SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY



The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist



Let us create a culture of Life and reverse the lie that there are too many children in our world. As St. Mother Theresa once said, "There is no such thing as too many children – that's like saying there are too many flowers." Let us make abortion unthinkable.

Let us continue to reach out to women experiencing trauma and difficult choices with life affirming alternatives offered through sidewalk advocacy, pro-life pregnancy centers (CPC, IPC, Women's Care Center and Her Choice) and pastoral care through our church.

Let us educate people about the beauty of God's creation, especially our youth. (A bill has been introduced in the Florida legislature to include fetal development in the school curriculum.)

Now more than half of all abortions are medical abortions, with pills ordered online and sent in the mail... no doctor consultation and stage of pregnancy requirement. These abortions are fraught with complications and great trauma to the woman. Nearly 11% of women experience serious adverse events. * research from the Ethics and Public Policy Center.

(There is a procedure to save the pregnancy – research Abortionpillreversal.com)

Let us continue to reach out to women and families who have experienced this trauma through Project Rachel and Silent No More, knowing we have a merciful God.



Reflection 50: Hearing the Voice of God
