Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Jesus said to his disciples, "You are the salt of the earth; you are the light of the world." In the ancient world, salt was one of the most important necessities of life, especially for preserving and seasoning food. So, too, was light for obvious reasons. Both are still vitally important today. What was Jesus saying when He used these two images? He was telling His disciples that they have a vital role to play in the world through their good deeds.

When religious practice is divorced from life, a vital element is missing. It is like salt that has lost its taste, or a lamp that no longer gives light. But when religious practice leads to deeds, a very effective witness is given.


One day, a man visited Mother Teresa's home for the poor and the dying in Calcutta. He arrived just as the Sisters were bringing in some of the dying off the streets. They had picked up a man out of the gutter, and he was covered with dirt and sores. Without knowing that she was being watched, one of the Sisters began to care for the dying man. The visitor kept watching the Sister as she worked. He saw how tenderly she cared for her patient. He noticed how as she washed the man she smiled at him. She did not miss a detail in her attentive care for that dying man.

After carefully watching the Sister, the visitor turned to Mother Teresa and said, "When I came here today I didn't believe in God, and my heart was full of hate. But now I am leaving here believing in God. I have seen the love of God in action. Through the hands of that Sister, through her tenderness, through her gestures, which were so full of love for that wretched man, I have seen God's love descend upon him. Now I believe."

This is surely an example of the kind of thing Jesus had in mind. When He tells us that we must let our light shine, the light He is talking about is the light of our good deeds, especially our deeds of love. People take notice of good deeds. Our good deeds don't have to be as spectacular as the above example. Generally they will be much simpler, much more ordinary. But that doesn't mean they can't give effective witness to the light.

When Jesus tells us to let our light shine before people, he doesn't mean that we should advertise our good deeds, much less crow about them. He is asking us to do them. If we do them, they will speak for themselves.

A good life is a strong and effective witness, and in itself is a proclamation of the Gospel. The light will shine when one is a genuine person, when one sees that the truth is told, that justice is done, when one exercises mercy and shows compassion and love. In order to produce its effect, salt has to be mixed in with the food. And a light has to be put in a high place in order to be able to reach people. So we Christians have to be in the world. But we must not allow ourselves to be absorbed by the world. "The world today needs Christians who remain Christians" (Albert Camus).



As Christians, we have a very positive role to play in the world. We have something to offer, something the world desperately needs, even though it may not always welcome it. We should not be shy or apologetic about our role. A certain boldness and courage are called for.

The task is not one for the individual Christian only but for the Christian community as a whole. It is easier – and more effective – to witness to Christ as a member of a supportive community.

Saint John Financial Dashboard




We want to thank all of you who have provided feedback on these essential details of how our Parish Family gifts have made it possible to achieve our Mission: **To Know, To Love, and To Serve God in His Church and Our Community.** In response to many of your questions, we wanted to include our budget planning process to both our Income and Expense discussion.

Our Income is made up of three core areas. The Offertory, which includes the donations provided in the collection baskets, as well as our online giving program called WeShare, is the bulk of the funds provided to the Parish. Our Standard Income includes special gifts provided outside the Offertory, as well as the rental of our facilities, our Religious Education, and our Poor Box, which goes immediately to the direct support program of our Saint Vincent DePaul Ministry. Our Other Income is made up of the various Ministry activities, the Divine Gift Boutique, and our CYO and CAO Programs. This past week, the total of all three areas was \$87,884.59.

Our Expenses are made up of only two areas. Our Standard Expenses include the cost of the payroll and benefits of the clergy and staff, the operations of our facilities, and the services we provide on a pastoral basis, including our tuition assistance to the local Catholic Schools. The Other Expenses include Ministry Activities as well as the cost of the CYO and CAO Programs. This past week, our total expenses were \$61,824.41.

We are also now illustrating our weekly budget numbers that were developed a year ago for this past week to illustrate what we anticipated to both receive and utilize. As you can see, both the income and expense budgeted was below our actual resources. When we determined our income was substantially more than we planned, we were able to utilize those funds for our Parish Family, including resources for our Finish the Church efforts, which is considered part of our Standard Expenses.

