



Emergency Roof Repairs Commence: Skylight and Cross Removal

Thanks to the tremendous gifts of our Parish Family, we have been able to move forward on the essential repairs of our church and other buildings. While we have experienced several delays already due to Collier County permitting requirements, we have started

two of the most important tasks this week. We have ordered the two new Air Conditioning units for the church, which were completely destroyed in the storm. These main units cover half the church, and the strain on the other two units has been intense, as you may have experienced last weekend. The new systems will take several weeks to arrive and install, so I thank you for your patience, even if it does mean we all get a little warm while in church.

The main effort we commenced this week is the repair and eventual replacement of the church roof. Were you aware there is a skylight above the altar? When the church was first built, this skylight allowed natural light to flow down onto the altar. However, over decades of exposure to the sunlight and sea-salt air, that skylight had deteriorated to the point that no light could be seen. Hurricane Irma, with its sheer force, pulled up the tiles and roof materials on that top corner of the roof and cracked the skylight in several places, allowing water into our

Sanctuary. While we had emergency repairs completed on the roof itself almost immediately, our roofing partner, Crowther Roofing, determined that the skylight was a total loss, to include the cross that sat upon it. All of it must be removed for the safety of all our Parish Family, especially our clergy and members of our ministries that serve on the altar every day. That effort was accomplished this week, with a temporary roofing system being installed until the full roof replacement can be completed this summer.

#ToKnow, #ToServe - Interfaith **Engagement is More Than Tolerance**

As we prepare to celebrate the coming of Jesus to the world through the season of Advent, it was such a powerful moment of unity and community that Our Holy Father chose to travel to Bangladesh to discuss how we, as part of the human family, should respect and engage all people of good will:

In Bangladesh, where the right to religious freedom is a founding principle, this commitment stands as a subtle yet firm rebuke to those who would seek to foment division, hatred and violence in the name of religion.

It is a particularly gratifying sign of our times that believers and all people of good will feel increasingly called to cooperate in shaping a culture of encounter, dialogue and cooperation in the service of our human family. This entails more than mere tolerance. It challenges us to reach out to others in mutual trust and understanding, and so to build a unity that sees diversity not as a threat, but as a potential source of enrichment and growth. It challenges us

to cultivate an openness of heart that views others as an avenue, not a barrier.

Allow me to explore with you briefly some essential features of this "openness of heart" that is the condition for a culture of encounter.

First, it is a door. It is not an abstract theory but a lived experience. It enables us to embark on a dialogue of life, not a mere exchange

of ideas. It calls for good will and acceptance, yet it is not to be confused with indifference or reticence in expressing our most deeply held convictions. To engage fruitfully with another means sharing our distinct religious and cultural identity, but always with humility, honesty and respect.

Openness of heart is also like a ladder that reaches up to the Absolute. By recalling this transcendent dimension of our activity, we realize the need for our hearts to be purified, so that we can see all things in their truest perspective. As with each step our vision becomes clearer, we receive the strength to persevere in the effort to understand and value others and their point of view. In this way, we will find the wisdom and strength needed to extend the hand of friendship to all.

Openness of heart is likewise a path that leads to the pursuit of goodness, justice and solidarity. It leads to seeking the good of our neighbours. In his letter to the Christians in Rome, Saint Paul urged his hearers: "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good" (Rom 12:21). This is

a sentiment that all of us can echo. Religious concern for the welfare of our neighbour, streaming from an open heart, flows outward like a vast river, to quench the dry and parched wastelands of hatred, corruption, poverty and violence that so damage human lives, tear families apart, and disfigure the gift of creation...

A spirit of openness, acceptance and cooperation between believers does not simply contribute to a culture of harmony and peace; it is its beating heart. How much our world needs this heart to beat strongly, to counter the virus of political corruption, destructive religious ideologies, and the temptation to turn a blind eye to the needs of the poor, refugees, persecuted minorities, and those who are most vulnerable. How much, too, is such openness needed in


order to reach out to the many people in our world, especially the young, who at times feel alone and bewildered as they search for meaning in life!

Dear friends, I thank you for your efforts to promote the culture of encounter, and I pray that, by demonstrating the common commitment of believers to discerning the good and putting it into practice, they will help all

believers to grow in wisdom and holiness, and to cooperate in building an ever more humane, united and peaceful world. - Pope Francis 12/1/17 (http://w2.vatican.va/content/ francesco/en/speeches/2017/december/documents/papafrancesco_20171201_viaggioapostolico-bangladesh-pace. html)

This is why our Parish Family focuses so much effort on interfaith engagement, like the Catholic-Jewish Dialog, the Theological Center of Naples, and other connections with Faith Based Organizations. If there is one thing the Christmas star should be pointing us all towards, it is each other, cherishing each moment together, and encountering anyone who is hurting with our Catholic love, mercy, and healing.



