## **St. John Council 11281 25th Anniversary**

The October 8th, Twenty-Fifth Anniversary Celebration of the St. John Knights of Columbus Council was a beautiful recognition of a quarter century of Charity – Unity – Fraternity – Patriotism, which are the Principles of the Knights of Columbus. The evening began with a beautiful Mass, which processed in led by only Two Knights of Columbus Color Corp. wearing the Uniform of 1994 and the new uniform of 2019. The Mass was concelebrated by our Pastor Rev. Father Tom Zalewski, Rev. Father Thomas Glackin, Rev. Father Kantor (Diocesan Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus and Pastor of St. Agnes), Rev. Father Arun Paul, and in attendance was Monsignor Robert Coll. Deacon Frank Pannicia also celebrated in the Mass along with Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, and Servers, ALL aforementioned being members of the Knights of Columbus. Father Tom gave a beautiful Homily which praised the work of the St. John Council and the Knights of Columbus order.

The Mass was followed by an evening of Memories and Tribute to those who made the twenty-five year legacy of the St. John Council what it has been. Over 225 attended the celebration and enjoyed the Memorabilia on display depicting 25 years of service to the Parish and Community. A commemorative booklet was provided to all in attendance which provided additional memories and examples of the historical events that occurred since the 1994 beginnings of our Council. Included was a page of the original signatures of 64 charter members, four of whom were in attendance. A list of all deceased members was within the booklet and a moment of silent prayer offered to each of them and their loved ones.

## Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Once, two travelers were going through a forest when night came upon them. In a matter of minutes, the narrow path which they had been following became invisible. In the darkness, terror lurked everywhere. Then, to make matters worse, a violent thunderstorm broke over the forest. Terrifying flashes of lightning were followed by loud peals of thunder which shook the ground under their feet. Torrents of rain poured down on them. The trees swayed dangerously.


The first man looked on the storm as a calamity. Every time there was a flash of lightning, he looked up at the sky and cursed. The result was that he strayed from the path and got lost in the forest. The second man, however, looked on the storm as a blessing in disguise. Each flash of lightning lit up a little bit of the path ahead of him, and thus he was able to take a step forward. By keeping his head down, he succeeded in staying on the path. And so, a step at a time, he made his way out of the forest.

Sometimes that's the way it is in life: there is just enough light to be able to take the next step; just enough strength to do the present task.

The thunderstorm was the exact same for both travelers. Yet for one it proved to be a stumbling block, while for the other it proved to be a stepping stone.

The travelers remind us of the two thieves in the Gospel story. Both of them were caught up in a terrible darkness. First of all there was the darkness of their own lives of crime. Then there was the terrible darkness that descended on Calvary at the crucifixion of Jesus.

One of them cursed the darkness. The other saw a gleam of light through it. That light came from the presence of Jesus – Jesus, the friend of sinners – who came to seek out and to save the lost. The thief's clean and humble confession went straight to the heart of Jesus. It won for the thief, not only forgiveness, but heaven itself.



In the end, the only one who knows and understands us fully is God. He is the only biographer in whose accuracy we can absolutely trust because he alone sees what's in the heart. He sees our wounds and sorrows, our scars and handicaps, our hopes and longings. Jesus looked at the thief, and seeing the sad tatters of his life, was moved with compassion for him.

The good thief gives hope to us all. Even at the eleventh hour, there exists the possibility of letting the sunlight in. Through his sheer goodness, Jesus turns our darkness into light.





## Did You Know?

### **Hearing Loop in Church Connects Directly to Hearing Aids in All Seats**



During the renovation of the church, we wanted to make it as accessible to people as possible to enjoy and participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. One key feature that was implemented was a Hearing Loop throughout the entire Sanctuary. A Hearing Loop is a special system that broadcasts the sound from our church directly into hearing aids that have the T-Coil, or Tele-Coil connection on them (a little switch with the letter "T"). All an individual with those aids needs to do is to flip the switch on their hearing aid to "T," and it will sound like the Priest, Lector, and music are right there with them.
