Summer of Ultimate Flexibility



We have had a record-breaking and breath-taking season as a Parish Family. Even in the midst of our recovery from one of the worst natural disasters to hit our campus with Hurricane Irma, we still had over 5000

people attend our 9:00 a.m. and 11:15 a.m. Easter Masses alone. With the largest youth Faith Formation program in memory, new softball league teams for adults, 45 truckloads of urgent food and supplies delivered after the storm, and the continuous positive liturgical environment which enlivens the faith in our souls each and every week, we have so much to be thankful for. Things are not going to be slowing down for Saint John, however. We are about to embark on the largest and most complex transformations of our environment, and it will require the support, flexibility, and engagement of our entire Parish Family.



Our church was hit incredibly hard by the hurricane. Many of you have seen the stories of our church roof damage, and how the water came in, wreaking havoc on every part of the building. Those of you who have been

attempting to open the doors and finding them warped and cracking have felt the frustration of waiting for our repairs to begin. That time is nearly upon us. With the Ballroom almost complete, we will be closing the church building so we can perform the necessary and essential repairs and renewal needed. That does not in any way mean we will not have a church. We will be going back to our roots as a Parish Family. We will hold our Masses in another building, the Parish Activity Center Ballroom. This renovated space

will be turned into our church until the church building is completely restored to its beautiful and engaging self again. Daily Masses, funerals, weekend Masses, and all services will stay exactly on schedule and will be held in the Ballroom. Confessions will be heard. Baptisms will be performed. The only two differences will be the closure of our 24-hour Adoration Chapel and the Divine Gift Boutique, both of which will reopen once the church building is complete. We will continue as a Parish Family to find joy, peace, communion, and hospitality through our worship space of the Ballroom.

As if the major effort of restoring the church building was not enough this summer, we have an unplanned situation of the loss of air conditioning within the Claussen Center. The units that were installed as part of the construction of this building have lived beyond their life-cycle, and they had been planned to be replaced as part of the Capital Campaign. However, what was not planned was the entire infrastructure of the units (which sit outside the building in the middle of the back parking lot) must also be completely replaced. These pipes will need to be laid underground, and it will take a significant amount of time to get those systems in place. In the meantime, all activities and programs that operate within that building will either be suspended or moved to the Parish Activity Center for the duration of the construction efforts.

And, to add one final wrinkle to our campus, the Life Center and back parking lot construction will be completed this summer. We will



have a brand-new facility, along with the new and renewed programs of Catholic Youth Organization and Catholic Adult Organization. These programs will launch during the end of the summer and into the Fall. You will always want to check out the CYO and CAO pages of the bulletin to catch up on the latest information about those programs to see if something like our bocce league or painting classes or open gym nights would be interesting to you and your friends.

I am certainly looking forward to the Life Center's opening this summer, and celebrating the entire campus' renewal with our Parish Family and the entire community in January. While it is going to take a massive effort to accomplish all this work, it is going to be one heck of a party once it is completed! I thank each and every one of you for your support, flexibility, and patience during this massive undertaking. God Bless our Parish!

vine it will do one of two things: It will die or grow out of control, bearing no fruit at all. A good vine needs much attention. The vine grower has to be committed to enabling the vine to bear fruit. It is vital that parts of the vine be taken away so that it can reach its full potential of bearing fruit. A successful vine can be determined by the care and pruning that takes place each year.

Jesus tells us that He is the true vine. If we remain in His love and keep His commandments, we will produce the fruits of His love. We are part of the story that leads others to God. Jesus invites us to be part of His message by being part of His Church here on earth. Sometimes it is necessary to prune away the things that prevent us from reaching our full potential in our faith life. Once we commit ourselves to remaining close to Christ and his message, it is then we become His disciples and bear fruit. In order to become a disciple we must take as a model the person of Christ and fashion our lives around His message. The example of the gospel is the ultimate guide for the discerning Christian. Our sentiments can only be good if we consult the wisdom of Christ in our everyday concerns. Such wisdom helps us to peel around the layers of

contradiction that obscure God's vision for us and the world. We do this by simply turning away from the contradictions and constantly being open to conversion every day. If we place Christ as the source of our lives, we will grow in His wisdom and truth and reflect that to those around us.

Our Church, in her wisdom, fashions herself after Jesus Christ. Every time we gather to worship, we gather in the name of Christ Himself and listen to His Word as if for the first time. The will of the Father and the healing of Christ can be discovered through the proclamation of the Word. As we gather around the altar, the priest reflects the action of the High Priest, that is, Christ himself, as he relives the last supper, Calvary, and the resurrection. It is here that Christ nourishes us with his body and blood. The cup that we take comes forth from the vine itself that is ready to give us life, for the vine is Christ. We are a

Eucharistic people. Even though there are many branches to the vine, there is only one vine and one grower. There are many people who make up the Church; each of us has a distinct part to play in the history of salvation. Even though there are many members, we pray that we become "One Body, one Spirit in Christ." Together we bear the fruit that will last.

First Communicants Banners and Blessing Cups to Be Blessed at Special Teaching Mass with Fr. Paul

We are so grateful that Fr. Paul will celebrate a special Teaching Mass for all families on Thursday, May 3rd, at 5:30 p.m. During the Mass, he will take time to explain significant parts of the Mass to the children and their families, with the hopes of making the Mass even more meaningful to all. This is especially great timing and part of the curriculum for the families of those children receiving First Holy Communion this year. During this special liturgy, Fr. Paul will bless all of the First Communion Banners and Blessing cups.

The Tradition of the Blessing Cups at St. John

To mark this exciting time of preparation for First Holy Communion, children have an opportunity to paint a blessing cup with their families. The tradition of making blessing cups at St. John is one that finds its origins in Jewish family life, where the cup is a central symbol that brings blessing. It is a tradition that the young children at St. John's really look forward to! Each child makes their own ceramic cup that is fired in a kiln and glazed so that the kids can actually use them at home during special celebrations. The children paint Eucharistic symbols on their cups that may include a cross, a chalice, a host, a dove, grapes, and bread. Each child receives a book with suggested prayers and meditations

for use with the Blessing Cup. Sometimes the cup is used at different celebrations such as birthdays, anniversaries, liturgical seasons, holy days, births, and deaths in the family, as well as other key events in the family's life. There are so many ways to use the blessing cups, but mostly it is about unity and togetherness in the family.

Just as we share the Eucharistic meal together at Mass with the community, the blessing cup draws us in to that same closeness within our families around the table at home. While many families, might admit that they may not use the blessing cup as often as they had hoped, most agree that they love having the cups in a special location in their home that remind them how each of their children have continued in the faith. A few of our Confirmation Students have said that they will likely bring out their blessing cups as they celebrate their Confirmation, having made the cups at St. John some eight years ago.

We would like to thank one of our very own parishioners, Susan Whitney, and her team from Creative Pottery, for their support in coordinating the efforts to make this all happen, with approximately 100 blessing cups! Creative Pottery is located in The Promenade in Bonita Springs with studio hours form 10:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m. daily and 12:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. on Sundays.
