

#ToServe – Pope Francis Calls on All Catholics to Communicate Hope and Trust in the World

This world has gotten so angry and divisive, with groups of people verbally and physically attacking others. It saddens me as a member of the human race to see it occur online, in the public arena, and yes, even here at our Church. I daily pray and work for the love, mercy, respect, and joy that the Catholic Faith clearly showcases to the world. It can overcome the hatred and distrust that seems to be the cause of so much pain. We must put the good back into the world, and that starts with how we speak to people and engage in our moments of encounter. Smiling and holding a door open for someone. Asking your family members how their day was and listening to their stories. Even speaking kindly to someone who vehemently disagrees with you and even confronts you with maliciousness.

Our Holy Father made it clear last week just how we are to behave in the world as Catholics when it comes to communicating. January 24 was the fifty-first World Communications Day, and Pope Francis stated:

I wish to address this message to all those who, whether in their professional work or personal relationships, are like that mill, daily "grinding out" information with the aim of providing rich fare for those with whom they communicate. I would like to encourage everyone to engage in constructive forms of communication that reject prejudice towards others and foster a culture of encounter, helping all of us to view the world around us with realism and trust...

Confidence in the seed of God's Kingdom and in the mystery of Easter should also shape the way we communicate. This confidence enables us to carry out our work – in all the different ways that communication takes place nowadays – with the conviction that it is possible to recognize and highlight the good news present in every story and in the face of each person.

Those who, in faith, entrust themselves to the guidance of the Holy Spirit come to realize how God is present and at work in every moment of our lives and history, patiently bringing to pass a history of salvation. Hope is the thread with which this sacred history is woven, and its weaver is none other than the Holy Spirit, the Comforter. Hope is the humblest of virtues, for it remains hidden in the recesses of life; yet it is like the yeast that leavens all the dough. We nurture it by reading ever anew the Gospel, "reprinted" in so many editions in the lives of the saints who became icons of God's love in this world. Today too, the Spirit continues to sow in us a desire for the Kingdom, thanks to all those who, drawing inspiration from the Good News amid the dramatic


#ToKnow – New Prayer List Procedure: Consent Required



Let Your Light Shine

here is a very simple wisdom flowing through gospel today. Jesus reminds us that once we have grasped faith, it must be lived for all to see. Faith brings light into the world of darkness – it brings hope where there is despair. The gift of faith is the gift of a new life where we know that the God of life walks with us on this magnificent pilgrimage. Jesus is the ultimate model of faith. As Jesus grew through the years,

with the Father. In Jesus' ministry of compassion and concern for the lowly and oppressed, he demonstrates what it means to be a person of faith. The light illuminating from the message and example of Jesus is the light that he wants us to share with the world today. True faith calls us to conversion and to the revolution of love.

We often ask ourselves, "How on earth can I make a difference?" Through living our faith we can make a difference. Christianity is not meant to be a personal faith. Rather, the essence of the Christian life is to share our faith with others through our love and concern. Our small acts of charity do make a difference. The first reading of Isaiah eloquently defines what it means to be a witness to the light. In sharing our resources, sheltering the vulnerable, clothing the poor and not turning our back on one another, Isaiah points out that the light of our faith will

break forth like the dawn. Thousands of years after Isaiah's prophetic existence, we are also called to be prophetic in the world today. There are people living in the world today that are still hungry, homeless, naked and alone. There are many living in our land who live under the poverty line. Even in our local towns there are men and women who live in the woods. Our nursing homes are filled with the elderly who dwell in the darkness of loneliness and rejection. In other countries, especially in South America, the continents of Africa and Asia, thousands upon thousands go without food every day as a result of corrupt governments. These dark realities reveal real people who live in tragic circumstances. Such people are our brothers and sisters. We are called to be God's light to such as these least of Christ's dear ones. The moment we begin to inform ourselves about the needs of our society and of the world and seek justice is the very moment that we embrace the light and let it shine for all to see.

May we embrace the light of faith, hope, and love. Let us be salt of the earth bringing the taste of your truth to those around us. Help us to be bread for the hungry and protection to those who have no shelter. Lord, as we make our journey toward you, may each one of us know that we have made a difference. Amen.

Wisdom of the Fathers

"There is an urgent need, then, to see once again that faith is a light, for once the flame of faith dies out, all other lights begin to dim. The light of faith is unique, since it is capable of illuminating *every aspect* of human existence. A light this powerful cannot come from ourselves but from a more primordial source: in a word, it must come from God. Faith is born of an encounter with the living God who calls us and reveals

his love, a love which precedes us and upon which we can lean for security and for building our lives. Transformed by this love, we gain fresh vision, new eyes to see; we realize that it contains a great promise of fulfilment, and that a vision of the future opens up before us. Faith, received from God as a supernatural gift, becomes a light for our way, guiding our journey through time. On the one hand, it is a light coming from the past, the light of the foundational memory of the life of Jesus which revealed his perfectly trustworthy love, a love capable of triumphing over death. Yet since Christ has risen and draws us beyond death, faith is also a light coming from the future and opening before us vast horizons which guide us beyond our isolated selves towards the breadth of communion. We come to see that faith does not dwell in shadow and gloom; it is a light for our darkness. Dante, in the Divine Comedy, after professing his faith to Saint Peter, describes that light as a "spark, which then becomes a burning flame and like a heavenly star within me glimmers". 


Mark Your Calendar for the Next Movie for Adults on February 19 - Spotlight


