

Founding Pastor, Father Thomas Glackin, Has Passed Away at Age 81



It is with great sorrow that Saint John the Evangelist announces the passing of our beloved Founding Pastor, Father Thomas Glackin.

Fr. Glackin graduated from Manhattan Prep in New York City and entered Don Bosco Seminary in Newton, New Jersey. Ordained in Rome on December 1, 1968, he taught Math, Geometry, Physics, English, and General Science at Archbishop Shaw High School in New Orleans, where one of his students was awarded first place in a Geometry competition in 1968.

Various assignments saw Fr. Glackin serve in parishes in Tampa, Pine Island, and finally Naples, where he undertook the building of Saint John the Evangelist in 1988, saying Mass at Naples Park Elementary School for 600 worshippers. He has continued to serve our Parish Family over the decades, and we were blessed to have him here persistently for the last few years.

Visitation will be held on Tuesday, March 10, 2020, from 4:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. here at Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church. A Scripture Service will be begin at 7:00 p.m.

The Funeral Mass will be celebrated on Wednesday, March 11, 2020, at 10:30 a.m. here, as well. A reception will follow in our Parish Activity Center Ballroom.

Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

One theme runs through all three of today's readings. It is a very important and comforting theme. You could say that it is the heart of the Good News. That theme is: We are loved in our sins.

We see this in the First Reading: In spite of the ingratitude and grumblings of the people, God doesn't write off His people, but shows His love for them by providing water for them in the desert. The message is explicitly stated in the Second Reading: Paul says, "What proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners." And we see the message in action in the Gospel.

Jesus' approach to this outcast woman was ever so gentle. He didn't force himself into her life. Had he done so, she would have immediately closed up. There is a world of difference between asking people for the key to their house and battering the door down.

In fact, he began from a position of weakness. He began with a request for a drink of water. In this way, He disposed her to receive the gift He wanted to give her. His heart was already open to her. Now she opened her heart to Him. A wonderful dialogue ensued, and a marvelous exchange took place.

He treated her with great respect. Not a hint of judgment or condemnation. The holier a person is, the less He is inclined to judge others. Right from the start He was looking into her heart, yet He did not make her feel bad. She didn't feel judged. Rather, she felt accepted and understood.

No one ever paid such close and loving attention to her before. Jesus explained her life to her more sympathetically than she'd been able to explain it to herself. Before she realized it, she had shared with Him the whole story of her sad and confused life.

How could someone as pure as Jesus understand a woman like her? Kahlil Gibran says, "Only the pure of heart forgive the thirst that leads to dead waters."

Jesus was able to see into her secret being, into that part of her which longed for true love, which was pure and innocent, thirsting to be seen as a person and not as an object. She was a deeply wounded woman, wounded by a series of broken relationships, something that is becoming quite common today.

Christ meets us where we are. He says to us what He said to that lost woman: "If you only knew the gift God wants to give you."

We find it very difficult to admit our poverty, weakness, and sins. Hence, we are unable to receive the "gift of God" Jesus wishes to give us.



It doesn't do us much good to be loved for being perfect. We need to be accepted and loved precisely as sinners. Only the person who has experienced this kind of love can know what it is.

Being loved like that gives one surprising courage and energy. It puts us in touch with our true nature, and to touch our true nature is a kind of homecoming.

Finishing the Church: Progress Report

*We are blessed to be back in our church, again whole with our enlivening faith environment. It has taken tremendous effort to renew our church and our Parish Family. We are now nearing the completion of our church and the financial obligation that came along with this work. So, we have developed: **Finish the Church**, our final push of the Capital Campaign, to complete the transformation of the entire campus and ensure our success for the next 30 years. While we have come far already, we will all need to work together to complete our vision of the new Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church. Over the next few weeks, we want to give you an opportunity to learn where we stand, how we got here, and what we need to do as a Parish Family to **Finish the Church** together.*

Each of us has a responsibility to our Parish Family. We have been blessed with an abundance of support and encouragement for all the work it has taken to open our church back up after an entire year of construction and renovation. The results speak for themselves. You have seen the transformation for yourselves. The feedback has been overwhelmingly positive and effusive. I hope you feel at home and faithfully engaged no matter where in the church you are. Our Parish staff and clergy thank you for your patience as we continue to **Finish the Church** (even if that means tuning the Air Conditioning properly for Daily Mass).

