





Life Center Construction Camera Now Live!

One of our concerns with the Life Center construction has been how to properly secure our site to ensure it is safe to continue with our Parish Mission while still allowing full visibility to showcase the progress of the new building to all those of us who have provided our prayers and our gifts to its success. There is an additional wrinkle for our Parish Family, with many of us traveling North or on vacations during the summer months. We do not want anyone to miss out on the transformation.

In order to meet both our safety plan and our communications strategy, we have implemented a powerful visual tool, the OxBlue Camera System. This camera is now positioned on our construction site and provides live pictures of all the action of the Life Center development. Additionally, it provides a time-lapse video on demand that will showcase exactly how far we have come. Not only do you get to see the building going up, but you can get live weather updates from the site as well.



The Spiritual Adoption Program is heading into the second month. Your commitment is to pray a short prayer daily through Christmas.

MONTH 2 - Developing Baby - "I'm dancing!"

Your spiritually adopted baby is making progress developing



all of her external features and internal organs. Her brain is functioning at 40 days. Her mother can hear her heartbeat now on an ultrasonic stethoscope. Babyteeth buds are present at 6 ½ weeks. The central nervous system is functioning and 40 muscle sets

begin their first exercises. From this moment, your spiritually adopted baby grows and refines her body. But everything she needs to survive after birth is already present by the end

of the eighth week. She is now called a "fetus" a Latin word meaning "little one". Ultrasound reveals that this little one can now spring, flip and jump – her first dance steps!

#ToLove – Supporting Our Parish Youth with Catholic Education

Can you believe it is the middle of May already? Many of the families of our parish are making academic decisions about the future of their children. Naples is blessed to have many excellent public schools, as well as great private options and home and cyber schooling. With all these choices, Catholic Education can sometimes be a secondary thought, or maybe not even on the radar. There are three Diocesan Catholic Schools in the local area: Saint Ann School (Pre-K to 8th grades), St. Elizabeth Seaton (K to 8th grades), and St. John Neumann High School. Additionally, Royal Palm Academy is a Diocesanapproved private school in the Catholic Tradition, which covers Pre-K through 8th Grade. Unlike many other locations in the country, where the Catholic Schools are not only the best academically, they are usually conveniently located, North Naples families have a difficult decision. For a vast number of our families, the Catholic Schools are not easy to reach, both physically and financially. However, this is an essential option for our Parish Family. St. John has been able to support the elementary, middle, and high schools in the area providing quality Catholic education steeped in the humanities and continuing the ethical responsibility that comes from a Catholic educational environment.

This past week, our Tuition Assistance Committee, made up of members of the Finance Council and Pastoral Stewardship Council, evaluated requests from families for assistance in their priority of Catholic Education. This evaluation is accomplished with a balanced set of criteria:

- Financial Need: Did you know it can cost over \$11,000 a year for a Catholic education in Naples? While this may be less than some of the other private schools, it can cause a significant financial concern for a family. There are families who are struggling to make ends meet without this burden and we take those needs into consideration.
- Active Participation in our Parish Family: I have made comments in the past about utilizing our offertory envelopes to illustrate your time at church. It does not have to have a single penny inside of it, but it helps us understand and appreciate the fact that you are coming to church. Other efforts, like participation in parish events and programs, like Faith Formation, youth activities like Lectors, Altar Servers, Youth Group, the Cub and Boy Scouts, are tremendous illustrations of that participation as well. We have some youth who volunteer at Guadalupe Social Services in the Soup Kitchen. Still others who teach Faith Formation. Adult participation is also key. We have opportunities like Vacation Bible School, the Knights of Columbus, and the Ladies of Charity as just a few volunteer opportunities. These services to our parish and the community are clear illustrations of the connection to

our faith, and we support those students and their families.

