Parking Lot Renovations Improve Access and Support Growth


There is no doubt that Saint John the Evangelist is growing. Our Parish registrations continue to increase and the requests for services, activities, and programs are year-round. One part of our campus has not changed to meet these needs: our parking lots. That is changing this summer, and we are looking forward to these improvements. We will be restructuring the front parking lot starting in about a month from now. The improvement of straight, full spots actually increases the total spots available in the front of the church by 40 spots, and includes more handicapped accessible locations. Additionally, our new exterior lighting system will be implemented in our front lot, transforming the dark, shadowy parking into a bright and safe place for your vehicle.

We have also completed a new agreement with Naples Park Elementary School, in which we will be expanding the service road between the school and our church, making a safe, two-way passage. There will be a pedestrian walkway directly between the school parking lot and our own, and completely separate from the roadway. This will provide a safe way to get between the parking areas without fear of being struck. We will be encouraging people to park in the school's parking spots rather than along the roadway, so they can take advantage of this protected walkway.

All of these improvements will assist with the growth of our Parish Family and help make your experience on our campus more delightful and enjoyable. However, it may require us to utilize the school entrance during the weeks of construction. We will post specific details on traffic pattern changes here in the bulletin, on our website, in our email communications, and even posting signs

on the roads to make it as easy as possible to get on and off campus. Thank you for your patience as we make this major changes to improve our joint space.

Criteria: Awarded to a Junior in the top 10% of their class and based on exceptional academic achievement with sincere concern for others and a responsible attitude in all endeavors.




St. John the Evangelist Men's Club Scholarship: Kali Rose, Katherine Standish and Nicholas Costantini




VFW, Cpl Stanley Lapinski Memorial Scholarshipt: Colton Rose

#ToLove – Reaching out to the "Others": CAO and Alpha

Sometimes it is easy for us as Catholics to retreat inward, to focus on our own community, church, and lives. The words "Those people" can sometimes be used to talk about people outside our faith, and since those words should never be used to describe anyone, regardless of race, creed, religion or nationality, it is important for us as Catholics to remain vigilant to include and welcome all those who grace our lives with their presence. One of the first things Pope Francis said when he began his papacy enforced this rule of inclusion:

The Lord created us in His image and likeness, and we are the image of the Lord, and He does good and all of us have this commandment at heart: do good and do not do evil. All of us. 'But, Father, this is not Catholic! He cannot do good.' Yes, he can. He must. Not can: must! Because he has this commandment within him. Instead, this 'closing off' that imagines that those outside, everyone, cannot do good is a wall that leads to war and also to what some people throughout history have conceived of: killing in the name of God. That we can kill in the name of God. And that, simply, is blasphemy. To say that you can kill in the name of God is blasphemy

Instead, the Lord has created us in His image and likeness, and has given us this commandment in the depths of our heart: do good and do not do evil.

The Lord has redeemed all of us, all of us, with the Blood of Christ: all of us, not just Catholics.
Everyone!
'Father, the atheists?' Even the atheists.
Everyone!
And this Blood makes us children

of God of the first class!

We are created children in the likeness of God and the Blood of Christ has redeemed us all! And we all have a duty to do good. And this commandment for everyone to do good, I think, is a beautiful path towards peace. If we, each doing our own part, if we do good to others, if we meet there, doing good, and we go slowly, gently, little by little, we will make that culture of encounter: we need that

We also need to assist those around us who do not have a deep and lasting connection to their faith. Not everyone is as blessed as we are to be part of such a loving, active, and engaged faith community. They can be our neighbors, our co-workers, our friends from the clubhouse or schoolhouse. It is our responsibility to help them in their life journey. It takes all of us to go out and talk to these people. Some people use the term "evangelize". I do not like that term at all. It has a



connotation that we are trying to bend others to our beliefs. No. We are "accompanying" our friends on their path. We are not imparting our own viewpoints or talking at them. We are listening. We are supporting. We are journeying with them and being there to listen and encourage. Our faith will be seen in those actions, and they will naturally gravitate to it and want it for themselves.

This summer, we are releasing two tools for you in your journey of accompaniment with your friends: Alpha and Catholic Adult Organization (CAO). Alpha is a seminar that deals with the big questions of life: "Why am I here?" "What is my purpose?" It is an incredibly approachable program that builds an understanding of faith that empowers people in their lives, along with an open forum for safe discussion and, of course, delicious food and drinks to create a social atmosphere. We will have two information sessions this coming Wednesday, and then it will be every Wednesday evening over the summer. It is focused for people with little or no faith enrichment in their lives, so if you know someone who could use a fun and empowering program that will help them reach out for faith, please bring them.

CAO is kicking into full steam this summer. From Zumba for wellness to our adult music and art classes, we want to provide opportunities for our Parish Family and their friends to enrich their lives here on our campus. 

The Gift of the Holy Spirit

oday we focus on the Third Person of the Trinity the Holy Spirit. In the Book of Genesis, we hear that the Spirit hovered over the waters of the deep at the beginning of creation, ushering in order and displacing chaos. This same Spirit descended upon the disciples bringing courage in the midst of fear. The chaos that surrounded the arrest and crucifixion of Jesus was pushed into the recesses of the Apostles' memory as they received new confidence and strength from

the Advocate. The Holy Spirit gives birth to the Church and ignites the early Christians with an energy that becomes explosive in giving witness to Jesus' message. The Spirit's presence so transformed the band of followers huddled in fear in the upper room, that they were confident enough to go out and boldly proclaim the risen Christ!

As we celebrate Pentecost Sunday we affirm

our belief in the transforming power of the Holy

Spirit who is with us today. Through the experiences of adversity and conflict we are called to invite the peace and calm of the Holy Spirit to take root in our lives. Many would suggest that we live in a world of chaos. Optimists would propose that the world is full of positive opportunities ready to be embraced. No matter how we view the world, the Holy Spirit dwelling within us and in the Church offers us a new way of looking at reality. The Spirit creates order in the midst of chaos and brings the seven gifts of

wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.

When conflict arises in our relationships we seek the wisdom of God and pray: Come, Holy Spirit, gift us with wisdom. In the midst of war and the news of young people losing their lives protecting our freedoms. we seek an understanding that will lead us to the goal of peace, and we pray: Come, Holy Spirit, gift us with understanding. When society lures us into the world of pluralism we seek the counsel of God and the truth that will set us free, and we pray: Come, Holy Spirit, gift us with counsel. When we incur insults by making a stand for what is right and give witness to the gospel, we pray: Come, Holy Spirit, gift us with fortitude. When our lives are not black and white, and we face difficult decisions, we pray: Come, Holy Spirit, gift us with your knowledge. In encountering your presence in worship and in the presence of others may we reverence You, and pray: Come, Holy Spirit, gift us with piety. Finally, as we contemplate the many wonders and gifts the world has to offer, may we reverence the Giver of the gifts, and pray: Come, Holy Spirit, gift us with the fear of the Lord. Amen!

Nearly 40,000 individuals in our Collier County community do not have consistent access to nutritious food. More than 60% of public school children in Collier County are eligible for or receive free or reduced-priced meals from their school because of their families' low income.

As Christian adults, we have a moral and legal responsibility and are entrusted by God with the spiritual, emotional and physical well-being of minors and vulnerable adults. The Coordinator will notify the Chancellor who will refer the matter to the Review Board for investigation. The Victim Assistance Coordinator, as the liaison between the diocese and the alleged victim, will focus energies on coordinating pastoral care for victims/survivors and will follow up with victims to ensure that they will receive appropriate care.
