

SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Getting #ToKnow Our Parish Grounds: Adoration Chapel Open 24 Hours a Day for Worship with the Blessed Sacrament

For many of our Parish Family, the church is the singular part of our campus they interact with, aside from the parking lots and walkways. We are much more than the church, which will always be the core of our community and our faith. As part of our continuing illustration of St. John as an enlivening, inviting place for our parish and our community, I



wanted to showcase some lesserknown areas of our facilities and grounds.

Hopefully, you will get a chance to visit them the next time you come.

It is a small, unassuming glass door on the church, tucked away

from the front entrance, and very few people walk past it since it is not in the main traffic areas to and from the church main doors. It is completely different than the rest of the doors into our church, with a small keypad on the right of the handle. Within that door is a small room, our Adoration Chapel. With the flick of a pulley, our parishioners have access to pray, reflect, and worship before a monstrance containing

the consecrated host, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Several parishioners have asked me for details on how they could have specific opportunities for devotion, as well as for perpetual adoration. My answer to them is we have a quiet, contemplative space for the beautiful prayers and faithful worship that defines us a Catholics. If you have not visited this spiritual oasis, please call or come to the office and we can give you the access code. With the Feast of Corpus Christi coming up next week, this is a wonderful time to help all of our Parish Family members find an opportunity to spend time with the Blessed Sacrament in a way that fits our individual schedules.

church. New ducts have been installed, ensuring that the airflow in those areas is appropriate and will cool properly. A new ceiling has been installed in the Cry Room as well, completing the renovation for that room, which has been a floor-to-ceiling update, creating more seating space for families who desire to be at Mass but have children that need a little more space to move around and make noise. The Cry Room is not a "VIP" room, but a joyous and open space for our youngest parishioners and



guests and their families to participate in our faith.







A Boundless Love (Matthew 28:16-20)

he discerning student of the Sacred Scriptures realizes that divine revelation contained within the biblical texts is all about the right relationship. From the beginning of time until present day, God has continually revealed himself to the world and invites us into a relationship with Him. The model of the right relationship that God gives us is to be found in the Trinity. As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we are reminded of the boundless generosity of God. God is to be found in the gift of Creation. The Father makes himself known to humanity and desires to enter into covenant with us. As humanity strived to know God, sin entered into the equation and broke the covenant. Man's inhumanity to man separated him from God. The Father in heaven does not give up on His desire for the relationship and so gives of Himself by offering us the Son. Jesus restores this lost innocence by sacrificing himself for our sins and gives us an everlasting covenant in his blood. When Jesus returns to the kingdom from which he came, he bestows the gift of the Holy Spirit upon the Church, to continue his saving work.

The generous self-giving nature of God is still with us today. Every time we gather for worship,



name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Jesus in the great commissioning of Matthew's gospel gives the disciples the task of making his presence known through their teaching. faced with different situations. We are reminded through the proclamation of the gospel that one day we will stand before the Father in heaven to give a full account of life. The Most Holy Trinity teaches us how we can give of ourselves. God's love for us knows no bounds. Likewise, our love for God should know no bounds ~ neither should our love for one another. The nature of the Trinity is a positive encouragement for those who are married. Each person of the Trinity complements the other. The function of each person of the Trinity is different, yet points to the same nature of God. In marriage, couples are called to become one and complement one another through the gift they

have to offer. People who live in the single state or lead a life of ministry can also draw strength from the selfless giving nature of the Trinity. As we all strive to know God in our given vocation, let us remind ourselves that God is to be experienced in many varied ways!

Wisdom of the Fathers

On this Sunday that follows Pentecost, we are celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Thanks to the Holy Spirit, who helps us understand Jesus' words and guides us to the whole truth (*cf. Jn 14: 26; 16: 13*), believers can experience, so to speak, the intimacy of God himself, discovering that he is not infinite solitude but communion of light and love, life given and received in an eternal dialogue between the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit - Lover, Loved and Love, to echo St Augustine...

...Those who encounter Christ and enter into a friendly relationship with him welcome into their hearts Trinitarian Communion itself, in accordance with Jesus' promise to his disciples: "If a man loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him" (*Jn 14: 23*)...

...All beings are ordered to a dynamic harmony that we can similarly call "love". But only in the human person, who is free and can reason, does this dynamism become spiritual, does it become responsible love, in response to God and to one's neighbor through a sincere gift of self. It is in this love that human beings find their truth and happiness...

...Among the different analogies of the ineffable mystery of the Triune God that believers are able to discern, I would like to cite that of the family. It is called to be a community of love and life where differences must contribute to forming a "parable of communion".

A Note About Sacramental Preparation

The Diocese of Venice requires that students must attend a minimum of two consecutive years of Faith Formation to receive First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation. Students must be at least 7 years old by September 30, 2015, and in the 2nd grade to be eligible to receive the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Students are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the end of 10th grade. They must be at least 15 years old.

Because of the increased number of children preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion beyond 2nd grade, we have added preparation classes on Sunday mornings so that these children can enjoy to the fullest, their Faith Formation classes without being "pulled out" for instruction. We will have a special teacher for them on Sundays from 9:00 -9:30 a.m. It is our hope that this format will allow children preparing for the sacraments to make the most of this special time. This additional class time is for children in YEAR 2 of their preparation only. YEAR 1 students need only attend Faith Formation classes with their grade level. Their catechist will be made aware that they are in Year 1 of their preparation for instruction purposes.




