An Empty Tomb Full of Promise (John 20:1-9)

oday, we join countless people all across the world in proclaiming Jesus Is Risen! The remote cemetery of Jesus' burial has become the garden of promise, opening wide the door to the world's salvation. To the skeptic, the empty tomb could bring speculation, but to the believer, the void is filled with the endless possibilities that God had intended to bring to the world. Even Mary of Magdala thought at first there was a sinister plot in which Jesus' body had been stolen. Peter must have been completely startled to see his burial cloths discarded. His denial must have also preoccupied his mind as he wondered about what was going on. However, as soon as the beloved disciple sees the empty tomb, he remembers Jesus' words and believes that He Is Risen. Peter and Mary of Magdala did not yet understand the Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.

The first Easter represents Jesus' power over sin and death. The shadow of the cross is removed by the light from the towering Easter candle, reminding each one of us that Jesus is the Light of the world! We celebrate Easter every year to remind us that our lives do not end in death. The transforming power that enabled Jesus to rise is the same transformation that is offered to us today. As we experience loss after loss, the light from our Easter candle reminds us the road through death for our loved ones is illuminated by the light of Christ's resurrection, showing them to their final dwelling.

As communities gather to celebrate the resurrection of the Lord, they gather as a changed community. Babies will experience their first Easter this year whilst others will occupy the seat of the Church, mourning the loss of a loved one who celebrated the paschal feast last year. However,

Easter reminds us that such people are still with us in the communion of saints that gather around the altar every time we offer the sacrifice. How is this possible? It is all possible because of Jesus' resurrection.

The resurrection represents a promise for each one of us. One day people will mourn our loss just as people mourned over Jesus' death. We will be laid to rest just as Jesus was. However, we will share in the new life that Jesus experienced as he arose from the dead - that is God's promise to us. Until that moment, we are called to live as Jesus lived. We are invited to share in his divine life by loving one another with unconditional love, helping the poor, and living our lives with the compassion of Jesus. In order to be people of the resurrection, we have to put into practice the things that we preach. Our acts of love, kindness, and selfless giving, are the acts that open wide the gates of eternity to each one of us. Such is the gift of resurrection!

We pray: Lord of all life, be with us this day. Cast your shining light upon a world in need of your love. May our light shine as your light shines through all of time. As we remember the ones who have journeyed through death before us, we kindly ask that you bring them to the resurrection. Amen!

May God continue to bless you throughout the Easter Season.

Statement Regarding "Catholics for Choice"

Despite that we are heading into the holiest week in the Church's calendar, it is important to address an issue of immediate concern. In our diocese, it is sad to say, there is an attempt to distort Catholic teaching to advance a particular agenda that is offensive to Catholics and likeminded people of good will. So-called "Catholics for Choice" seeks to mislead the public by displaying advertisements about an upcoming workshop.

The workshop, which is scheduled to be held in Collier County, purports to do the impossible—to bridge the gap between the Catholic teaching that all human life is sacred and worthy of protection, and the notion that abortion, the deliberate killing of unwanted human life, "can be a moral choice," as the group states.

The Catholic Church is unquestionably clear in Her teaching that, "direct abortion, that is, abortion willed as an end or as a means, always constitutes a grave moral disorder, since it is the deliberate killing of an innocent human being. This doctrine is based upon the natural law and upon the written Word of God, is transmitted by the Church's Tradition and taught by the ordinary and universal Magisterium (*Evangelium Vitae*, § 62)."

While praying for the unborn children who are killed through abortion, the Church also prays for and reaches out to women who have had abortions.

It is hoped that families impacted by the scourge of abortion may receive the healing they need. For this reason the Diocese of Venice supports an after birth home for mothers and their children, and a post-abortion healing outreach and helpline.

It is our prayer that the members of this organization reconcile their position with that of the Catholic Church, rather than promote a belief contrary to the Faith they claim to profess.

This statement is made for the sake of clarity and honesty in understanding the teachings of the Catholic Church.

They earned numerous merit badges including motorboating, swimming, canoeing, American heritage and first aid.





Centering Prayer - a Method of Silent Prayer

Centering Prayer is a method of silent prayer that prepares us to receive the gift of contemplative prayer, prayer in which we experience God's presence within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself. This method of prayer is both a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship. Centering Prayer is not meant to replace other kinds of prayer. Rather, it adds depth of meaning to all prayer and facilitates the movement into a receptive prayer of resting in God. Centering Prayer emphasizes prayer as a personal relationship with God and as a movement beyond conversation with Christ to communion with Him. The source of Centering Prayer, as in all methods leading to contemplative prayer, is the presence of the Indwelling Trinity within us.

When we learn to enjoy and trust the presence of God, we will naturally turn to that presence in prayer.
