

Founder of Knights of Columbus to be Beatified This Year: Fr. Michael McGivney Will Be Remembered on Wednesday, August 12



Venerable Michael J. McGivney laid the groundwork for what is now the largest Catholic fraternal service organization in the world. He has inspired generations of Catholic men to roll up their sleeves and put their faith into action. Today his spirit continues to shape the extraordinary charitable work of Knights as they serve their parishes and those on the margins of society as he served widows and orphans in the 1880s.

Today, there are more than two million members of the Knights of Columbus in some 15,000 councils located in more than a dozen countries around the world. In 2019, these Knights together donated \$187 million to charity and provided 77 million hours of volunteer work. Over the past decade, the Order has donated more than \$1.6 billion to worthy causes.

Born August 12, 1852, in Waterbury, Connecticut, of Irish immigrant parents, he was the eldest of 13 children, six of whom died at an early age. After finishing elementary school, he joined his father in a brass mill for three years to help with the family's financial needs. A local priest was instrumental in enrolling him in a seminary when he was 16. However, his schooling was cut short in 1873 when his father died. This event introduced him to the effect the loss of a breadwinner can have on a family. After resuming his studies, he completed seminary and was ordained in Baltimore on December 22, 1877. His first assignment was to St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut.

While at St. Mary's, Fr. McGivney witnessed the anti-Catholic sentiment the Irish-American immigrant community was experiencing. He worked tirelessly to keep his flock close to the faith by finding practical solutions to their many problems

killed over one million people, he contracted pneumonia and died on August 14, 1890 — two days after his 38th birthday.

Known for his devotion to the faith and embodiment of the characteristics of the "Good Samaritan," the Archdiocese of Hartford opened a cause for his sainthood in 1997. The diocesan investigation was closed in 2000 and the case passed on to Congregation for the Causes of Saints in Vatican City.

In March 2003, St. Pope John Paul II lauded Father McGivney's principles and vision of "seeking new ways of being a leaven of the Gospel in the world and a spiritual force for the renewal of the Church in holiness, unity and truth."

On March 15, 2008, Pope Benedict XLI approved a decree citing McGivney's foresight and zeal in establishing the Knights of Columbus as a remarkable and exemplary accomplishment, thereby declaring him a Venerable Servant of God.

Earlier this year, in an address to the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors, Pope Francis said the organization has been faithful "to the vision of your founder, Venerable Michael McGivney, who was inspired by the principles of Christian charity and fraternity to assist those most in need."

On May 27, 2020, Pope Francis approved a miracle attributed to the intercession of Fr. McGivney which involved the healing of an unborn child's life-threatening condition while in utero. The pope's action means that Father McGivney can be declared "Blessed," the step just prior to sainthood. An additional miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession will be required for his canonization as a saint.

The beatification Mass for Fr. Michael McGivney is scheduled for October 31, 2020, in Connecticut, according to the Congregation for Saints' Causes.

Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

For a period of time, there was a brand of clothing that many young people were wearing. It was called No Fear. The name conveyed an attitude that one could do anything fearlessly. In a world of danger and violence, this could be alarming. But in a world of faith and unity centered on Jesus Christ, it can and must be the motto for living.


One of the most unpleasant human emotions is fear. We fear losses, suffering, helplessness, and worst of all, the unknown. We see all these deepest fears coming together in the lives of the disciples in our Gospel story today. One can't imagine a more fearful situation in the darkness of night than to be in the midst of a storm in a little boat and to see an image of someone walking on the water coming toward you. The fear must have been tremendous.

Nonetheless, Peter gets out of the boat and attempts the impossible. As long as Peter focuses on Jesus, there is no fear. It is only when Peter gets distracted by the wind and waves that fear enters in and he begins to sink. Even then, the loving hand of Jesus is extended to him, and He pulls Peter to safety. This action not only reinforces Peter's relationship to Christ, but also his faith in Christ.

