kings from other ancient kingdoms. Regardless of where we stand in our interpretation, we know that these characters came from the east and were familiar with the prophecies of Sacred Scriptures. The magi were the ones who followed

a sign pointing to the one who was to shepherd Israel. You could say that they were people who sought for the deeper realities in life, and once they encountered Jesus under the guidance of a star, offered their homage and treasures to the infant king. The magi then listened to their dreams and avoided the Herod who would seek to undermine the sacred life of the shepherd which was waiting to unfold.

As we listen to the story of the gospel we remember a manifestation of God to human beings. We are now challenged to open ourselves to the everyday epiphanies that will lead us to God. The magi teach us that we must seek the deeper realities of life – this is true spirituality. There is really more to life than meets the eye. Every sunset, flower, face and creature can ultimately open us to the beauty that God has gifted us. However, we must have open hearts and minds like the magi, to recognize the sacred in the midst of the ordinary. God gifts us with many things. It is up to each of us individually and collectively to honor such gifts by being faithful stewards of God's creation.

So what does this all mean? It means simply that we offer ourselves to God by the lives we lead. We are challenged to hold fast to the dignity of human life from the merest beginnings of life at conception, until the Lord comes to take us home in the ultimate Epiphany. We are also asked to care for creation so that future generations will encounter God through the abundance of creation. It simply means that we

recognize the Lord Jesus in the poorest of the poor and weakest of the weak. If we open our minds and wills completely to what is sacred in the secular, then our whole lives may be blessed by the eternal epiphanies presented to us in the sacrament of the present moment. Our life is God's gift to us – our lives can be our gift to God. Each one of us has consciously or unconsciously set out on the great pilgrimage of life. Life has its moments which are both great and disappointment. In the midst of all these experiences, God manages to communicate something of Himself if we are receptive to his presence. Sometimes it takes a lot of effort to open ourselves to the gift of Epiphany. For the magi, it meant they had to set out on a journey and follow the sign of the great star. For us it means that we too embark on the Christian journey and follow the way of the gospel!

That prophets hoped and longed for


Then all of creation celebrates

Frequently Asked Questions

I was baptized as an infant, received my First Communion, and Confirmed. I attend Sunday Mass regularly, why should I consider Adult Faith Formation?

The religious education you received as a child was appropriate for a child, but did not prepare you to address the questions you have as an adult. It is difficult to answer the questions and deal with the issues posed by our present society with eighth grade answers.

The Catholic/Christian faith is, for the most part, an adult faith. Much of what it takes to understand the faith – not just with your head but also with your heart – can be dealt with adequately only in adulthood.

What is the difference between Adult Education and Adult Faith Formation?

Education presents information and expands understanding of our faith. Formation addresses a deeper spiritual wisdom, a wisdom born of your life experiences and encompassing your head, heart and hands; formation involves making value judgements and applying them to daily life.

Put in the context of our Parish Mission, education is the "to know", formation is the "to love".

What does a typical program entail?

Generally, the Adult Faith Formation programs consist of viewing a professional video featuring a renowned presenter, followed by facilitated discussion of questions and issues that were raised. Our team of facilitators have been formed through advanced education; most have Master's degrees in ministry, some with a focus on Adult Faith Formation. They are also experienced in encouraging discussion without putting pressure on anyone to contribute.

What programs are being offered this winter, and how many times do they meet?

A new six-week program entitled **The Pivotal Players** presents the life stories of six key people in the Church, selected from the fourth century to the twentieth century for their unique contribution to our faith.

Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible is an eight-week overview of the 14 narrative books of the Bible from Genesis to Acts which provides a context in which to understand the readings we hear every week at Mass.

CATHOLICISM is a beautiful, award winning, 10-session program that delves into what Catholics believe, and why. Beautifully filmed throughout the world, in the places where the events occurred, and hosted by Bishop Robert Barron, this is truly Catholicism 101 for Adults. If you haven't experienced this program, you should. Even if you have seen some or all of the sessions before, you are invited to view them again; each time additional insights and aspects of our faith arise.

An in depth Bible study featuring Jeff Cavins' unique approach to understanding the Bible, will begin, and the first half will be offered before Easter. Entitled **The Bible Timeline**, this covers the same 14 narrative books of the Bible, but more completely and in much greater in-depth than the eight-week Unlocking program. As Cavins says, it's like driving through the Holy Land in a Land Rover, versus flying over at 30,000 feet.

In addition, there will be regular sessions for parents of youth in Faith Formation while those classes meet, and a special discussion group for grandparents, developed by the leaders of the Christian Family Movement and facilitated by a couple who have been international leaders of that ministry.

Are these programs just for women, or can men attend, too?

Good question, and the answer is easy. Men are not only allowed, but encouraged to attend and participate (except the Thursday morning Women of the Word). And two of the facilitators are men as well.

That's a lot; how do I choose the best way for me to begin?

Pick either a day or time (all of the programs are offered both in the daytime and in the evening), or pick the program that interests you the most.

Then just come and try it out; there is no obligation to continue.

What does it cost?

There is no charge for the programs. Study Guides and Workbooks are optional for most programs; they are available at cost and couples frequently share them.


