# Next Sunday Is Good Shepherd Sunday with Special Focus on Vocations

In the Gospel of St. John, Jesus declares, "I am the Good shepherd, the shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." (John 10:11) A Shepherd's job is to care for the sheep in every way. In the same Gospel Jesus also says, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me." (John 10:27) Every Catholic has a vocation, a calling from God on how to live our life in service to Him and others.

Next weekend, we will be celebrating those vocations, from priesthood to marriage, from religious life to single life, across our campus for Good Shepherd Sunday. We celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, May 7. This Good Shepherd Sunday we are offering a few events on our campus to provide an atmosphere of prayer specifically for vocations. The St. John Vocations Ministry is designed to raise parishioners' awareness in order to hear and obey the calls of the Good Shepherd, and to live out our lives in accordance with God's true calling to either priesthood, religious life, single life, or marriage.

We will have a special "Vocations" Adoration all day on Sunday, May 7. Procession with the Blessed Sacrament from the church to the Rome Room will immediately follow the 9:00 a.m.



Mass. We encourage families to partake in prayerful Adoration in the Rome Room, from 10:00 a.m. to 8:30 p.m., and to specifically pray for their vocations and those of our Parish Family.

The Vocations Ministry has also initiated a **Traveling Crucifix** program. Families have already begun to host the traveling crucifix in their home as a reminder to pray for their specific vocation as a household. ## Interview with a Pastor: Fr John's 20th Anniversary Reflection on Vocation

I wanted to take a step back from the furious activity of our Capital Campaign and construction efforts to reflect on the man whose vision has made this all a reality. Father John J. Ludden, our Pastor, has been here at St. John for eight and a half years now, which is nearly half of his total years as a priest. Over the past six years, I have gotten to know Fr. John as a priest. And for three and a half years, I have learned what an extraordinary man he is as his General Manager, both in his pastoral support for our Parish Family as well as his missionary spirit. asked yourself so you too can get a feel for how and why he chose this vocation.



#### When did you know you wanted to be a priest?


When I was in grade school. I remember turning to Dad in church and saying to him, "I think God wants me to be a priest", and he responded, "In God's time, John."


## What do you know now that you would tell that boy when he was considering this vocation?

Saturday Mass will be at 8:00 a.m. with confessions at 8:30 a.m.


We will return to the winter Mass schedule in November.

## #ToKnow – Memorial Garden Update: Availability and Policy for Upkeep

It is usually around this time of year that I try to give an update on one of the most emotionally striking and visually beautiful locations on our campus: the Memorial Garden. For those of you who may not be aware, St. John is blessed to have a cemetery on our campus as the final resting place for our Parish Family, if they so choose. It is built to support 2,155 souls that have decided to be cremated and interred here at our church. Our Memorial Garden can be found

out the back doors of the North Wing of the church, where our Blessed Mother Mary and Baby Jesus statue can be found. It is an incredibly serene and healing place, where families and friends come to visit and remember those they have lost.

This beautiful location has been available since 1995 for our Parish Family, and it has undergone several updates over the years. Our dedicated staff and volunteers perform a labor of love to ensure the Memorial Garden is

a comfort for all that visit. We are now at 92% capacity, with only 172 plots available. Of that, 36 are specifically reserved for Knights of Columbus members and their families. We continue to make this an extremely affordable option, at only \$1,750 a plot (which is for one individual). The purchase of the plot includes:

- **1. Plot land in perpetuity** This Memorial Garden is a permeant fixture and even if St. John was no longer at this location, that land will always be a Memorial Garden.
- 2. **Urn** A beautiful and simple bronze urn that is specifically sized for our Memorial Garden and ensures the cremains are safe and protected.
- 3. Granite Marker This simple marker has been chosen to ensure all headstones are the same and they are ordered at the time of someone's passing. It takes about 8-12 weeks for delivery and installation, and we will contact the next of kin to ensure they are aware that the marker is in place.

4. **Interment** – Did you know the simple rite at the grave can be performed by itself or as the continuation of the funeral Mass? This service is included.

While this one-time fee covers all the above, it can be broken out into manageable payment plans so as to not cause any undo burden. The only increase we are being required to include in all future purchases of Memorial Garden plots in the taxes of

the cost of the plot. We will be including those taxes starting as of July 1, 2017.

We are ensuring the ability of the Memorial Garden to continue to be a healing location and comfort to all that spend time in it. New lighting will be installed as the current lights need to be replaced due to wear and tear over the years. The landscaping is constantly evaluated to ensure we provide the ability for flowers to be placed on the graves by visitors and that it reflects

the simple and warm environment we want to provide. We need all of your assistance with this task. In order to make sure the Memorial Garden retains its simple and restful environment as well as to protect the graves and landscaping, we are instituting the following policy:

All artificial items placed within the Memorial Garden by visitors will be removed on Thursday mornings. We will attempt to retain these keepsakes, vases, artificial flowers, potted plants, flags, and other items for 30 days after their removal in a box in the Church Office, but we cannot be held responsible for any items as this is a publically accessible location. It is highly recommended that visitors utilize the flowering plants of the Memorial Garden as the primary way to remember their loved ones.

