

#ToKnow - CFA Status Update

As we focus on our Catholic Faith Appeal Assessment Goal, I will be providing a short summary of where we stand on a weekly basis. These updates may be a week or so behind, so we will also provide them on our website, so please visit http://sjecc.com for the most up-to-date information.

What an amazing feat of our Parish Family. With only a month and a half to go, our parish was able to raise the nearly \$200,000 needed to reach our CFA Goal for 2016. We stand at \$502,797.42, only \$15,202.58 from the Diocesan Assessment. Thank you all for your dedication to this important focus for the gifts to the area of Southwest Florida. We have been able to sponsor more Catholic Charities support, more


Seminarians, and more Diocesan programs than nearly any other parish in our Diocese. Only Saint Williams has a larger CFA Assessment than us this year. It is only through your tremendous devotion to our faith that we have been able to achieve this goal.

Unfortunately, our work is not done. Each year, the Diocese re-evaluates our assessment. For 2017, they have seen fit to increase our goal only \$3,000, to \$521,000. This is very achievable for us, given the dedication we have been able to show this year. Please stay tuned for our 2017 CFA Weekend in February, and we will continue to keep you updated as we strive to continue to lead this community in service to those most in need around us.



ohn the Baptist must have brought tears to the eyes of his listeners the day he proclaimed Jesus to be the Lamb of God. It was a day when a dream came true. John had been calling the people of his time to the baptism of repentance because the time was near at hand. The day he watched Jesus coming toward him was a day of recognition – Jesus was the Son of God who would baptize the world with the Holy Spirit and set it on fire! The people who followed John were hoping for the promised Messiah – now their hopes were realized and, as the gospel continues, they leave John to follow Jesus to embrace the wisdom of God!


Reflection Questions

- 1. Where do you perceive Christ to be in your life?
- 2. In what situations have you been overwhelmed by the presence of God?
- 3. How does the message of Jesus help you in your family life?
- 4. How do you concretely reach out to others?
- 5. How are you being called to serve God's Church?
- 6. What are some of the challenges that inhibit you in your faith?

How is this good news for us today? As the Church continues to proclaim the gospel in the modern world, we are asked to behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world and allow him to lead us. The Holy Eucharist reminds us of this as the priest holds high the Host after the breaking of the bread. This is beyond all imagining and beyond a shadow of a doubt, the real presence of Jesus in our community. Such a divine presence demands a respect, reverence and deep faith from all of us as we gather to celebrate the Mass. However, we are called to go further than that also. As we end the Mass, the priest or deacon tells us, "Go in peace glorifying the Lord by your life!" In concrete this means that we are to be attentive and to watch for the Lord throughout our week. We do so by encountering Christ within our families, the domestic Church and within our community. In a sense, the disciples of John had it easier than us because they could see Jesus with their own eyes and hear him with their own ears. For us, all these years later, we must discern where Christ

is to be found in the world today. Such discernment comes through our reflection, prayer, and a willingness to follow Christ in all that we say and do.

Once we have knowledge of Jesus, the challenge is to experience him in the here and now. This requires a conscious effort on our part to fully embrace him in our lives by being open to his presence in all things. Jesus invites each one of us to "Come and see" where he lives. As we move through this year, every gospel we hear proclaimed will challenge us to go deeper. Every encounter of Jesus that we hear of in the gospel will ultimately disturb our complacency to go the extra mile – to bring forgiveness where there is a reluctance to forgive, to heal where there is pain, to bring hope where there is despair, and to establish peace within the broken realities of our lives and of the world.

Lord, in this New Year may we watch for you. Help us to embrace your message as difficult as it may be. Let our firm belief in the Eucharist lead us to the many ways that you reveal yourself to us every day. Wherever our lives take us may we always be open to your transforming love. 


CATECHIST SPOTLIGHT

Adult Faith Formation Bible Studies Begin January 18 and February 2

Many Catholics don't know the Bible very well. Vatican II called for a revival in biblical studies, but I don't think that's happened yet, at least among average Catholics.

We need to understand the great biblical story, beginning with Creation and the Fall, the formation of Israel, the coming of the prophets and patriarchs, and finally the formation of a people that leads to the coming of a savior. It's only when we get the sweep of that whole story that we understand why the coming of the savior matters, and what the coming of the savior even means.

When you extract Jesus from the biblical narrative, he becomes a mere guru, teacher, or philosopher. That's all our culture gives us: Jesus as another mystic, seer, or sage. But when you see Jesus against the backdrop of the great story of Israel, now you see that he's the savior.

So, I would recommend to all Catholics, open up your Bible and get deeply immersed in the great biblical story.


Bishop Robert Barron Series Begin January 24 and February 2






