SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY



The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Fr. Tom's Gospel Reflection



A man came to Jesus and said, "Sir, will only a few be saved?" The man was a Jew. As such he would have believed that only Jews would be admitted to the Kingdom of Heaven. Gentiles had no hope at all.

Jesus took the man's question and used it to deliver a warning to his contemporaries. He said, "Strive to enter by the narrow door; for many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able." He was telling the Jews that they were in danger of being locked out of the Kingdom because they did not heed his call to repentance.

The main gate to a castle is generally wide, and therefore easy to enter - if you have the right credentials. These credentials have nothing to do with goodness of life. They have everything to do with having the right connections. Those who enter by the main gate are apt to puff themselves up with a feeling of self-importance. They feel they have a right to enter because of who they are.

But in all castles you will find a narrow side gate. In order to enter through this gate you have to make yourself small. You have to humble yourself. And you have to rid yourself of anything that is likely to encumber you.

This illustration helps us to understand what Jesus meant when he said, "Strive to enter the Kingdom by the narrow gate." It also helps us to understand why on another occasion he said, "Unless you become like little children, you will not enter the Kingdom." The little ones have ready access to the Kingdom. Why? Because they find it easy to make themselves small, and are adept at squeezing through narrow spaces.

All of this is important for us. We must not repeat the mistake of Jesus' contemporaries, who thought they had a divine right to enter the Kingdom. We must really want to enter God's Kingdom, and be prepared to work for it. We must be happy to get in at all, even if it means having to squeeze in.

This ought to be our attitude. We mustn't take anything for granted. We mustn't feel that all we have to do is show up, flash the ID card, or simply tell the gatekeeper that we know the Boss, and in we go. The bottom line is goodness of life. As Jesus said, "Traffic in good and not in evil."

How many will enter the kingdom of God? Will it be, as the Jews believed, a chosen few? Is the kingdom a club for members only? Certainly not. Anyone who is prepared to enter by the narrow gate will get in. At the end of the day, we have to remember that salvation is not something we can earn. It is a gift from God. Jesus opened the Kingdom to sinners, and through humility and repentance they proved themselves better candidates than the so-called virtuous. Think of the good thief he brought in at the very last moment of his life.

Truly, salvation is a gift from God. But that doesn't mean we ought not try to make ourselves worthy of the Kingdom. And we must open our hearts to others, and not begrudge God's generosity to them.

MEMORIAL GARDEN

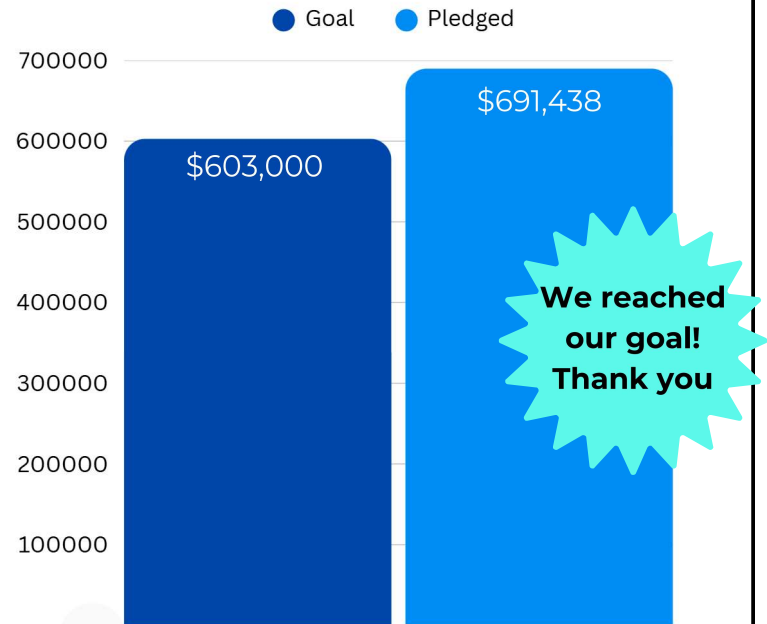

Weekly Divine Mercy Reflection

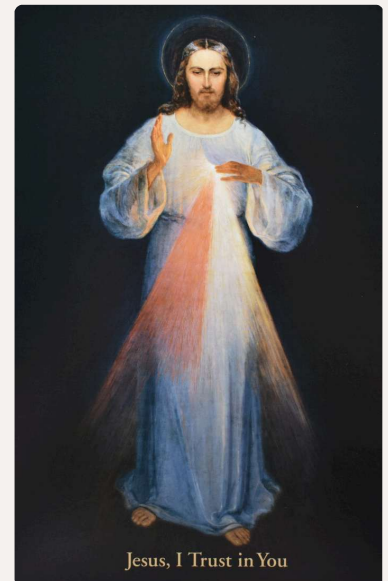

Reflection 30: Obedience to God

One key to holiness is obedience. Adam and Eve fell from grace by disobedience and we are restored to grace by obedience. Obedience can be hard and requires a deep interior decision. Look for opportunities to be obedient to Jesus, especially when you do not feel like doing so. Those are moments of great grace and conversion (See Diary #28).

Work at being humble today. Only through humility will we see the pride that leads to disobedience. Pride leads to an obstinate persistence in our sin and a refusal to be open to God's abundant Mercy. In that humility, help me to see not only my sin, but also the grace and Mercy You bestow so as to enter into the glorious life of grace You call me to live.
