



Safe Environment Training Will Be Held at St. John in August; Fingerprinting Must Be Completed First

As part of the Safe Environment Program, the Diocese of Venice requires that all employees, clergy and those volunteers who work with children and/or vulnerable adults be fingerprinted and trained in Safe Environment (SET). The SET class provides information about abuse and how to detect abuse, statistics and phone numbers for reporting abuse.

The SET class will be offered here at St. John on Thursday, August 10 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. and Saturday, August 12 from 9:30-11:30 a.m. Please call the Parish Office (239.566.8740) to register at least two days prior to the training date.

Participants should complete the fingerprinting and background check first, which includes fingerprinting for identity verification only.

Before visiting St. John (or another diocesan screening location) for fingerprinting, applicants must complete the registration form online at: http://www.dov.sofn.net. Follow the "Instructions for Fingerprinting" provided by the St. John

Parish Office. Registrants will need a photo identification (such as a driver's license), a major credit card and social security number.

After registration is complete, a receipt with a bar code will be issued. New applicants must present this receipt at St. John (or another diocesan screening location) in order to continue the process. Once you have the receipt and bar code, call the Parish Office to make an appointment for fingerprinting.

If you do not have access to a computer or require assistance in registering, staff and volunteers at the Parish Office will be happy to assist you during regular business hours.

Once the background check is completed, all participants must attend a one-time two-hour Safe Environment Training class, which is offered in various locations throughout the diocese throughout the year. Participants should sign up for the first available class once they have completed the background check.

#ToKnow, #ToLove, #ToServe – Convocation of Catholic Leaders Day 3: Work and Witness

After hearing the testimonials and description of how our

Catholic Church in the U.S. must be renewed with the zeal of intentional disciples, Day # of the Convocation of Catholic Leaders needed to delve into exactly HOW we take this to the streets as the Pope has asked us to. It was important to understand that this is not just a request for behavior modification.

It is a radical and complete change in how the church approaches every facet of its activities. No longer do we ask "How can we get people into the church?" but instead move ourselves out of our comfort and connect with people where they are, on the peripheries. And guess what? The peripheries of love and acceptance can be found right in our pews just as much as in the disenfranchised and disconnected.

Supreme Knight Carl
Anderson, the head of the
Knights of Columbus, spoke
about all the effort of the
Knights in going out to the
peripheries locally, nationally,
and internationally. He said
that our faith is not just some
set of readings and doctrine
that can be easily recited
and understood. It is a deep
and true relationship with

Jesus in a communal and fraternal love. That community is so important. If people do not feel included, loved, and accompanied on their life journey, they will not believe. And we cannot wait for perfect holiness to start this radical step. He concluded with Vince Lombardi's famous quote:

we will chase perfection, and we will chase it relentlessly, knowing all the while we can never attain it. But along the way, we shall catch excellence.

A panel of experts on the concepts of the peripheries of the church helped us understand that not only is every single person is part of a periphery of the church, but that we must be careful about the language of the periphery. There are some groups that can feel that their cultural struggles are not included

in the dialog when they are considered outsiders, including immigrants and refugees. Each group has a unique history and a context that language can and should be inclusive of. Archbishop Gomez of Los Angeles provided a national context to the peripheries and how

wide the chasm can be for some to find their faith and home in the Catholic Church. He said that peripheries is a unique concept from Pope Francis, since the word is not found in the Catechism or any teachings until Our Holy Father brought it to light. Peripheries can be geographical (rural, third world countries, etc.) or sociological (poor, neglected, homeless, prisoners, etc.). More often, however, they are existential, where people no longer think they have a purpose or meaning. People who think society does not value them. We must minister as a field hospital to all peripheries. He called for the Catholic Church to declare all of the United States a Mission Territory. Go out with love and caring to show God's love by our actions of support and accompaniment.