Here are the reasons for this policy:

- Retaining the serene environment: There have been several complaints that too many items are impacting the ability for other families to find and view their own loved one's headstones.
- Safety of the landscaping: Artificial items may damage both the headstones as well as the grounds of our Memorial Garden. The reason we are choosing Thursday mornings to remove all items is that we have our landscaping company that services the campus on Thursdays, and they have a difficult time properly cleaning the Memorial Garden with the items.

Please assist us with continuing to provide this beautiful location for generations to come.



## Jamaica Outreach Program

## "I feel it has changed my perspective on life."

As the "busy" season loses its grip on Southwest Florida, those of us who serve the poor are once again reminded that, no matter where it resides, poverty knows no season or recess. Our mantra since the day we were founded almost 20 years ago has always been to somehow make a difference in the lives of the poor in Jamaica. Knowing from the outset that we cannot erase poverty there, we decided that the best way to fulfill our mantra would be to concentrate on the things that poverty cannot mend or fix.

To that end, we have established optical and dental clinics in Kingston and Seaford Town, Jamaica, and recruited medical professionals to visit them four or five times a year. These volunteers have performed over 500 cataract surgeries in Kingston, sponsored corneal transplant procedures in Naples, and provided well over 9,500 prescription eye glasses to children and adults who would never have had access to that kind of eye care. In addition, nearly 7,000 dental patients have been relieved of the consequences of poor dental health, and more than 1,900 students at two elementary schools have entered a fluoride varnishing program conducted by JOP volunteer hygienists.

The testimony of our missionary teams echoes the comments of many who serve the poor in third world countries. Here is a comment from a dentist after his very first JOP mission trip to Jamaica. "Once I got off the plane, I was overcome with emotion about how much we gave of ourselves and the difference it made to the people of Jamaica. I have never worked so hard in my life. It was truly an emotional experience for me! I feel like it has changed my perspective on life." That dentist has returned to Kingston twice to donate his time, talent, effort, and energy to a deserving people. He is one of many who do the same.

Everything we do in Jamaica is made possible in large part by the support Saint John the Evangelist parishioners extend to us in four annual second collections. Next weekend the third collection in our fiscal year will be held. As always, we thank you for what you do in His name for the benefit of people you will never know or never meet. It is that kind of love that never stops giving, seldom gets the credit it deserves but always makes a difference.

## The Road to Emmaus ~ A Journey Into Belief

n this third Sunday of Easter we hear the story of two of Jesus' disciples walking from Jerusalem to a village called Emmaus. Jesus appears to them and asks them what they are conversing about. The disciples recall how they had placed their hopes in Jesus, only to see him die. They relate that the women of the group reported that they had seen Jesus alive but that they themselves were unable to testify to this fact, having not seen him with their own eyes. The discerning Christian might wonder: Why were these men walking away from Jerusalem if they had been told Jesus was alive? Jesus' response to the two disciples sheds light on the answer to this question. The disciples were walking away because they did not believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. Later, however, their hearts were filled with the words from Jesus' own lips as he revealed the scriptures to them and their eyes were opened in the breaking of the bread.

Each time we gather to celebrate the Eucharist it is like the event in today's gospel. The scriptures are opened for us during the proclamation of the Word and in the breaking of the Bread of Life. The question is: Do we

really believe in what is happening when we celebrate the Mass? Our hearts can truly burn within us if we listen to the Word of God with discerning faith and Christ truly becomes present to us in the consecration and in the breaking of the bread. Jesus stunned the disciples two thousand years ago by his presence among them. This same Jesus can profoundly affect us if we open ourselves to him. His words still teach us how to live and the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist continues to be our food for the journey.

The reality of the resurrection can only impact us if we open ourselves to belief. The resurrection brings us transformation and hope. When we look deeply inside ourselves, we can ask God to transform what is dead within us. Resurrection reminds us that our destiny does not lie in death but in eternal life. This knowledge holds us accountable to the message of Jesus. We are challenged to be food for the hungry, friend of the poor, compassion to the sinner, and comfort to the most vulnerable of society. It is through acts such as these

that the risen Christ continues to bless the earth. At the end of the Emmaus story, the disciples returned to Jerusalem because they wanted to give witness to the Risen Jesus to the others who had stayed together. They are greeted with the news that Jesus had revealed himself to Simon, and then they shared their story. Each one of us encounters Jesus in unique ways. We recognize Jesus during the profound moments of our lives. We are challenged by the wisdom of Jesus Christ in the Scriptures and by the nourishment He gives us in the Holy Eucharist. Just like the disciples who returned to Jerusalem, we too are asked to share our experience of the Risen Lord with others.

## Prayer

In the breaking of the bread we know you Lord and we are fed. Instill in our hearts the flame of your love and your truth. Without you, Lord, we are empty vessels – fill us with wisdom and walk with us on the road of life. Amen.



## **A Note About Sacramental Preparation**




