Parish Financials

Financial and Organizational Details of Our Parish Family



As we discussed last week, the Financial environment of Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church is an interesting and ever-evolving effort to ensure the maximum resources we have as a Parish Family can be effectively and efficiently targeted at our Mission: **To Know, To Love, and To Serve God in His Church and Our Community.** While numbers can sometimes seem dry and stale, when you think about the people behind the gifts, you, the person sitting next to you in the pew, and the entirety of our Family and Friends, it is astounding just how much positive change we are creating in the world.

Last week, we illustrated the concept that our finances fall into two major categories, Standard (salaries for the staff and clergy, operating the facilities, and running the core functions of the Parish like Faith Formation, the Liturgical and Music efforts, and Pastoral Programs like JOP), and Other (Ministry programs, Catholic Youth Organization, Catholic Adult Organization, the Memorial Garden, and Gift Boutique). We want to be as transparent as possible to showcase exactly how Saint John operates to serve you and the community. For example, here are the income and expenses of our Parish Family for the week of January 12, 2020:

January 12 – 18, 2020	Standard	Other
Income	\$ 57,648.01	\$ 8,971.51
Expenses	\$ 49,640.99	\$ 8,319.48
Benefit to Parish	\$ 8,007.02	\$ 652.03

Standard Income is the wonderful gifts of our Parish Family, along with additional revenue that comes from facilities rentals and Faith Formation Programs, to name a few items. Other Income may be from ticket sales to dances, Life Center memberships, and purchases at the Gift Boutique. As you can see, while we seem to be in a good position with this simple week snapshot, it may be misleading. We may have an event like the Polish Dinner Dance that could have gathered a substantial amount of Other Income during this week, but the Other Expense of such an event will not occur until this weekend. We will showcase several different methods to provide these details to you in an understandable way in the next several weeks.

2019 CFA Goal Exceeded!

It has happened yet again! Our Parish Family has not only achieved our annual Catholic Faith Appeal, we have exceeded it! As of today, the most recent report from the Diocese of Venice has stated that we have \$580,632.60 of our \$575,000 goal, 100.98%. That is stupendous! We will be focusing our 2020 CFA effort next month with our Car Raffle and Commitment Weekend. We want to grow the percentage of our Parish Family that contributes to the CFA, which for 2019 was 26.1%. For the first time ever, the Saint John the Evangelist Goal has been reduced year-over-year, so we know we can do it! More information will be coming next month.

Please join us today after Mass for a discussion with the leadership of our Parish Family about Finish the Church. We have been describing for the past several weeks the herculean effort we have undertaken to repair and renew Saint John with the joint challenges of a Capital Campaign and a massive Hurricane. Learn where we have been and where we are all going together. Saturday's discussions will be held in the Alexandria Room in the Claussen Center while Sunday's discussions will be held in the Ballroom and Rome in the Parish Activity Center. Our Finish the Church gifts on 1/12/2020 were \$12,173.05, bringing our total gathered so far to \$693,203.23.

Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Matthew compares the arrival of Jesus on the scene to the coming of a great light to a people who had been living in deep darkness. He saw Jesus as fulfilling the great prophecy of Isaiah: "The people that lived in darkness have seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned."

Mother Teresa gives us a beautiful example of a man who was brought out of darkness into the light. One day in Melbourne, Australia, she visited a poor man whom nobody knew existed. The room in which he was living was in a terrible state of untidiness and neglect. There was no light in the room. The man hardly ever opened the blinds. He did not have a friend in the world.

She started to clean and tidy the room. At first he protested, saying, "Leave it alone. It's all right as it is." But she went ahead anyway. Under a pile of rubbish, she found a beautiful oil lamp, but it was covered with dust. She cleaned and polished it. Then she asked him, "How come you never light the lamp?"

"Why should I light it?" he replied. "No one ever comes to see me. I never see anybody."

"Will you promise to light it if one of my sisters comes to see you?" "Yes," he replied. "If I hear a human voice, I'll light the lamp."


Two of Mother Teresa's nuns began to visit him on a regular basis.

Things gradually improved for him. Then one day he said to the nuns, "Sisters, I'll be able to manage on my own from now on. But do me a favor. Tell that first sister who came to see me that the light she lit in my life is still burning."

At first, he didn't like the light. He felt threatened by it. It made him uncomfortable. Why? Because it showed the misery in which he was living; first of all the physical misery, then the misery of spirit. But gradually he came to see it as a friend, which comforted him and brought hope into his dark existence. Thus he slowly turned his life around. The light had saved him. Of course, it wasn't the lamp itself that had done this, but the kindness and goodness it symbolized, first in Mother Teresa, then in her Sisters.

In order to appreciate a light, one must be conscious of one's darkness, and have a desire to escape from it. One must realize one's need to change and want to change. Before people seek redemption, things must go badly for them. They must have experienced the darkness of sorrow and disappointment. Then they are ripe for the light of salvation.

This is why Jesus began His preaching with the message: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand." To repent is to admit the darkness in which we are living and to open ourselves to the light. We show our repentance by a new way of living. To be saved is to have come out of darkness into the light.



Each of us has areas of darkness in our lives – fear, illness, pain, sin, guilt, loneliness, and so on. Society, too, has its dark areas, hence our need of the light of Christ. Though the light comes as a friend, it also disturbs because it shows what is wrong.

There still are many people who live in darkness and in the shadow of death. We need the light of Jesus now more than ever. Fortunately, the lamp Jesus lit continues to burn, a glowing goodness that illuminates the world. It burns in the lives of many of His followers like you. The light of Jesus did not come to judge us, but to save us, to show us how to live, to show us the way to the Father's Kingdom. Consider lighting a lamp for someone who is in a dark place.

New Church Survival Guide: Special Needs Support Increased

With so many changes to our Church Building, we thought it would be helpful to our Parish Family to provide some suggestions and guidance on how to enjoy this faith-enriching environment. This "Survival Guide" will take many forms, from this column to a consolidated pamphlet and even walking tours of the church to help us all Finish the Church. Please join us in embracing these wonderful changes and prayerfully consider any support you can provide to complete this campaign.

When the leadership of the Parish Family determined to seize the opportunity to completely transform our church, one essential design element was prioritized: accessibility. We wanted to ensure any and every member of our Family, as well as our wonderful guests, could participate fully in the beauty of our faith, and in particular, the Mass. Every decision was calculated to see if we could improve the building, making it easier to access for all ages and all special needs, from physical impairments, to audio/sensory support, to cognitive services. Some of these changes manifested themselves in the building itself. Here are a few changes to the exterior that can assist you in coming to Saint John for Mass:

Increase in Handicap Parking

We have removed the priest/deacon spots in the front-left parking lot immediately connected to the church and posted signage for these spots to be 24/7 handicap parking only. This lot will also be completely redesigned in the next few months,

increasing the amount of handicap spots and allowing us to move the expectant mother and Driving Ministry spots to that lot. This will make finding a spot much easier for those with handicap placards.



New Handicap Door Openers at Middle Lot Entrance

The Middle Parking Lot of our church has a substantial amount of handicap parking signs, as well as the expanded sized spots specifically for large vehicles for wheelchair transportation. There is now an automatic door opener on the door that leads from that lot into the Sanctuary, making it very easy for those with physical needs to be able to enter our church and find their seats. We plan to add another automatic door opener to the entrance near the new front lot described above when we finish that construction as well. All the infrastructure has been installed already.