A Time of Promise

f you were to ask yourself how best to prepare for Christmas during the season of Advent, the answer lies deep in the heart of today's readings. If we are to encounter the comfort and the tender compassion of God, we must listen to the voice of those who lead us and show the way. In today's first reading, Isaiah prophesies the coming of the shepherd who will gently carry his lambs in his bosom. The words of Isaiah bring comfort and assurance to the people of Israel who were living in captivity of Babylon. God wants his people to prepare themselves for the time of promise.

As we begin to journey through the gospel of Mark, we are reminded that John the Baptist prepares the way for Jesus and the promise that he will bring. John the Baptist proclaimed a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. He prepared the people for the coming of the people by proclaiming that someone was mightier than he, someone who would baptize with the Holy Spirit. As we continue our journey through Mark's gospel it becomes apparent that Jesus is that promise!

The reign of God that Jesus announced was the appointed time of promise. As we approach Christmas time, we are asked to remember the promise that continued after the manger in Bethlehem. From the moment of the annunciation to the Incarnation to the public life of Jesus, the promise of God unfolds.



We are invited to prayerfully contemplate what the coming of Jesus means to us during this Advent season. Jesus clearly showed us how to make straight the path of our lives so that we could journey toward the kingdom. Our baptism is a baptism with the Holy Spirit that constantly inspires us to live Jesus' way of life. The voice crying out in the wilderness remains constant for the world's renewal to prepare for the coming of Christ. The Church through its teachings is forever the prophetic voice in a world of sin.

During this season we are asked to discern what the coming of Jesus actually means to us. We must constantly be aware of the impact that the Incarnation has on our lives. The "Incarnation" means, "The Word became flesh." Two thousand years later we are challenged for the Word to become alive in us. In this way, we are shown that the

Word is still alive and active through the gift of the Church. It is through our compassion and concern that others encounter the Christ of Bethlehem today.

- 2. Name the paths that you chose to take which led you to God.
- 3. Consider the paths that you have taken that have led you away from God.
- 4. What is God teaching you through this gospel?
- 5. What paths are before you now?
- 6. What does it mean to journey into Christ?
- 7. Are you ready to make this important journey of the heart?
- 8. Where will the Advent Season lead you this year?
- 9. How will you prepare yourself to meet the Lord?
- 10. How does that impact your life today?

Come, Lord Jesus. Help us to make straight the path of our lives. Encourage us to bring the promise of your kingdom alive through our words and actions. May we be reflections of your divine love and inspire us with the gift of the Holy Spirit so that we can become closer to You. Amen.

Faith Formation & RCIA

SEVEN DEADLY SINS, SEVEN LIVELY VIRTUES,

a practical, modern-day look at sin and virtue!



Bishop Robert Barron's enlightening study on sin and virtue is based on Dante Alighieri's great poem *The Divine Comedy*. Dante created in The Divine Comedy a poem that is, at once, a great story of an epic journey through Hell, up Mount Purgatory, and into Heaven – as well as an exploration of the great truths concerning human nature, our relationship with God, and the soul's journey to happiness.

Dante is a master architect and constructs his poem in such a way that each image not only "works" to support the story, but also represents multiple layers of allegorical truth about the human condition and the ways of God.

Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice, and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness. For example,

- Envy, the daughter of pride, is described as pleasure in the sorrow of another and resentment over their happiness or success.
- Scripture tells us "Be angry but do not sin." This

- surprising advice from St. Paul points to the truth about anger: namely that it is a normal part of human existence and that it is only sinful when taken to excess.
- Avarice, St. Thomas tells us, is the immoderate or unreasonable desire for riches. It is not wrong to own property or make a profit. Sin only enters into the situation when we love these created things more that we love God or our neighbor.
- Lust, which our culture has long taught us to believe is the very worst sin, Dante regards as the lightest and least serious of the deadly sins. Why?

However, Bishop Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition, which are the "seven lively virtues." The seven lively virtues offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness.

The aim is to increase understanding, promote reflection, and encourage practical action.

This Lent join us for this five-week program

The first four 90-minute sessions will cover the seven deadly sins. Each session includes a video presentation by Bishop Barron and small group discussion.

The fifth session will address the Sacrament of Reconciliation, also known as Penance or Confession. Taken from the newly released program *The Bible and the Sacraments*, this lesson is based on the work of Dr. Scott Hahn and presented by popular speaker and author Matthew Leonard. It unveils the mystery of the sacraments, their foundation in Sacred Scripture, and their connection to the rites of the Catholic Church.

Take the journey from sin to sanctity this Lent.


