

SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist


Prayer for Safety during this Hurricane Season

We wish Fr. Deutsch the best of luck in his new role as Parochial Vicar at St. William Parish in Naples. We thank him for all he has done for our Parish and community since coming to St. John the Evangelist last October.

Welcome to St. John the Evangelist, Father Jacob Gwynn!

We are pleased to welcome Father Jacob Gwynn, LT, USNR, to St. John the Evangelist. On July 12, Bishop Frank Dewane ordained Fr. Gwynn during a Mass concelebrated by AMS Auxiliary Bishop Gregg Caggianelli at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in Venice. Fr. Gwynn is a priest of the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS), which ministers to people serving in the armed forces as well as their families.



Fr. Gwynn grew up in Palmetto, Florida. He attended Saint John Vianney College Seminary in Miami and Saint Vincent DePaul Regional Seminary in Boynton Beach. Father Gwynn's formation was made possible by a Co-Sponsored Seminarian Agreement between the AMS and the Diocese of Venice. Because of this agreement, Fr. Gwynn will spend the first five years of his priesthood ministering to Florida parishes before becoming a chaplain and commissioned Naval officer. Unlike most seminarians, Fr. Gwynn has spent his summers since 2021 in Navy training. He has also attended Navy Officer Development School and had chaplain basic leadership training.

Father Gwynn joins a relatively small group of Navy priests. Only 47 priests are on active duty in the Navy with around 20 in the Reserve, and they serve more than 100,000 sailors, marines, and coast guardsmen, as well as their families.

Fr. Gwynn shared that he looks forward to beginning his service both to the people of Florida and, eventually, to the men and women of the Navy.







These five locations, located in each of the geographical regions (Deaneries) of the Diocese, were selected for the convenience of the faithful, so that they may take advantage of the grace of the Jubilee Year.

Jubilee 2025 Bull of Indiction: "Spes Non Confundit"

On Thursday, May 9, 2024, the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, Pope Francis officially proclaimed the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025 with the public reading and delivery of Spes Non Confundit, the Bull of Indicition for the Jubilee Holy Year 2025, in Saint Peter's Basilica at the Vatican. This papal document lays out the foundation for the 2025 Jubilee and its theme, "Pilgrims of Hope."

Anchored in hope

24. Hope finds its supreme witness in the Mother of God. In the Blessed Virgin, we see that hope is not naive optimism but a gift of grace amid the realities of life. Like every mother, whenever Mary looked at her Son, she thought of his future. Surely she kept pondering in her heart the words spoken to her in the Temple by the elderly Simeon: "This child is destined for the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed, so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed – and a sword will pierce your own soul too" (Lk 2:34-35). At the foot of the cross, she witnessed the passion and death of Jesus, her innocent son. Overwhelmed with grief, she nonetheless renewed her "fiat", never abandoning her hope and trust in God. In this way, Mary cooperated for our sake in the fulfilment of all that her Son had foretold in announcing that he would have to "undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again" (Mk 8:31). In the travail of that sorrow, offered in love, Mary became our Mother, the Mother of Hope. It is not by chance that popular piety continues to invoke the Blessed Virgin as Stella Maris, a title that bespeaks the sure hope that, amid the tempests of this life, the Mother of God comes to our aid, sustains us and encourages us to persevere in hope and trust.

In this regard, I would note that the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City is preparing to celebrate, in 2031, the fifth centenary of Our Lady's first apparition. Through Juan Diego, the Mother of God brought a revolutionary message of hope that she continues to bring to every pilgrim and all the faithful: "Am I not here, who am your Mother?" [20] That message continues to touch hearts in the many Marian shrines throughout the world, where countless pilgrims commend to the holy Mother of God their cares, their sorrows and their hopes. During the Jubilee Year, may these shrines be sacred places of welcome and privileged spaces for the rebirth of hope. I encourage all pilgrims to Rome to spend time in prayer in the Marian shrines of the City, in order to venerate the Blessed Mother and to implore her protection. I am confident that everyone, especially the suffering and those most in need, will come to know the closeness of Mary, the most affectionate of mothers, who never abandons her children and who, for the holy people of God, is "a sign of certain hope and comfort". [21]

Eucharistic Revival

The four pillars for St. John the Evangelist Year of Parish Revival are: Reinvigorate Worship, Personal Encounter, Robust Faith Formation, and Missionary Sending.

Personal Encounter


Active encouragement and facilitation for increased participation in Eucharistic Adoration by our parishioners.
