Gospel Reflections

Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

I would like to thank all of you for your kind and warm welcome last weekend. I am truly looking forward to serving you as your pastor.

Today's Gospel deals with a very important subject – the exercise of authority. People seek authority for different reasons. Some people like the power that goes with it; it makes them feel important. Others like the prestige it brings. Others like the higher salary. All these reasons have one thing in common – authority is seen as an opportunity to promote oneself.

Jean Vanier (founder of L'Arche) distinguishes two kinds of authority: an authority which imposes, dominates, and controls; and an authority which accompanies, listens, liberates, empowers, gives people confidence in themselves, and calls them to be aware of their responsibilities.

There is even a third kind of authority, silent, loving, and hidden – the authority of powerless love, which waits, builds trust, and sometimes watches night and day in anguish. Parents have sometimes to wait and watch their children who have gone astray, hoping that they will come back.

Some people have a lust for power and use their authority to dominate others. This is an abuse of authority. The lust for power is rooted not in strength but in weakness. Only the weak measure their worth by whom they can dominate.

When James and John asked Jesus if they could have the top places in His kingdom, they were thinking only of themselves. They did not mind how much envy and resentment they aroused in their companions. They obviously thought that His kingdom was modeled on worldly kingdoms. Those in high places would enjoy honor, glory, and power. But Jesus told them that it wasn't like that at all. In His kingdom, the greatest would be those who were willing to serve others rather than serve themselves.

Jesus first outlined the accepted standard of civil authority: domination, with rulers lording it over their subjects. But this is not how it must be in His community. He saw authority as an opportunity to serve. As always, He set the example Himself. He did not lord it over people. He appealed, He invited, but He left the response to them. He would lead, but He would not control. His authority mirrored that of God. God uses His power not to control but to enable.

This is how He wanted authority to be exercised in His community. Authority should not be given to those who seek it, but only to those who have proved that they are willing to serve. Those entrusted with power over their fellow human beings ought to be caring, just, merciful, wise, tolerant, and lenient.

In order to serve, one has to be ready to drink the cup that Jesus drank – the cup of sacrifice and suffering.

It has been a little while since I have been able to discuss some of the more banal details of our Parish Family, from the campus changes to our CFA Goal to a super-secret surprise that has been a question from nearly everyone. Here we go:

Memorial Garden is Complete

We have officially filled our beautiful Memorial Garden this past week with the last plots being sold by our Bookkeeper, Karen Beebe. The only spots that are still available are specifically reserved for our Knights of Columbus members and their families. Taking care of our loved ones' final resting place is one of the most sacred responsibilities we have as a Parish Family, and with the addition of several mature Oak trees to provide the shade we have been missing since Hurricane Irma, we will be able to ensure its beauty and its safety for perpetuity.

New Pedestrian Access to the Ballroom for Mass (and a preview of the Life Center)

We have completed a brand-new component of our campus, a fully pedestrian-friendly walkway from the Back Parking Lot that leads to all the various buildings, including directly into our temporary worship space. If you are sitting in the Ballroom right now, if you look to your left (unless you happen to be a priest or Lector on the Altar), you will see two sets of double doors. Those doors lead to this stone walkway that is an easy way to travel from the parking in the back of the campus. Along your walk, you will get to peek at the Pulte Family Life Center, so the next time you drive onto campus, please go ahead and park in this newly redesigned lot so you can easily walk to Mass.

Reminder of Parking Regulations

are parking illegally, either in the fire lanes around the entrances to the Parish Activity Center, or in travel lanes. These locations must be kept open and clear so that emergency vehicles can access our facilities effectively. Please consider the fact that someone could have a heart attack or heat exhaustion and may require emergency services, so where you park does matter. There is plenty of parking around our campus and everyone should also respect our signage for priority parking for handicapped individuals. Please help us with the safety and respect of all members of our Parish Family.

There are so many events planned for Saint John the Evangelist coming up soon, but where will we be hosting these programs and activities? Well, we are very proud to be able to announce that the Pulte Family Life Center will be opening for Father Bob's 25th Anniversary of Ordination on October 28. Saint John the Evangelist has assumed the primary role for every facet of Thanksgiving in the Park, so there are opportunities to assist for every member of our Parish Family all week long. Here are some of our needs:

- Saturday, November 17, and Sunday, November 18: Bring Your Turkey to Church Weekend – Please bring a pre-cooked, frozen turkey to Mass over this weekend. You can purchase these pre-cooked, frozen turkeys at Walmart and Publix, where you can get them at the Deli Counter or in the frozen food area. We need at least 100 turkeys this year to feed everyone in need. We cannot take raw uncooked or frozen turkeys since we do not have the facilities to defrost and then cook dozens of turkeys. We need them pre-cooked professionally to ensure the turkeys are fully cooked, which is why we request the turkeys to be purchased as pre-cooked and frozen. We will also collect store-bought pies.
- Wednesday, November 21: Turkey Shredding and Packing Day – We will have two-hour shifts from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the Rome Room for volunteers to shred the turkeys we have received. Please bring your own kitchen

knives and utensils to cut up the turkeys. There is work for all ages, including packing the turkey and other items, helping move the heavy turkeys around to get them shredded, and making pictures for the decorations for the park.

- Thursday, November 22: Serving Thanksgiving Lunch – We will be out at the Immokalee Airport Park starting at 8:30 a.m. to setup both the park and the food service. Volunteers are needed to get the food warmed up and ready for the 11:00 a.m. start. Once the meal is concluded, we will need further assistance in cleaning and packing the materials back up to come to St. John.
- Friday, November 23: Clean-Up Morning – We will use our industrial kitchen's dishwasher and sinks to clean all the pots, pans, and other materials from the park. We will begin around 9:00 a.m.