• Circumstances: Not all cases are clear cut, and as our Holy Father has asked of all churches, we need to respond to individual circumstances with pastoral care. A family may look like they have all the money in the world on paper, but there could be a recent illness or job loss. There may be other difficulties that call for our support, and we respond in every way possible. Fr. John will take meetings with those families privately and make the final decision on their needs and our support.

So, I just want to ensure all the parents and guardians of our Parish Family know about this opportunity for support if you make the decision to pursue Catholic education for your children. And for those of you whose children have grown, please know that your generosity for St. John are going to help form the future of our Catholic faith. In fact, a graduating Senior of Saint John Neumann High School recently sent a note of thanks for our Parish Family's support:

Dear Father John, Jean-Paul Boucher, and St. John the Evangelist Parish,

As I try to organize clusters of tangled words to form sentences that mirror the appreciation within my heart, I find every phrase an understatement that does not seem worthy enough to permanently fill this paper. Although my "thank you's may be shortcomings due to your generosity, I will do my best to explain just how much your support has enhanced my daily life and enriched my soul with God's grace.

I love God will all of my heart, and it has always been my passion to share this life changing love with the world. 



A Heart With No Worries and a House of Promise

s we continue our Easter journey and look forward to the event of Pentecost, we find the scholars of the Church redirecting us to the words of Jesus at the Last Supper. The words of comfort that Jesus of Nazareth gave to his disciples and the destiny that he promised have profound significance to post-resurrection believers. Jesus confronts his disciples with the reality of his departure — that is death. The heaviness in the air must have been incredible — fear takes over, dreams begin to fade, and promises take flight. The disciples left everything to follow Jesus and now he was going to leave them? Christ's news must have been devastating, leaving the disciples broken-hearted.

Hwever, Jesus reads his disciples' minds like a book. His response is not one of judgment or criticism,

but one of consolation and stability: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places." Even though Jesus stood on the edge of his own suffering and death, he offers God's consolation and a way forward to the people around him. Jesus wanted to reassure his disciples by telling them to rely on their faith. He reminded them that faith and trust in God would help them through the event of the cross. The experience of his resurrection a few days later proves this very point. Jesus shows that we can overcome death itself and the sting of death which is sin. By his rising from the dead and ascending to the Father, he shows us that there is a place for each one of us in the Father's house.

Speaking of reading minds, you are probably thinking, "If only faith were that easy!" If we are truthful with ourselves, we acknowledge that fear can be a dominant force in our lives. Human experience sometimes challenges our thought process or even the way in which we believe. The reality is that life is not always easy. Even our faith can be challenged by the pluralism that pervades our society and relativism that gnaws away at the Truth, all under the guise of reason. Human suffering can also erode the hope and strength that have been our rock. As we encounter these challenges to our lives and to our faith experience, the gospel reminds us of the importance of seeking the way, the truth, and the life, as Jesus taught us. Even in the turmoil of suffering when a spouse asks the difficult question of why their spouse should suffer, or when a child contemplates the loss of their mother, or a friend

tearfully watches another friend grow weak in illness, Christ continues to breathe his peace into their very hearts through the ministry and discipleship of the Church. He tells us not to have troubled hearts but to open ourselves to the promise of rising above suffering and death and finding our place in the Father's house.

Prayer

Bring your peace into our weary hearts, O Lord. Help us to embrace the way, the truth, and the life as you see fit, not as the world sees fit. Help us to live through the times of trial and suffering, reminding us of the beautiful resting place prepared by you, for us, in the Father's house. Amen.

Wisdom of the Fathers


"The Gospel of the day recounts Jesus saying to his disciples: "Do not let your hearts be troubled."

"These words of Jesus are really beautiful words. In a moment of farewell, Jesus speaks to his disciples, really from the heart. He knows that his disciples are sad, because they realize that things are not going well. He says: 'Do not let your hearts be troubled.' And he starts to talk like that, just like a friend, even with the attitude of a pastor. I say, the music in the words of Jesus is how the pastor should behave, like a shepherd with his sheep, right? '...Do not let your hearts be troubled. Have faith in God, in me.' And what does he start to talk about? About Heaven, about the definitive homeland. 'Have faith in me': I remain faithful, it is as if he said that, right? ... Like an engineer, like an architect He tells them what He will do: 'I am going to prepare a place, in my Father's house is my dwelling.' And Jesus goes to prepare a place for us."

