A Capital Campaign for Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church

Roof Leaks Illustrate Continued Need for Campaign

If you have attended Mass this past week during the rainstorms we have been having, you may have noticed a new item on the altar: a rain catcher.

When we began our Capital Campaign, we named it Build Our Future, Serve Our Past for a specific reason. We knew that our entire campus requires renewal in the near future. Some people would respond to Fr. John's vision for the future of the Catholic community in Naples, and would to contribute to the Parish Family for our new Life Center. Those efforts were accomplished much faster than any of us anticipated. We recognized, however, that while not everyone might believe in that vision, they could certainly understand the other needs of our campus, including the current roof of the church, the renovation of the Ballroom, and many other items. We specifically built the campaign to include goals so we could rejuvenate our entire campus. It is time to focus on those goals and efforts. God himself is showcasing that fact with what was called "our new Baptismal Font" on the steps of the altar, from the leak emanating from the now-defunct skylight in the church roof.

We have received several bids from roofing companies in the area to fully replace the roof. The situation is dire: after over 25 years, the plywood and layers under the tiles have warped and failed in several areas. This replacement must be complete and total. The bids are coming in around \$350,000, which includes the significantly less expensive move to a standing seam metal roof, rather than with the tile roof we have now. Several wonderful Parish Family members have already dedicated their Capital Campaign pledges to the church roof, but their amounts are not even a third of the above cost. We need more assistance in order to accomplish this essential project. Any donations you provide will continue to be non-assessable by the Diocese, meaning that we get 100% of your gift to fix the roof, instead of requiring us to give 26% of it to Venice.

Mass on Memorial Day Honored Those Who Have Fallen in Order to Protect Our Freedom

The annual Memorial Day Remembrance celebration at the May 29 Mass began with the prelude of God Bless America and Eternal Father, Strong to Save. Organist Mary Klucinek provided the music as the St. John Choir and Artistic Director Jennine Fuentes sang the patriotic songs and hymn dedicated to those who served in all branches of our Armed Forces.

A first for St. John was the Collier County Sheriff's Office Color Guard, who presented the colors under the direction of Sgt. Dan Salls.

They were an impressive site to watch, marching in cadence down the center aisle of the church, turning and facing the congregation as the Pledge of Allegiance was recited, then followed by the singing of our National Anthem.

Fr. Bob was the celebrant of the 8:30 a.m. Mass and in his homily asked that, "We remember those who have died defending our country." He added, "This is a day for God to grant Mercy to all those who sacrificed so much." He also said, "There are far too few saying thank you to our veterans for their service."

In his remarks following the concluding rite, Tom Middlemiss reminded the congregation that over 1,319,000 Americans have paid the supreme sacrifice in all our wars to keep America free.

He added, "Nothing can be as moving as a visit to a National Cemetery, especially on Memorial Day, where the graves of those who fought and died for our country are interred, decorated with flowers and American flags...Walking on that sacred ground of sparkling white crosses and stars of David is an image that will be seared into your brain forever."

He concluded his remarks by asking that we also remember our men and women in law enforcement who protect us from harm as do our fire fighters and first responders; they are always there, forever standing guard.

May God Bless and protect them and may God Bless the United States of America.

For several years now, we have explored the concept of the Catholic Church as a Field Hospital. Pope Francis first illuminated this metaphor in 2013:

The thing the church needs most today is the ability to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful; it needs nearness, proximity. I see the church as a field hospital after battle. It is useless to ask a seriously injured person if he has high cholesterol and about the level of his blood sugars! You have to heal his wounds. Then we can talk about everything else. Heal the wounds, heal the wounds.



Proceeds will fund our parish youth trip to Grenada to gain enrichment from service. The sale also supports the catholic monks' life of work and prayer.



Mirroring the Love and Nature of God

s we gather to celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we stop to contemplate the height and depth, breadth and width of the mystery of God in Salvation History. The Trinity is ultimately a mystery, which the human intellect will never fully comprehend. However, our faith allows us to penetrate the shroud of mystery that surrounds the self-giving reality of God. The mystery of the Trinity is about God's relationship with the world — of how God gives of himself in human history. God may be experienced in many ways, not only through prayer, worship, and the sacraments, but also through the gifts of others and of nature. The

- 1. Name the ways in which each person of the Trinity offers gifts to the world.
- 2. How is the Trinity present during the sacrifice of the Mass?
- 3. How is God a Father to you?
- 4. How do you experience the Incarnate Word in your daily life?
- 5. How does the Holy Spirit prompt you to become a member of Christ's Body?
- 6. In what ways are you challenged by the perfect unity of the Trinity in your relationships?
- 7. How do you reflect the selfless giving and generosity of God in the Holy Trinity?

theology of the Trinity reminds us that in God we find perfect unity. God is Three-In-One, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. No person is greater than the other, rather an integral part that compliments the others.

Confusing? We are constantly limited in our human expression and the way in which we use language. We cannot adequately express such a divine and wonderful mystery. However, our humble attempts to understand the nature of God and to grapple with the mystery opens us to the reality of God in our lives. In our efforts to understand God and in following God's way, we will, in the end, glorify God. The Most Holy Trinity is an inexplicable expression of God's desire that unity be preserved. This mystery also calls us to that same unity in the Church and in the world.

Throughout the passages of time, God has communicated Himself in astounding ways. God's Spirit hovered over the waters of the deep at creation. God's voice spoke to the Patriarchs and the Prophets, thus making His will known for the world. The Word (Jesus), present in the beginning of time, became Flesh and made his dwelling among us so that our humanity may be blessed and fulfilled. And such was God's gift that he gave us his only Son that we would believe and have eternal life. Jesus offers himself as the living bread that came down from heaven. In eating his flesh and drinking

his blood, Jesus becomes the eternal life force that nourishes the world. God's initiative for the human race is that we would be saved, not condemned, and given paradise. This is the generosity of God — a generosity that we are invited to share. We are asked to be selfless in dealing with others, just as God has continually been selfless in giving of himself to the world. As the Trinity relentlessly gives to the world and equally witnesses to each of its persons, so the gift of married love must always be mutual, generous, and unified. We must always be aware of the call to live as one in the community of the Church — seeing each member as an equal and integral part of ecclesial life. As the Trinity has constantly given of itself throughout history, we are invited to mirror this giving in the choices we make and lifestyles that we embrace.






