

Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Mother Teresa told how she once came across a Hindu family that hadn't eaten for days. She took a small quantity of rice and gave it to the family. What happened next surprised her. Without a moment's hesitation the mother of the family divided up the rice into two. Then she took one half of it to the family next door. Seeing this, Mother Teresa said to her, "How much will you have left over? Aren't there enough of yourselves?" "But they haven't eaten for days either," the woman replied. Generosity such as that makes us humble.

The miracle of the loaves and fishes could be called a miracle of generosity. First of all there is the marvelous generosity of the boy who, with his gift of five loaves and two fish, made the miracle possible. It was a small thing in itself, but for the little boy it was a big thing because it was all he had. It's easy to give something that we won't really miss. But when the gift is as desperately needed by the giver as by the receiver, that is true giving. That is a sacrifice.

Then there was the marvelous generosity of Jesus. To appreciate this we need to consider the circumstances of the miracle. It's easy to reach out to others when it doesn't cause us much inconvenience. Not so easy when it is sprung on us at an awkward moment. Here a real sacrifice is involved. We have to set aside our plans, and forget about ourselves. So it was with Jesus. He had just learned that his cousin, John, had been murdered. He needed peace and quiet. That is why He and the apostles crossed to the far side of the lake. But when He stepped out of the boat, He found a crowd of people waiting for him. He might have gotten angry and sent them away. Instead, He had compassion on them and gave Himself completely to them.

Then there was the sheer generosity of His response to the hunger of the people. Not only did He feed them, but He saw to it that each got as much as He wanted, and even so, there were twelve full baskets left over.

You can see then why this could be called a miracle of generosity. Generosity is not always about giving things. More often it is about giving of ourselves, of our time, our gifts. Giving things can be easy, but giving of oneself is never easy. Before giving Himself as food and drink in the Eucharist, Jesus gave of Himself to people in so many other ways.

The story of the feeding of the multitude was treasured by the early Christians. The miracle recalled the Old Testament story of manna in the desert. For them, Jesus was the new Moses who feeds his people in the desert. Then they saw in this feeding an anticipation of the Eucharist. It was at the table of the Eucharist that Jesus nourished them.

And it is here that Jesus nourishes us now. Only at God's table can we get the nourishment our hearts are longing for. In the Eucharist, we are nourished with the Word of God and the Bread of Life. And having invited us to partake of the banquet of life on earth, God has invited us to partake of the banquet of eternal life in heaven.



As the people went back to their homes at the end of that day, they knew they had experienced the goodness and love of God – that love Paul talks about, a love from which nothing can separate us.

In the Eucharist, we taste the love of God. The proof that we have experienced that love will be our willingness to love others. We may be able to give only in small ways and in small amounts. However, from the little boy in the Gospel, we see that a small amount can become a big amount when placed in the hands of the Lord.



Faith Formation



Faith Formation 2020-2021 Plans to Open In-Person and Virtually

Plans are underway for our Faith Formation Program to open this fall near the last week in September. As part of our developing plan, we will offer class in person with social distancing and require masks to be worn. We will also have additional guidelines to create the safest environment possible. We are working to develop an online platform for children who are not yet ready to return to Faith Formation in person due to the circumstances surrounding the current pandemic. Thank you in advance for your patience as we put our teams together to minister to your families. Below are a few answers to questions that we hope may be helpful to you. We are looking forward to welcoming you all in the fall!

FAQs about the upcoming Faith Formation Year

1. When will you be offering in-person Faith Formation K-8?

Sessions will be available on Wednesdays from 4:30-5:30 p.m. or 6:00-7:00 p.m. Sunday sessions will be offered from 8:30-9:30 a.m. or 10:00-11:00 a.m. Sessions will likely run from the end of September through the end of May.

2. When do we register for Faith Formation?

The Faith Formation office plans to launch online registration in early August through the end of August. Families will be able to select their class sessions and make payments online. Classes will be limited to 9-12 students, depending on the size of the classroom. There will also be additional diocesan forms to complete online once your child is registered. Families that were enrolled in Faith Formation for the 2019-2020 school year will be receiving an email soon with registration information. Families not enrolled in Faith Formation last year can check out our website at www.sjecc.com, where we will have that information soon.

3. Why are the sessions only an hour this year instead of an hour and a half?

With the need to social distance and have smaller class sizes, we are offering additional sessions on Wednesdays and Sundays. Each session will allow for 30 minutes in between so that we can properly clean. Several of our catechists are willing to teach double sessions, so this schedule will be helpful to them as well. To make up for lost time, we plan to

offer additional sessions in May.

4. Will families seeking virtual Faith Formation need to register as well?

Yes. This will help us to identify the needs of our parish community.

5. What is the cost for Faith Formation?

Our registration fees will be the same as last year. For the first child, the fee is \$65.00. Each additional child is \$35.00. Children who are in the Sacrament Year 2 have an additional \$35.00 fee. This applies to First Communion as well as Confirmation. Private Catholic School children receiving First Holy Communion who meet the requirements have a fee of \$75.00.

6. What about High School Confirmation?

Our High School Confirmation sessions will be offered on Sundays, approximately twice a month from October through May. Sessions are tentatively scheduled for 11:30-12:30 p.m., 3:30-4:30 p.m., and 6:00-7:00 p.m. Spaces will be limited in each session. There will be online registration as well for this group. Youth entering their first and second year of Confirmation preparation will need to register for a session online and complete payment. Our Confirmation Candidates in their third year who were originally scheduled to receive Confirmation in May will not need to register online. Necessary paperwork will be emailed to families, and there will be no additional fee. A date for their Confirmation is still pending.






