Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

We have just begun Lent. And when we think of Lent, we think of penance. Most people undertake some penance for Lent. This is a good and worthwhile practice. However, penance is not an end in itself.

Once upon a time a very earnest young man visited a famous rabbi.

He told the rabbi that he wanted to become a rabbi and asked for his advice. It was winter time. The rabbi stood at the window looking out into the yard while the rabbinical candidate gave him a glowing account of his piety and learning.

The young man said, "You see, Rabbi, I always dress in spotless white like the sages of old. I never drink any alcoholic beverages; only water ever passes my lips. I perform numerous penances. For instance, I always carry sharp-edged nails inside my shoes to mortify me. Even in the coldest weather, I lie naked in the snow to punish my flesh. And to complete my penance, I take a dozen lashes every day on my bare back."

As the young man spoke, a stable boy led a white horse into the yard and took him to the water trough. The horse drank his fill of water, and having done so, rolled in the snow, as horses sometimes do.


"Just look!" cried the rabbi. "That animal, too, is dressed in white. It also drinks nothing but water, has nails in its shoes and rolls naked in the snow. Also, rest assured, it gets its daily ration of lashes on the rump from its master. Now, I ask you, is it a saint, or is it a horse?"

The point the rabbi was making was that penance is not an end in itself. What is the purpose of penance? It is not meant to undo the past but the past is done. Nor is it meant to persuade God to erase our sins and forgo the punishment we deserve for them.

The first thing we are doing when we undertake penance is acknowledging that we are sinners. The second thing we are doing is expressing the desire to change our lives. The whole object of penance is to reform a sinful way of life.

Penance is an exercise in saying "no" to ourselves. It is intended to show that we are capable of better things, and that we sincerely want those things. We want to reform our lives, but we know we cannot do so without the grace of God. Its purpose is to acquaint us with our better side "I'm not a bad person; I can do better." It means taking a step in the right direction.

When people prune a fruit tree, they are not doing it to punish the tree, but to make it more fruitful. So our penances have as their goal to lead us to a new and better life.




It is a lot easier to undertake penances, even severe ones, than to try to change sinful attitudes or habits. For our penance to bear fruit, it must result in a sincere effort to change our lives.

Lent provides us with a window of opportunity to look at ourselves to see how we can become better followers of Christ. The example of the sinless Jesus battling with Satan acts as a spur to us. The victorious One will help us to be victorious in our struggles with sin and evil.



New Church Survival Guide: Special Needs Support Increased

With so many changes to our Church Building, we thought it would be helpful to our Parish Family to provide some suggestions and guidance on how to enjoy this faith-enriching environment. This “Survival Guide” will take many forms, from this column to a consolidated pamphlet and even walking tours of the church to help us all **Finish the Church**. Please join us in embracing these wonderful changes and prayerfully consider any support you can provide to complete this campaign.

When the leadership of the Parish Family determined to seize the opportunity to completely transform our church, one essential design element was prioritized: accessibility. We wanted to ensure any and every member of our Family, as well as our wonderful guests, could participate fully in the beauty of our faith, and in particular, the Mass. Every decision was calculated to see if we could improve the building, making it easier to access for all ages and all special needs, from physical impairments, to audio/sensory support, to cognitive services. Some of these changes manifested themselves in the building itself. Here are a few changes to the exterior that can assist you in coming to Saint John for Mass:



New Handicap Door Openers at
Middle Lot Entrance



Increase in Handicap Parking

We have removed the priest/deacon spots in the front-left parking lot immediately connected to the church and posted signage for these spots to be 24/7 handicap parking only. This lot will also be completely redesigned in the next few months, increasing the amount of handicap spots and allowing us to move the expectant mother and Driving Ministry spots to that lot. This will make finding a spot much easier for those with handicap placards.

The Middle Parking Lot of our church has a substantial amount of handicap parking signs, as well as the expanded sized spots specifically for large vehicles for wheelchair transportation. There is now an automatic door opener on the door that leads from that lot into the Sanctuary, making it very easy for those with physical needs to be able to enter our church and find their seats. We plan to add another automatic door opener to the entrance near the new front lot described above when we finish that construction as well. All the infrastructure has been installed already.

Please respect our campus, as well as the facilities of our partners next door to us, Naples Park Elementary and Hodges Funeral Home. Unfortunately, we have had some complaints from them about our Parish Family moving their cones and parking in unauthorized areas. They could tow people who are parking on their campus if they deem the parking to be a risk to their safety and property. It may be a little longer of a walk, but we have parking by the Pulte Family Life Center, so if you are physically able to do so, please try to park further away from the church and take a leisurely stroll to your car after Mass, rather than rushing out of the parking lot.



PROMISE TO PROTECT





Adult Faith Formation

Lent and Lenten Practices Questions and Answers

Q. When you count all the days from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday, there are 46, so why do we say that there are forty days of Lent?

A. It might be more accurate to say that there is the "forty day fast within Lent." The Sundays of Lent are certainly part of the Time of Lent, but they are not prescribed days of fast and abstinence.

Q. So does that mean that when we give something up for Lent, we can have it on Sundays?

A. Catholics have traditionally chosen additional penitential practices for the whole Time of Lent. That being said, such practices are not regulated by the Church, but by individual conscience.

Q. I understand that Catholics ages 18 to 59 should fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, but what exactly are the rules for these fasts?

A. Fasting on these days means we can have only one full, meatless meal. Some food can be taken at the other regular mealtimes, if necessary, but combined, they should be less than a full meal. Liquids are allowed at any time, but no solid food should be consumed between meals. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Q. I understand that Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat, but I'm not sure what is classified as meat.

A. Moral theologians have traditionally taught that we should abstain from all animal-derived products (except foods such as gelatin, butter, cheese, and eggs, which do not have any meat taste). Fish are a different category of animal. Salt and freshwater species of fish and shellfish are permitted.


Q. I've noticed that restaurants and grocery stores advertise specials on expensive types of fish and seafood on Fridays during Lent. Some of my Catholic friends take advantage of these deals, but somehow, I don't feel right treating myself to the lobster special on Fridays during Lent.

A. While fish, lobster, and other shellfish are not considered meat and can be consumed on days of abstinence, indulging in the lavish buffet at your favorite seafood place sort of misses the point. Abstaining from meat and other indulgences during Lent is a penitential practice. On the Fridays of Lent, we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence and prayer.