The effort has not only been within the church building. Our Finance Council has been assisting us with finalizing all the complex facets of this project from a financial perspective. We have been meeting with our Self-Insurance adjusters literally since the day after Hurricane Irma through to this past week. We have attempted to ensure every item and claim is assessed and awarded to our Parish Family. That has included not only the major repairs to the church roof and the soaked pews, but all the way to restitution for duplicating Masses for all of last season, with the double cost of priests, musicians, and even overtime for our Facilities Staff. I used to joke that we were the only church in the area that literally had Jesus (the name of one of our Facilities Staff Members) tearing down the Temple and rebuilding it every three days. We have now completed that process as well. While we have been awarded a vast majority of the funds anticipated in those claims, there are still some components that the insurance provider did not allow. That has made our final tally on the Diocesan loan larger than we anticipated, but not outrageously so.

We have finally all agreed to these numbers, which illustrate the total effort to repair and renew the entire campus of Saint John, at over \$16.4 million dollars. By now, most of you reading this have seen the transformation of our campus for yourselves. If you were here during last Season, you may recall that we were able to accommodate our Parish Family in multiple locations across the buildings while we completed the church you are sitting in now. In doing so, you may have been introduced to rooms you may have not seen before, like our Ballroom, or the new Gym. We hope you enjoy those locations for our Parish activities and events going forward, like our CYO Basketball, concerts, dances, and so much more.

As we have been discussing, this all played out for us during a Capital Campaign and a Hurricane. These challenges also allowed us to accomplish something we had never dreamed: a far deeper transformation of Saint John the Evangelist. Over 85% of our campus has undergone massive repairs and renewal in the past two years. This has been expansive and extensive, with every building and room receiving some renovation effort. The hurricane damage exposed the opportunity to address added renovations, previously planned for the future, in a very cost-effective way. In fact, the Parish Family Leadership took this opportunity to complete a major portion of our Five-Year Capital Plan all within this span, and much more, bringing the entire renovation to over \$16.4 million.

All this effort, however, did require additional investments that were over and above the \$11 million gathered in our Capital Campaign. While the insurance did defray a component of this cost, the overall \$16.4 million in construction on our campus in the last two years has left us with about \$2 million left to fund. The Diocese has graciously assisted us in this effort and has



allowed us to fundraise without impacting our CFA Assessment for the remainder of this shortfall. It is now up to us again, as we have done in the past, to rally together to **Finish the Church**.

The outpouring of support so far for this final leg of our campaign has already provided over \$685,000! That is tremendous, and has already allowed us to pay down this loan to just over \$1.3 million in the span of less than six months. We thank all of you who have already given so generously to help us **Finish the Church**. If you have not yet given, we ask that you prayerfully consider a gift. Any amount would be helpful. Father Tom communicated that if every family of our Parish gave \$456, we would complete the loan. That can be a difficult commitment for many of our Parish Family, and for others, it is not much at all. Adult Faith Formation

Our Catechumens and Candidates on Their Journey to the Easter Vigil



The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is a process for those who wish to become Catholic. Since the fall of 2019, these adults have been preparing for their full initiation in the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil on April 11.

The First Sunday of Lent began the final stage of their journey. At the 9:00 a.m. Mass, the Catechumens and Candidates were presented to our pastor, Father Tom Zalewski, and the entire parish family. Father Tom presided at a Rite of Sending in which candidates' sponsors testified to their preparation and readiness.

That afternoon, they were presented to the Bishop at the Diocesan Cathedral of the Epiphany in Venice. All parishes in the Diocese of Venice who are preparing their candidates for full initiation were present. This ceremony is known as the Rite of Election and Call to

Continuing Conversion.

Bishop Frank Dewane greeted the Catechumens who expressed their desire to enter fully into the life of the Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. Their names were placed in the Book of the Elect. Through this rite with the Bishop, these Catechumens are now called the "Elect."

