





## Second Collection Next Weekend, Dec 1-2, 2018, to Benefit Jamaica Outreach

Next weekend, Dec. 1-2, we will have Bishop Burchell McPherson (Bishop of Montego Bay, Jamaica) celebrating selected Masses at St. John's. Jamaica Outreach Program (JOP) has been supported by the parish family for over 21 years, and Bishop Burchell was one of the original founders. Some of the programs your donations fund in the inner city and remote rural areas of Bishop Burchell's diocese include: the Love in Action Soup Kitchen managed by Korean missionary sisters in Montego Bay (see photo), Good Shepherd Medical Clinic, St. Mary's Pre-School, and an Education/Scholarship Fund.

JOP donors also support many other programs including the "JOP/Cataract" program started by Dr. Jeffrey Zimm, (parishioner) who has teamed up with Dr. McIntosh of Jamaica, to provide quality eye surgery to the impoverished people of Kingston, Jamaica. 
