



#ToKnow – Safely Parking and Walking on Campuses

As more of our Parish Family return to the area, it has become clear that some may not be aware of the changes and improvements we have made to the campus in order to create a safer space for both pedestrians and vehicles. This past Summer and Fall, our Parish Family's patience was tested with the reengineering of the Front Parking Lot and Access Road to Naples Park Elementary School. As you may have seen, this renovation has significantly increased the total amount of parking spaces by over 40 as well as created a clean and efficient way to park near the church. Hurricane Irma also assisted us, as it decimated a significant number of mature trees on our campus, including large oaks within the parking areas. These new spots should allow for parking within the lined and available spots, rather than on the roadways, which block emergency vehicles and other Parish Family members from entering the campus safely. In particular, the widened Access Road between the school and our church is not to be used for parking at any time as it is the primary access by fire trucks and EMS ambulances when an emergency call comes from the church.



Additionally, a brand new paved sidewalk was created between the parking lot in front of the school that goes directly between that lot and our church. It is completely separate from the access road, on the other side of the tennis courts. This walkway creates a completely safe way for all of us to park at the school and walk to church without being hit by the car traffic that now travels easily on the

full two-lane Access Road. Please use this sidewalk if you decide to park on the school side of the fence.

These steps have been taken to keep you and our entire Parish Family safe. However, there is a small group of people that are disregarding these essential safety steps, endangering our Parish. In this year of Patience and Flexibility, it is important that we all work together to create the loving and embracing church we are supposed to represent to the world. That starts right here on the campus. Please ensure you choose a properly marked parking space when you arrive on campus. I understand that may mean you will have to park further away from the church. It may not be the most convenient to have to park in more distant locations like the school or our middle parking lot, but that additional walk could save someone's life.

I understand that some Parish Family members' frustration with leaving Mass may be influencing their attempts to park in these illegal locations. I have continuous communications with both the County Sheriff, who provides traffic management, and the Collier County Traffic Operations department in order to modify the traffic flow both at our exits and at the lights that impact the traffic flow on 111th Avenue North.

So, in an attempt to productively and positively implement a safe and joyous environment in our parking lots, I am authorizing our staff to place this Parish Mission message on the windshields of the cars illegally parked on our campus for the next two weekends. This will be a communication directly to those individuals, ensuring they understand that they are parked where it is a significant risk to the safety of our Parish Family. I am hopeful that with several weeks of this "gentle" communication, we will not have to take further action to protect and safeguard our Parish Family.

I thank all of you, who are in the vast majority, who understand this safety concern, and who do park in the proper locations and ensure we can all enjoy the love, mercy, and happiness that is the heart of our Catholic Faith.

A Divine Invitation

s we journey into Ordinary Time, we focus on the call of the first disciples. In today's gospel, John the Baptist points to Jesus as the Lamb of God. This revelation must have been intriguing to his disciples. Jesus asks these inquisitive men, "What are you looking for?" He knew they were searching for something in life — he sensed their intrigue and hunger. The disciples of the Baptist ask Jesus, "Where do you live?" In response Jesus invites them to "Come and see". Little did these men know how this invitation would change their lives. Filled with excitement, the disciples lead Jesus to Simon. Jesus

recognizes Simon's strength and tells him that he will be called Peter — the rock! From this moment on Jesus leads the disciples deeper into the heart of God's plan. It is interesting to note in the Gospel of John that the first thing Jesus says to his disciples is, "What are you looking for?" That is God's question to us today. The first disciples response is, "Where do you live?" That is is the ultimate question a discerning Christian must ask to discover God's presence in the midst of the world.

The other readings in today's liturgy also speak of the calling given to people through time. We hear of Samuel's call in the first reading and are reminded in Paul's letter to the Corinthians that we are called to be members of the body of Christ. God continues to issue the call to all of us. He calls us to know Him and respond to His call of love. If we are honest with ourselves, each of us hunger for God in our lives. This hunger leads us to look beyond the surface and search for meaning. The important questions to ask ourselves are, "What does God want from me? Where is God leading me?" The leaders of our Church constantly remind their people that faith is not an entirely personal thing. Our Catholic beliefs call for partnership in faith. We exist as a community and are asked to discern God's will together and help build the kingdom of God. The mission of the Church is evangelization. Every member of the Church is challenged to make Jesus known in their own

reality. Our baptism calls us to share in the priestly, prophetic, and kingly nature of Christ.

In concrete, answering Christ's call means that we engage ourselves in priestly charity. We are asked to sacrifice our time and treasure in response to the needs around us. In order to be prophetic in modern times, we have to discern God's will and see where He is present. We are reminded that we are the People of God and that our destiny is the kingdom of God. Our call therefore, can be found in a world of hunger — where people suffer every day for lack of food and shelter. It is found in the midst of conflict and division. We discover God's call in our relationships and within the burning questions of faith. God is to be found in all people and in every situation. We are challenged to be Jesus' disciples in the way that we respond to the invitation to "Come and See."



Prayer

Lord, may we dare to ask you where You are to be found in our lives. Give us the courage to answer Your call with confidence. As we discern your presence, may we find you in all people and all things. When faced with challenges, help us to recognize these challenges as opportunities for grace and let us listen to your language of love and transformation. May we always hunger for your call and bring the message of the gospel to the waiting world. Amen.

Do you know the 24 Gifts of the Holy Spirit that Scripture scholars have discovered in the Bible? Do you know your own unique set of Spiritual Gifts?

Spiritual Gifts (Charisms) are given to every believer by the Holy Spirit. The Bible tells us that we need to both know our Spiritual Gifts, and understand them, for the purpose of fulfilling our Baptismal Covenant with God as Spiritually Gifted Disciples.

"The Church is not democratic or autocratic, it's charismatic." – Bishop Robert Barron

At the Feast of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit empowered the very first believers, just as He does you and me. (John 18:25-27, Acts 2:1-17, 37-39). In what ways has the Holy Spirit empowered you? All adults (ages 18–100) are welcome.

Christian Meditation instruction and practice will begin on Friday, January 19 at 11:30 a.m. in the Seminar Room.



Over eight weeks this new program demonstrates how meditation can benefit your soul, by centering on God.

Scientific research documents that it also benefits your body, by reducing stress and blood pressure. New material is always being added every session for those who would like to repeat the series.

We end each class with a meditation experience. During the lecture and

discussion part of each class we will discuss consciousness (religion calls it Soul, and science calls it Mind). When we understand consciousness and how meditation can benefit us, we tend to be more serious about the work of meditation because meditation is work.

February 9 will be three weeks of Intermediate meditation, which will explore the evolution of consciousness every human experiences. March 2 begins two weeks of Advanced Meditation. These classes begin exploring the three faces of God and ramifications of the integral states of consciousness growth. We also explore the "connecting states" and the "being states" as exemplified in the gospels. Various deep imaging techniques are explored in the eight classes.