Candidates, who have been previously baptized, celebrated the Call to Continuing Conversion. They asked to participate fully in the sacramental life of the Catholic Church. As a reminder of their Baptism, the Bishop invited them to come forward and make the sign of the cross with holy water to signify their intention to complete their Sacraments of Initiation.

This year was also special because parishioners whose first language is Spanish were included. Luz Lozano of our Faith Formation team has been journeying with these Catechumens and Candidates to prepare them for the Easter Vigil.

Adults Who Have Not Been Confirmed



If you are an adult who was baptized Catholic, received your First Communion, and would like to receive Confirmation to complete your Sacraments of Initiation, here is your opportunity. It is never too late; our adult confirmandi have ranged in age from 18 to 80 and spanned three generations.

Adult Confirmation preparation will begin Sunday, March 22, at 6:00 p.m. This day and time were chosen to make it as convenient as possible, but if it doesn't work for you, alternative arrangements can be made.

Divine Mercy

Christ's "Apostle and Secretary" of His Divine Mercy



Saint Faustina was born as Helena Kowalska in Glogowiec, Poland, in 1905. She was the third of 10 children and attended school for less than three years. Subsequently, she worked as a housekeeper until 1925 when she joined the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy and took the name Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska. During her 13 years in the Congregation, she worked as a cook, gardener, and gatekeeper. While her life at first glance may seem uneventful or boring, she was endowed with many extraordinary graces: revelations, visions, and living contact with God, the Blessed Mother, angels, saints, and souls in purgatory. She was diagnosed with tuberculosis and died in 1938 at the age of 33. On April 30, 2000, Pope John Paul II announced, in Saint Peter's Square, that her beatification process was complete and declared her Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska.

Her mission was to act as Our Lord's "Secretary" by recording in a Diary all Jesus' wishes regarding His Divine Mercy and this message:


"In the Old Covenant I sent prophets wielding thunderbolts to My people. Today I am sending you with my mercy to the people of the whole world."

I do not want to punish mankind, but I desire to heal it, pressing it to My Merciful Heart through three actions:

1. Remind the world of the truth of our faith revealed in Holy Scripture about the merciful love of God towards every human being.
2. Entreating God's mercy for the whole world, through the practice of new forms of devotion to Divine Mercy, such as veneration of the image of Divine Mercy with the inscription: Jesus, I trust in you, The Feast of Divine Mercy celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter, The Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Prayer at the Hour of Mercy (3:00 p.m.) and Spreading the devotion to Divine Mercy.
3. Initiating the apostolic movement of the Divine Mercy through deeds and actions that fulfill His will and attitude of mercy toward one's neighbor.

This extraordinary documentary film, produced by the Knights of Columbus, describes the development of Divine Mercy from St. Faustina's powerful visions of a merciful God, to her countryman Pope John Paul II, who propelled the message of Divine Mercy onto the world stage. Be Safe and Healthy Here at Saint John

Saint John the Evangelist Clergy, Staff, and Ministers care about your health and safety, especially at times like now, with the spike in Flu cases and the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) around the world. We keep in constant communication with the Diocese of Venice and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to ensure we understand the potential and true risks and preventative measures needed for our Parish Family. As such, we have instituted several proactive procedures for the well-being of our community:

- **Refraining from providing the Precious Blood as part of Communion:** We believe as the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that Jesus is fully present in the form of the host, and so we have been providing only the Eucharist during Communion.
- **Provide a Sign of Peace Through a Form Most Comfortable to You:** That can be as a bow or hand gesture instead of a handshake or hug. Holding hands during the recitation of the Our Father should also be a personal decision on whom you would touch.
- **Clergy and Liturgical Ministers New Hygiene Procedures:** We have instituted new procedures that include hand-washing and sanitizing stations as part of their efforts to ensure the health of all our Parish Family and Friends that attend Mass. You will notice sanitizer locations around the Altar as well as in the Sacristy.
- **Removal of Holy Water Fonts from Doors:** We have removed the Holy Water Fonts from the doors as a precaution from spreading various contaminants.
- **Hand Sanitizer Stations Around Campus:** You will notice hand sanitizer stations located around campus, especially in high traffic locations. Everyone is encouraged to use these, as long as they do not impact your own health (for example, Eczema patients cannot use alcohol-based gels)
