Catholic Faith Appeal: What is It and How Does It Impact the Community?

It has been quite a long time here at Saint John since we discussed the Catholic Faith Appeal (CFA), the Diocese of Venice annual assessment of all parishes that assists with many programs here in Southwest Florida. While we have been focused this past year on recovering from Hurricane Irma, finalizing a spectacular Capital Campaign that allowed us to open our Pulte Family Life Center this past week, renewing every square inch of our campus, and continuing to give directly to those in need in our area, we cannot forget our responsibility to the Diocese. From the Catholic Charities support for Golden Gate Senior Citizens and Immokalee Migrant Workers, to the Seminarian programs, the CFA is an essential program that we must focus our gifts to in any way we can.

It has come to my attention that many of our Parish Family members may not understand the CFA and what it is for. It is not a "tax" of 26% on our church. The CFA is a Diocesan contribution in which all the members of the churches in Southwest Florida work together to support the central services we all rely on as Catholics and active community members. There are several essential efforts that rely on the CFA:

- **Catholic Charities:** As a leading provider of social services, Catholic Charities supports over 40,000 people with programs like direct assistance to pay their utility bills, emergency intake programs for those that have become homeless, ending human trafficking in our backyard, citizenship assistance, and veteran housing.
- **Catholic Schools:** It costs a tremendous amount to provide a high-quality education, and the CFA supports the Catholic Schools in the area to ensure all members of our community can have access to this faith-based education system through high school
- **Vocations:** From the Seminarian programs that instruct our future priests and deacons to providing support for the 35 different women's religious orders and 26

different communities of brothers and priests within the Diocese, the CFA ensures we provide for the education and well-being for those who have dedicated their lives in service to us and our faith.

One component of the CFA that is not discussed frequently, however, is the set of programs that the CFA supports for our Parish Family. Below are a few of the initiatives that we could not accomplish here at St. John without the CFA:

- **Marriage Preparation:** All the Diocese marriage programs needed to be married at Saint John the Evangelist are funded completely through the CFA. If a Parish Family member is going to be married here, they have the ability to be prepared at St. John for their future together.
- **Religious Education:** The Diocese supports our youth and our adult Faith Formation programs with materials, schedules, and additional catechesis opportunities. The CFA supports the certification of our catechists and the development of the schedules for Confirmation.
- **Good Works:** From the 40 Days for Life to Immigration Support for our Parishioners, the CFA provides resources for the good works of the parish. We give so others can have a better life, from picking themselves up with our direct support to supporting social justice initiatives.

Every year, the Diocese of Venice places a goal for each parish to provide a certain amount towards an overall need of the Diocese. It is true that St. John has been one of the primary supporters of the CFA, and in fact we have normally been one of the largest contributor parishes. For 2018, we have been asked to contribute \$521,000, the third highest in the Diocese. We have understandably been focused on our Capital Campaign and the complete restoration and renewal of our campus. However, that has made it difficult for us to reach our CFA goal, and we currently stand at \$270,409.11, less than 52%. That is a large gap, and it will require the parish to direct our resources from operational efforts and potentially savings to cover the shortfall.

If you have any end-of-the-year giving you are planning to provide to our Parish Family, I would request that you prayerfully consider providing that stewardship to the Catholic Faith Appeal in Saint John the Evangelist's name. Thank you all for your continued support and engagement in our church!

During the past year, your generosity as a Parish family has helped us to serve our community with "home visits" to over 100 families having financial difficulty due to unforeseen circumstances and in time of true need. It represented over \$55,000 in financial assistance toward rent, utilities, and other miscellaneous necessities such as uniforms for poorer school children and Publix cards to the homeless and needy families. Your acts of kindness enabled us to support the SVDP Naples Council programs of our community Food Pantry and Meals on Wheels program, as well as clothing and home goods for those in need. Additional acts of Catholic love were committed on your behalf to help those effected by earthquakes and hurricanes here in the USA and worldwide, and the ongoing financial backing of a local vegetable garden in a rural and poor community in Georgia. Support to these programs, and ultimately the poor themselves, amounted to another \$50,000 (plus). And we can and need to do so much more.

It is my great pleasure, and I see it as my Catholic responsibility to show my love for the poor, and I am humbled to be the current President of our Parish conference for SVDP in finding

my way to Christ through service to the poor. I also have the joy of working with the amazing people who selflessly give of themselves to make up our conference in spirituality and friendship. We are always looking to welcome new members and are in particular need of people who speak Spanish. It is very true to say that you will feel you have received more blessings than you were able to give. "There is so much sorrow, and the world can do so much more..."

In closing, thank you in advance for supporting our upcoming activities to help the poor in our community. Also know that the "poor boxes" in church are dedicated to support our ministry throughout the year, so please always look to donate when you can. I wish to take this opportunity to say welcome to Father Tom and that all of us at SVDP SJE are so grateful to have him as part of our Parish family, and we are looking forward to working together in our Catholic commitment to help the poor.

Please mark down these important dates:

- November 10 and 11: SVDP members are outside each Mass handing out grocery bags for our SVDP Community Food Pantry
- November 17 and 18, and Thanksgiving Day, November 22: Collecting the filled bags with food for the poor and needy. Please be generous, no person or family should have to go hungry. Cash and checks are always welcome.
- THANKSGIVING DAY – Collection Baskets for SVDP: Our goal is \$15,000. We hope, on behalf of all those in the community who will be served, that you are able to be as generous as you possibly can, and I thank you for all your love and support with your cash donations throughout the years that has enabled us to do so much good in our community. Please know your commitment to those in need is recognized during each home visit we, Vincentians, make via a prayer for our parish family and your loving generosity.

We are simply unable to Know, to Love, and to Serve God as a Catholic community without your generosity and our Catholic faith. So during Thanksgiving, I again say thank you. There's so much to be thankful for.