The Secrets of the Kingdom

hen we encounter the Christ of Scripture, we see veiled in flesh the divinity of God. Jesus seemed like any other man when viewed with the naked eye. Nevertheless, his listeners recognized who he was through the eyes of faith. Jesus is the embodiment of the wisdom of God. The words that flowed from Jesus' lips came from deep within our heavenly Father's heart. When listening to Jesus, the people were listening to God. Consequently, it is imperative that we pay close attention to Jesus' message.

Jesus of Nazareth used parables as a teaching method. Each parable contained a story or image with a religious or moral lesson. In today's gospel, Jesus provides us with three images to consider by way of parables. He reveals the teaching about the kingdom of heaven in all three.

Reflection Questions

- 1. Reflect on the three parables contained in the gospel reading and ask how each parable speaks to you.
- 2. What are the "weeds" that are preventing you from growing?
- 3. How are you being asked to tend to the harvest of the Lord?
- 4. In what ways are you preventing God's Word from being choked and destroyed?
- 5. Have you planted "seeds" to make the world a better place?
- 6. How are you using the gift of faith that has been entrusted and gifted to you?
- 7. How is Christ the leaven in your life?


The first parable speaks of a man who sowed good seed during the day (light) and the enemy sowing weeds while everyone was asleep at night (darkness). Jesus goes on to say that the harvesters could only safely remove the weeds at harvest time. Removing the weed beforehand could endanger the wheat. He is clearly telling us that it takes time to discern what is good and what is bad, and that eventually the time will come when they will be separated. The good will shine like the sun in the kingdom (salvation) and the bad be thrown into the furnace (destruction). The good news given to us today is that as a Church we have the time to grow and prove ourselves worthy disciples before God, producing fruit that will last.

The second image Jesus uses is that of the tiny mustard seed that grows into a large bush. We are entrusted with the Word of God in humble ways. It is in our small acts of charity and love that the greatness of God is revealed. All of us as individuals can make a difference in our world. We only have to look at recent examples of how one person can plant the seed and start a revolution of love and hope. Examples of this can be seen in the lives and actions of Mother Theresa of Calcutta, Pope John Paul II, Gandhi, Martin Luther King,



Jr., etc., etc. Each of these individuals felt a call deep within to go out and plant the seeds of change which would bring about a better world, one of care, understanding, and compassion. If we compare ourselves to these great giants who made such huge contributions, we might feel overwhelmed, but we must continually remember that we can make the world of difference to those around us when we plant even the smallest seeds of kindness and love.

The third image is that of a woman who mixed the yeast with the flour in order to see it rise. The yeast is to the flour what Christ is to us. The yeast helped the bread to rise. Christ offers us the Word of God and his very life so that we can rise with him to new life. Jesus is the yeast of God that makes our lives successful. We have to humbly accept this ingredient into our lives so that we can be transformed by the saving power of God!



Prayer

Lord, we realize that the kingdom is already here, but it has not yet been fully realized. It is waiting to become. You reveal the kingdom in the parables that you offer us so we can gradually embrace the fullness of your kingdom. Give to your Church the wisdom to discern your message just as you shared your wisdom with the disciples when you lived on this earth. Amen.

On the Parable of the Mustard Seed

"Who ever saw the mustard-plant, wayside weed or tended crop, grow tall as a shrub, let alone a tree, a tree full of shade and nests and songs? Acres of yellow, not a bird of the air in sight.

No, He who knew the west wind brings the rain, the south wind thunder, who walked the field-paths running His hand along wheat stems to glean those intimate milky kernels, good to break on the tongue,



Have you ever wanted to enliven the spirit of our youth with your knowledge and joy of our faith?

Have you aspired to strengthen the faith of others around you (and in doing so, may strengthen your own)?

Have you felt the Holy Spirit inside you, and wanted to share that joy and happiness?

If you have felt any yearning to engage your faith in a deeply engrossing and tangible way, becoming a Catechist may be just what you are looking for. The role of a Catechist is to teach the faith of the Catholic Church both by word and by example.