We need to be honest with ourselves about the fears of our lives. Some people share similar fears – losses, suffering, and helplessness. But there are many other types of fear – the effects of age, debilitating diseases, depression, doubts, being able to make a living, keeping our children safe, the future, and one of the biggest fears of all, death. So much of our fear is wrapped up in the unknown.

The fears of life, no matter what they are, can dissipate when we know God. We come to know His presence by knowing who He is, what He does and what He has planned for us. For Christians, this happens in a wonderful way through Jesus. Through Jesus, God reveals himself to us and forms a loving relationship with us. Through Jesus we know God and recognize his presence and power in our life. Those who don't know God try to find Him in great signs like wind, fire, and earthquakes, but He won't be there. Through Jesus, we come to know God like Elijah, recognizing Him in the tiny whispering sounds of life, the beauty of life, and the simple things of life. It is there that God reveals His love to us, knowledge about his Kingdom, and how to live our life and carry our crosses.

If we know God and recognize Him, then, like Peter, we can walk in faith on the troubled waters of life. In the midst of troubles, we can know peace because we do not live in fear. We do not fear suffering, loss, or helplessness. We do not fear the future. We do not even fear death, not because of our own power,



but because when we know God, we know our future, we know our value, and we know what awaits us.

Maybe the phrase No Fear should be the logo for all Christian clothing. It is the perfect motto for Christian living. With our eyes fixed on Christ, we must have No Fear of whatever life throws at us. And if some fear sneaks in, we can trust that Jesus has an outstretched hand to catch us and tell us not to fear, for He is always with us.



BEING HUMAN IS TO DOUBT

Humans doubt. It's what we do. We doubt ourselves and we doubt others.

Before any of us say anything about Peter's doubting the words of Jesus that told him he could get out of his boat and walk on water, we need to get real with ourselves: How would I respond in the same situation? I remember when I was child taking swimming lessons. One day I simply tightened up my muscles and sank. The lifeguard pulled me up and asked what happened. I said I did not know. The truth is that I was sinking under the weight of my own doubt. I did not believe I could do what clearly, I was told I could. That was only in five feet of water in a pool! Now that I'm older, I can look back and laugh. But an adult, the swimming pool is life, and I would be lying if I

said that there are no longer times I find myself sinking due to new doubts.

Much of our doubt comes about because of a lack of trust in God. We place our trust in material things, wealth, or imperfect people instead of the One who is worthy of our trust 100 percent of the time. Our stewardship is often hampered by our doubt that God will provide all that we need. If I give more, I may not have enough to survive! When we place all our trust in God, not only do we find that we have been given all we need - our doubt that cause us to sink in the pool of life fades away. We don't suddenly become perfect in our trust, and there will be times when we find ourselves with concerns again. However, it is in those moments we find that He is still there, speaking the words we need to hear: "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

Register for Classes

Click on the Religious Education tab and then the Online Registration button. From here, the member can verify details in their family record and register for religious education classes.

When registering for classes, you will **+Add** each student one at a time. You have the option to print your registration sheet for your records.

Payment – Click "Pay Now" Button to proceed

After you register for classes, you will be able to pay for the sessions. The option to pay at this website is with a credit card or Apple Pay only. Cash payments would have to be made in person in our Parish Office. Payments by check may

be mailed in or dropped off in person as well.

Please keep in mind when you pay for Faith Formation, you will be "adding each child's registration" to your shopping cart one at a time. After each child is added, you will then hit "continue shopping," and then click on **Faith Formation Registration** to return to the previous page where you will add your next child's registration to the cart, until you have added all of your children. Then you can check out and make payment. Each time you choose a purchase option for your child, you will choose either **standard registration** or **sacramental year**. The shopping cart will total up the registrations for you. *There is a discount for registering additional children within the same family. Sacrament fees apply for the child's second year of First Communion or Confirmation preparation.*

Completing and Signing Diocesan Forms

The Final step in this process is completing the required online Diocesan Forms. Through our online and digital email, you should be able to complete and sign all these forms easily. Once the above two steps are completed, we will send you a confirmation email with your class sessions confirmed as well as instructions to complete the final process.

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