"What is that place like? What does 'prepare a place' mean? Does it mean renting a room up there? 'Prepare a place' means preparing our ability to enjoy the chance — our chance — to see, to feel, to understand the beauty of what lies ahead, of that homeland towards which we walk."

"And all of Christian life is the work of Jesus, the Holy Spirit to prepare a place, prepare our eyes to be able to see... 'But, Father, I see fine! I don't need glasses!' But that's another type of vision... Think of those who are suffering from cataracts and have to undergo an operation to remove them: they can still see, but after surgery what do they all say? 'I never thought you could see so well without glasses!' Our eyes, the eyes of our soul they need, they have to be prepared to contemplate the

beautiful face of Jesus. Our hearing must be prepared in order to hear the beautiful things, the beautiful words. Above all our hearts must be prepared: prepared for love, to love more...

In our life's journey the Lord prepares our hearts "with trials, with consolations, with tribulations, with good things... The whole journey of life is a journey of preparation. Sometimes the Lord has to do it quickly, as he did with the good thief: he only had a few minutes to prepare him and he did it. But the normal run of things goes this way, no?: in preparing our heart, eyes, hearing to arrive in this homeland. Because that is our homeland. 'But, Father, I went to a philosopher and he told me that all these thoughts are an alienation, that we are alienated, that life is this, the concrete, and no one knows what's beyond...' Some think this is so ...but Jesus tells us that it is not so and says, 'Have faith in me'. This I tell you is the truth: I do not cheat, I do not deceive.

Preparing for heaven means beginning to greet him from afar. This is not alienation: this is the truth, this is allowing Jesus to prepare our hearts, our eyes for the beauty that is so great. It is the path of beauty and the path to the homeland."

Join us as we begin to explore the life and works of the great 20th Century Evangelist, G.K. CHESTERTON.

If you know Chesterton's writings, he needs no introduction. If you don't, this introduction by Dale Ahlquist, president of the American Chesterton Society, will give you a glimpse of what is in store for you as we gather to consider his writings.

"Chesterton was immensely prolific and wrote about everything: current culture (including our own, which he seems to have foreseen), politics, war, sex, art, literature, science, technology, philosophy, morality, history, theology, and more. He is nothing if not quotable:

The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting. It has been found difficult and left untried.

Men do not differ much about what things they will call evils; they differ enormously about what evils they will call excusable.

To have a right to do a thing is not at all the same as to be right in doing it.

The Bible tells us to love our neighbors, and also to love our enemies; probably because they are generally the same people.

Angels can fly because they take themselves lightly.

There are three main themes that consistently occur in his writing. The first is itself a Trinitarian combination of wonder, joy, and thankfulness.... The second main theme is freedom....as Christ said, 'the truth will make you free' (John 8:32)....the third main theme, which is the ultimate focus of Chesterton's writing: God. He saw everything as pointing to God."

We will begin by viewing, or reviewing,
Bishop Robert Barron's introduction to
Chesterton in his recently released series,
The Pivotal Players.

Subsequent weeks we will view and discuss episodes of the popular program, *The Apostle of Common Sense*, a television series on EWTN, in which Host Dale Ahlquist and actor Chuck Chalberg bring Chesterton's words to life. These programs are designed to help viewers discover and rediscover G.K. Chesterton, to be challenged by his ideas, to see the completeness of his thought, and to be treated to the joy and depth of his faith.

You are invited to come to as many sessions as you choose and as your schedule allows; just one, or once in a while, or all. But do join us because, "Chesterton is like fine wine or smooth scotch, and it is usually happier to 'drink' in good company, than to 'drink' alone."
