Church Reopens on June 29!

Join us for the first Mass back in the church, and celebrate its completion

It is hard to believe that nearly one year ago, our Parish Family was moved out of our Sanctuary. There were significant concerns that the structural ceiling above our heads was damaged by Hurricane Irma beyond saving. The pews were warped from the water that seeped into the building. The carpet was ruined. The organ pit had flooded. Rain had driven deep into the air conditioning duct work and throughout the building. While we had cleaned it and stabilized it enough to utilize the building through the 2017-2018 season, we had to open it up as soon as possible to find out just how bad and how deep the damage really was.

We were blessed to find only about 10% of the ceiling required repair, but the extensive and pervasive damage throughout the building needed to be addressed. Since we were opening up nearly every wall of the church already, requiring a significant displacement of our Parish Family, it was determined that we should take this opportunity to renovate and renew the facility at the same time as repairing the issues from the hurricane. It has been a long road of recovery for the building, and we thank our partners, Gates Construction, Studio + Architects, Baker Liturgical, the Diocese Building Office, and Collier County for assisting us in this journey.

Please join us on Saturday, June 29, at 3:00 p.m., for the official reopening of our new church. Bishop Dewane will be dedicating and consecrating our new Altar, and we will have tours prior to the Mass for those interested in learning about the changes.

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

It's impossible to live the life of a Christian without the help of the Holy Spirit. But to appreciate the role of the Spirit in the life of a Christian, we have to start with Jesus, Himself. Even Jesus needed the Spirit. The Spirit had a big role to play in His life. The Spirit descended on Him at His baptism, revealing Him as the Father's beloved Son.


At His baptism, He also received power from on high for the mission He was about to begin. The Spirit was not just given for a moment; the Spirit remained with Him throughout His public ministry. Jesus was continually led, strengthened and guided by the Spirit.

He began His ministry by making His own the lovely words of Isaiah: "The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favor."

What a beautiful mission. And how faithful He was to it. Jesus was filled with the Spirit, and power went out from Him through His gracious words and compassionate deeds.

It was the Spirit who opened the minds of His disciples and helped them to understand the meaning of His death. When He was raised up to glory at the right hand of the Father, Jesus poured out the Spirit on those who were to carry on his mission. The Holy Spirit descended on the apostles, individually and collectively. Filled with the Holy Spirit, they began their mission. And we see the great courage and confidence with which they did so.

And the same Spirit descends on us at our Baptism and Confirmation. The Spirit is not given for a moment but accompanies us on our journey in the footsteps of Jesus. The Spirit gives us power to participate in the work of Jesus. The Holy Spirit is our strength in times of weakness, our guide in times of doubt, our consoler in times of sadness, our advocate who always pleads our cause. We can't take even one step without the Spirit. The gifts of the Spirit are: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. Wisdom, understanding, and counsel (right judgment) guide our mind and assist our conscience in knowing right from



St. Paul talks about the fruits of the Spirit (Gal 5:22). The Spirit brings love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These are beautiful things, and make life joyful.

The coming of the Spirit provided the apostles with the energy, the courage, and the love to get on with the task Christ had given them. The Holy Spirit will do that for us if we invite Him.