We want to thank all of you for your continued support. In next week's bulletin, we hope to showcase to you the entire year to date set of details, to show you how both our income and expenses fluctuate over the year, requiring the surpluses of our season in order to complete our efforts over the summer months.

Safety and Welcome In Our New Church

It is a sad fact that our world is changing. The sanctity of a religious environment is no longer a place that can be assumed to be completely safe. Like our airports and schools, we need to ensure the safety of our Parish Family as well as the welcoming and engaging environment of the Catholic Church. It can be something of a dichotomy for our faith and our church: someone that may not look like they “fit in” or are “odd” may actually be the person most in need of our love, support, and encouragement. We must fight the trend of closing off and distrust, and instead extend the hand of welcome to those that come to our doors. Ushers have been undergoing Crowd Management Certification and Diocesan training to ensure the balance of these needs of our faith and our Parish Family’s safety.

The Arimathean Ministry

Before I moved to Naples twenty-five years ago, I volunteered at our local Hospice and received grief support training. Our founding Pastor, Father Tom Glackin, learned that I was the daughter of funeral directors and was familiar with death and the grief that follows. He encouraged me to develop a Bereavement Ministry for St. John's. I was already a member of the team of women who served lunch after a funeral. From that group I recruited Pam Giles and Rita Spagnola to help me in facilitating grief support sessions for our grieving parishioners.

While attending the diocesan training for grief support facilitators, I learned about a group called the ARIMATHEANS. These were men and women who attended funeral Masses to extend compassion and consolation to grieving families and friends. With Father Tom's permission, I started a parish Arimathean Ministry named after Joseph of Arimathea who offered his tomb for the burial of Jesus.

The blessings offered to those who become ARIMATHEANS are twofold: you receive the graces of attending Mass and of performing a Corporal Work of Mercy – by giving comfort to the bereaved.

There are no meetings or dues or monetary expenses. Seasonal residents are welcome. It is a wonderful ministry for couples. Come join us, and recruit a friend to come with you. Upcoming First Communicants Make Traditional Blessing Cups

Last Sunday, several of our upcoming First Communicants painted their blessing cups as part of a long standing tradition at St. John's. With the help of Susan Whitney and her team from Creative Pottery, children enjoyed making their cups alongside their parents and teachers. Children painted various Eucharistic symbols on their cups. The bottom of the cup will also have their name and date of First Communion. Once the cups are fired, they will be blessed and given to the children along with a book of prayer celebrations to enjoy with their families for years to come.

For some families here at St. John, the cup is a reminder of the special time of First Communion preparation. Families bring the cup out at special occasions like birthdays, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and at their child's celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation, as well as other milestones in their lives. The blessing cup has become a sign of togetherness and unity in the family. In some traditions, families pass the blessing cup and share a drink from it on special occasions, after reading a scripture passage or prayer. The tradition of passing the cup finds history in the Jewish custom that has been incorporated into our celebration of the Eucharist (www.autom.com). 

Ministry Spotlight

Dr. Susan Wilson Visits Saint John the Evangelist



Dr. Susan Wilson, an MD from Guernsey in the British Channel Islands, founded the Tumaini Fund in 2003 after she and her doctor husband, while taking a sabbatical working in a Mission Hospital in Kagera, Tanzania, became aware of the desperate condition facing the children of parents afflicted by the AIDS pandemic, which affected thousands of local woman in this remote region of the country in the late 1990s. "Tumaini" means Hope in Swahili, and it is the Tumaini Fund which brings hope to thousands of widows and orphans today.

With assistance provided by donors throughout the world, over the intervening years the Tumaini Fund has done wonders for the widows and orphans in Kagera. Dr. Wilson was awarded the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire (MBE) designation by Prince William in 2013 in recognition of her outstanding service to alleviate the suffering of so many people in Kagera.

The mission of the Tumaini Fund USA is to aid the estimated 200,000 impoverished AIDS widows and orphans in the Kagera region of northwest Tanzania to survive and become self-sufficient by helping them to meet their basis needs.


